the burning of the American flag as a form of poilitical protest.
From Justice William J. Brennan's majority opinion:
After publicly bu After publicly burning an
American flag as a means of political protest, Gregory L pointical protest, Gregory
Johnson
was
desecrating a flag invited desecrating a flag in violation of
Texas law. This case presents the
question whether his conviction question whether his conviction
is consistent with the First
Amendment. We hold that it is
not.
Texas claims that its interest in preventing breaches of the peace
previfies Jine preventing breaches of the peace
justifies Johnson's conviction. However, no disturbance of the
peace actually occurred or
threatened to Johnson's burning of the flag. We have not permitted the government to assume that every ex-
pression of a provocative idea pression of a provocative idea
will incite a riot, but have instead required careful consideration of the actual circumstances surounding such expression.
Johnson was prosecut because he knew that his politically charged expression
would cause serious offense. If he had burned the flag as a means of
disposing of it becuse it was dir disposing of it because it was dir-
ty or torn, he would not have been convicted. The Texas law is thus not aimed at protecting the physical integrity of the flag in
all circumstances, but is designed instead to protect it only ed instead to protect
