



D., but in the same year Jesus was crucified (Acts 1:1,2; 2:47).

was crucified (Acts 1:1,2; 2:47). Can one be a member of the church of Christ without joining some denomination? What about Peter, Faul or James? Were they members of the true church without being members of a denomination? What denomination were they members of? Which one did they join? Not any, of course! There were no denominations then. If they could be members of the Lord's church then without being members of a denom-mation, why cannot people now be members of the Lord's church without being members of any de-nomination? They can! By obeying the same gospel which the apostles preached.






