66th Annual XIT Rural Telephone Membership Meeting Announced

The 66th Annual Membership meeting of XIT Rural Telephone Cooperative Inc. will be conducted on Wednesday, March 8, 2017. The meeting will be held at the Rita Blanca Lake Coliseum. Registration for rural members (customers whose landline telephone numbers begin with a prefix of 343, 362, 377, 384, 727, 753 and 769) and invited guests will begin at 11:00 a.m., and a luncheon catered by The Loose Caboose in Dalhart will begin at noon. The sit-down lunch will again be served by XIT's management and employees.

The recipients of the 2017 XIT Rural Telephone Educational Program will be announced. This is the eighteenth year that XIT has offered the program to graduating high school seniors of our rural members. Four area seniors have been chosen this year to each receive a \$4,000 scholarship.

The business session will begin at 1:00 p.m. The business meeting will conclude with the election of directors and the drawing of door prizes.

Approximately \$4,000 worth of door prizes will be given away to members. There will be six grand prizes awarded: 1 - \$500 cash prize and 3 - \$300 cash prizes and 2 - \$100 cash prizes. There will also be a kids' drawing. This is for members' children or grandchildren who are 0-12 years of age. Members are reminded that they must be present to win prizes.

The purpose of the annual meeting is to elect directors, to present for approval the financial reports for the previous fiscal year, and to transact any other business that needs to be brought up during the meeting.

According to the bylaws, a written notice must be mailed from XIT Rural Telephone not less than ten days, nor more than twenty days, before the meeting. The notice was mailed to all active members of the Cooperative on February 17th.

A quorum must be present in order for the business meeting to convene. Based upon the total number of the Cooperative's members, fifty members or two percent of the members attending, whichever is larger, constitutes a quorum.

Current officers and board members include: J.W. McClellan, President; Walter E. Lasley, Vice President; Gary Finch, Secretary-Treasurer; Marcia French, Nick Olson, Steve Baskin, Gared McBryde, Barry Poling and Larry Kemp.

On February 2, 2017, the Nominating Committee consisting of Allan Frerich, Sharon Taylor, Jeremy Lenz, Eddy Carson, Jack Haile, Brent Spurlock, and Seth Ralston (alternate), met to submit nominations for three director positions. Jeremy Lenz was selected as chairman of the Nominating Committee. Nominations for the following districts were: District I, Dallam County - Marcia French, District II, Hartley County - Larry Kemp, and District III, Sherman County - Walter E. Lasley.

Members can vote only for nominees from the district in which they reside, or the district in which they have telephone service. All members must be present at the annual meeting to vote. No proxy voting is permitted. Either a husband or wife is eligible to vote at the annual meeting, but there is only one vote allowed per membership.

XIT rural members please mark your calendars and plan to attend your 66th annual meeting and take an active part in your Cooperative.


Armando Rivera discussed the financial report with the Board of Directors with no overall concerns.

REMINDER-DEADLINE MARCH 3, 2017

Time is here once again for Sherman county Soil and Water Conservation District's annual Spring Tree Sale. Order forms are ready and can be picked up at our office at 418 North 4th in Stratford, or we can mail it if you give us a call. We can also email the order form if you supply us with an email address. Just call us or email us at shermswd@xit.net.

While we try to list as many species that are available for this area, we cannot list them all. If you have any special wants or wishes as far as trees go this year, please call the office at 396-5517 ext. 3 and we will be happy to try and find what you need.

The District can also fill requests for drip irrigation supplies. We keep some drip supplies in stock, and will help in the design of your system and order exactly what is needed for you if we do not have it. Delivery is usually within three working days. You can also help your investment with the installation of weed barrier. We have this available also. This is especially important in windbreaks because we do not want the newly planted seedlings to have to fight with weeds and grass for water. The barrier will help prevent the growth of weeds and grass and keep the moisture in the ground.

If you need a Tree Order Form, want to place an order for trees, irrigation supplies, weed barrier or just have any questions regarding the trees or need help planning for your particular needs, please do not hesitate to contact the District or the NRCS at 396-5517 ext. 3.

The Golden Mesa Casino Is NOT a done Deal

1) The legitimacy of the Obama Administration rushing the application to take land permanently out of Oklahoma and placing it under Federal ownership and control during the last day of his administration will be challenged. The new administration may recall the approval letter and even if it is not recalled, it will be challenged for not following the required processes and for its constitutionality.

2) The bypassing of the Environmental Impact Statement will be challenged.

3) The required concurrence by Governor Fallin has NOT occurred.

The efforts to oppose the application to remove land permanently in Texas County out of Oklahoma for a casino are factually based on intensive research and factual findings of detrimental economic, social and jurisdictional effects it will create. The approval would also set a negative precedence in Oklahoma and nationally for tribal governments seeking to take land out of an existing state at great distances from the controlling headquarters, in this case over 400 miles away. One major consideration of the economic detriment is once land is taken by the Federal Government into a Federal Trust all businesses established on this land are tax exempt. It should not be construed on any level as an effort to tell Panhandle residents where to go for their entertainment or how to spend their money nor is it a personal affront to any Native Americans. Efforts to keep the land in Oklahoma and provide factual materials for consideration for any interested individuals or businesses have been ongoing and will be continued. For more detailed information the complete report written specifically for Oklahoma and Texas County by national expert Prof. John W. Kindt, a supporting figures report and a bullet sheet overview are available, copies may be picked up at 702 N. Quinn or are available on the Facebook page Panhandle Citizens for Truth in Gaming.
