





4-H Holding Coat Drive



More than 15 million awarded in grants to fire departments

Oct. 6, 2016 - COLLEGE STATION, Texas - Texas fire departments received more than \$15 million in grants Wednesday through the Texas A&M Forest Service Rural Volunteer Fire Department Assistance Program. In the first of three funding meetings for the year, the RVFDAP awarded 442 grants to 421 fire departments for firefighting vehicles, training and safety equipment. Texas A&M Forest Service has administered the grant program under the Texas Legislature since 2002, having awarded 1,655 fire engines, 69,140 pieces of protective clothing and 69,134 training tuitions to Texas fire departments since the program's inception.

"We are excited to provide the grant awards today. Whether it be a wildfire,

flood, tornado or motor vehicle collision, fire departments valiantly make a difference in the protection of life and property," said Texas A&M Forest Service Capacity Building Department Head Jason Keiningham.

In Texas, local fire departments are the first line of defense against wildfires and more than 85 percent of our fire departments are volunteer. State funding helps maintain well-trained, safe and equipped firefighters.

Ingleside Volunteer Fire Department was one of the departments to receive a grant Wednesday.

"The TFS grant program not only provides much needed resources for training and equipment, but it also is key to recruitment of personnel. The better equipped and trained your department is directly impacts the number of people wanting to be a member of your team," said Ingleside Volunteer Fire Department Chief R.J. Thomas.

The RVFDAP is one way that the state helps build the capacity of local fire departments. But the need is great. After awarding \$15,016,037 in grants this week there are still more than \$170 million in outstanding requests.

The next funding meeting is scheduled for March 2017.

Established by the 77th Texas Legislature, RVFDAP, commonly known as House Bill 2604, provides funding to eligible fire departments. This grant program allows Texas A&M Forest Service to build capacity of Texas communities by providing funds to purchase life-saving equipment and training, including firefighter protective clothing, rescue equipment, dry-hydrants and firefighting vehicles. 
Time Out With Rog!

work, make sure it's secured. Don't Reuse Passwords

As tempting as it may be, don't reuse passwords. This will help minimize the effects of

unauthorized access to your accounts. Also, use optional security questions Whenever they're offered for an extra layer of protection.

Make Purchases on Trusted Sites

When deals seem too good to be true, they usually are. You can easily become a victim of identity theft when you make purchases on websites that aren't secure. Stick with trusted, well-known

online retailers or smaller sites that use reputable payment processors. Look for the padlock icon on the bottom of your browser to verify the page is safe.

Beware of Phishing and Spam

Don't open files, click on links or download programs sent by strangers as it could expose your system to a computer virus or spyware that captures your personal information. It's best to also not open emails from friends that contain only a link as these are often viruses. Beware of phishing schemes in which you think you're signing into your bank account, when it's a ploy to get your important information. Always sign in by going to your bank's website.

Use Caution With Public Computers

Make sure to never save private information on a public computer. Always log out completely from

your accounts, and never save login information on these computers.

Check Your Credit Report Annually

Each of the major credit bureaus—Equifax, Experian, and TransUnion—provides consumers with a

free copy of their credit report each year. Your credit report is your window into your identity security, and it's advised to check it once annually to ensure nothing is amiss.

Offline Protection

Lock Up Important Documents

Keep financial documents and records in a safe place at home, and lock your wallet or purse in a

safe place at work. If you carry a purse or computer at a restaurant, keep it close to you. Keep financial information on your laptop only when necessary, and don't use an automatic login feature. The same goes for your phone —make sure it's password protected.

Limit What You Carry

Take only the identification and credit/debit cards you need when you go out. Leave your Social Security card at home unless you absolutely need it, and then immediately return it to a secure location. That is the most prized of all personal information. Carefully protect all user IDs, password information, etc. by never carrying this information in your wallet.

Ask Before Sharing

- Before you share information at your workplace, your child's school or a doctor's office, feel free to ask why it is needed and how it will be safeguarded. Never give out personal information to anyone you don't know, either in person or on the phone, unless you initiated the contact.

Shred and Wipe

Shred receipts, credit offers and applications, insurance forms, physician statements, checks, bank statements, expired charge cards and similar documents once they're no longer needed. Also, destroy labels on prescription bottles before you throw them out. When you dispose of a computer or phone, erase the hard drive and memory first.

Secure Your Mailbox

If your mailbox doesn't have a lock, immediately remove mail when it arrives. If you order new checks or a new credit/debit card, don't have it mailed to your home unless you have a mailbox with a lock. If you're sending mail, drop it at a post office or locked outgoing mailbox. If you won't be in town for several days, request a vacation hold on your mail.
