American Catholic Rite, along the lines of the ethnic Eastern Rite churches. Those churches accept the authority of the pope, but have considerable autonomy

 Fire ants take toll on wildlife
SAN ANTONIO (AṔP) - Fire
ant populations being sustained ant populations being sustained
by South Texas drought condi-
tions are chewing away at whitetailed fawns and other wildlife,
leaving them maimed, disfigured and even dead.
Since mid-April, the Wildlife Since mid-April, the Wildlife
Rescue and Rehabilitation has treated more than 170 whitetailed fawns and other young
animals, the San Antonio Express-News reported. But the fire ant siege continues,
and so do the agency's daily and so do
treatments.

"The ants are literally ea the little animals alive," Lynn Cuny, director of the wildlife
refuge, told the Express-News "The fire ant problem is the
worst I've ever seen. We're doing the best we can, but many
animalsare being lost. animals are being lost. The fawns have been stung al
over their bodies, but the damage
is most severe on is most severese on their eyes, nose
and mouth," Ms. and mouth," Ms. Cuny said
"Usually, the fawn's entir mouth becomes so rigid, because the skin is completely stripped by
