TYLER, Texas (AP) - A men-
tally retarded man once con-
victed of capital murder must
either be retried or have his
death sentence commuted to life,
a federal judge ruled.
The order, issued Tuesday by
U.S. District Judge William M.
Steger, was sent back to the
original trial court and to the
Texas Court of Criminal Appeals
in Austin.
It gives the state 90 days to
decide whether to retry Johnny
Paul Penry in the killing of a Liv-
ingston woman, said court clerk
Rita Robins. Perry's death
sentence was vacated earlier this
year by the U.S.Supreme Court.
The sth Circuit Court of Ap-
peas, complying with a U.S.
Supreme Court decision, last
week kicked the case to Steger's
court with instructions to
resentence Penry.
But Texas law does not allow
resentencing in capital murder
cases, said Curtis Mason,
Penry's attorney.

DEAR DR GOTT: Is there a proce-
dure I can follow to keep wax from forming in my ears? The wax keeps
my hearing aid from performing properly, and it's quite annoying.
DEAR READER: The cells of the ear canal produce wax that probably
acts to protect the ear from foreign acts to protect the ear from foreign
objects, such as insects Ordinarily,
small pieces of wax migrate to the small pieces of wax migrate to the
