NOTICE OF 2016 TAX YEAR PROPOSED PROPERTY TAX RATE FOR

A tax rate of \$.255153 per \$100 valuation has been proposed for adoption by the governing body of City of Texhoma . This rate exceeds the lower of the effective or rollback tax rate, and state law requires that two public hearings be held by the governing body before adopting the proposed tax rate.

The governing body of City of Texhoma proposes to use revenue attributable to the tax rate increase for the purpose of Maintenance and Operation .

The effective tax rate is the total tax rate needed to raise the same amount of property tax revenue for City of Texhoma from the same properties in both the 2015 tax year and the 2016 tax year.

The rollback tax rate is the highest tax rate that City of Texhoma may adopt before voters are entitled to petition for an election to limit the rate that may be approved to the rollback rate.

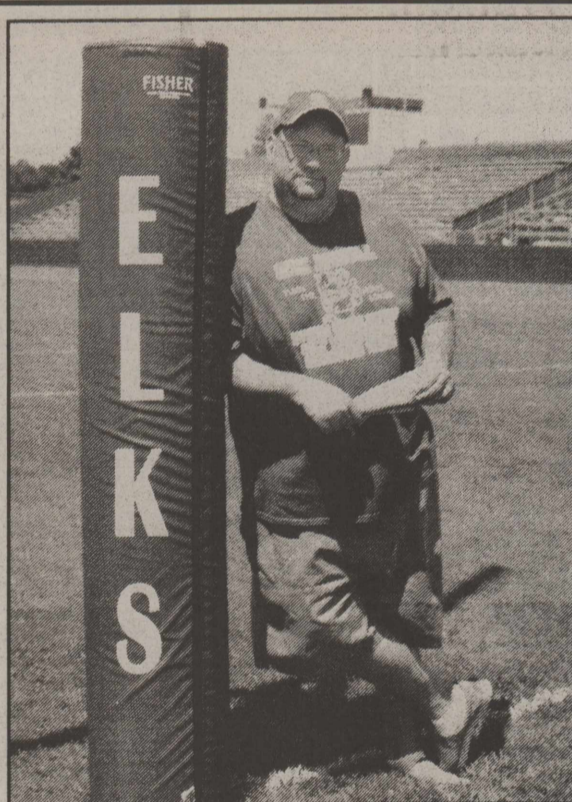
Sherman County, Texas

The Tri-State Fair is just around the corner. If anyone would like to enter we will be delivering items for judging in Culinary, Textiles, Crafts, Ceramics, and Photography September 14th and 15th. This is open to youth and adults. You do not have to be a member of 4-H or any other Extension program. Age divisions include Sub-Juniors (under 8 years old) Juniors (9-13 years old) Seniors (14-19 years old) Adult (over 19 years old) and in some Department a Senior Citizen category. There are Classes for Breads, Cookies, Pies & Pastries, Cakes, Cupcakes, Muffins, Candies, Jams, Jellies, Preserves, Canned goods, Pickles, Sewing, Quilting, Decorated clothing, Embroidery, Handwork, Holiday items, Ceramics, Photography, Art and Crafts of all kinds. There is even a contest for wood pallets or repurposed wood can be made into useful furniture, art, or miscellaneous items. Ribbons and Rosettes are given and premiums are paid on the top entries in each class, the monetary amounts vary by department. Exhibitors entering 3 or more items in a division will receive a Free 1 day Pass to the Fair.

There are several Special Food Contests as well such as the Great American Spam Championship, Arrowhead Mills Dessert Competition, Cupcake Challenge, Wholesome and Tasty Lean Beef Contest, Abuelo's Homemade Salsa Contest, Texas Wheat Fresh Baked Yeast and Quick Bread Contest, and the Texas Nutritious Pork Entrée Contest. These special contests offer cash prizes some as high as \$200. 4-H members are also preparing for the 4-H Food Fight at the Fair which is a Food Challenge team event contest such as you might see on TV. There are still

places open on teams so any youth 3rd grade -12th grade can still join 4-H and join a team. If you are interested in the Food Fight contest contact the Extension office (806-366-2081) as soon as possible. Teams will fill up fast.

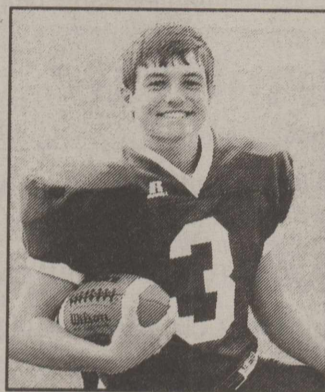
