XIT Hosts 66th Annual Membership Meeting

The 66th Annual Meeting of XIT Rural Telephone Cooperative, Inc. was recently held on Wednesday, March 8th, at the Rita Blanca Coliseum in Dalhart. Members and invited guests were presented with a XIT stainless steel tumbler as they registered for the meeting. Members' children and grandchildren (ages 12 years or younger) were given a light-up bubble shooter when they registered for door prize drawings.

The first member to register for this year's meeting was Burla Austin of Texline. When the 50th member of the Cooperative registered, Doug Taylor of Kerrick, the quorum was officially met to proceed with the business meeting.

There were 110 members registered this year at the meeting. Members and guests enjoyed a delicious meal of roast beef with all the trimmings, served by XIT's management and employees. The meal was catered by The Loose Caboose of Dalhart. The invocation before the meal was given by Russell Routon, XIT Customer Service Manager.

The coliseum was decorated with colorful royal blue and lime green tablecloths on the tables, along with pots of multi-colored tulips. The podium on stage was adorned with a beautiful green and yellow floral arrangement from Sharon's Flowers.

XIT Board President, J.W. McClellan, Jr., welcomed the membership and introduced the guests. Among the invited guests were retired XIT employees Ruby Smith and Elvin Ringo, and XIT's Corporate Attorneys Greg Oelke and Don Richards.

Gared McBryde, XIT Director, Kathy Duggan, XIT Assistant Manager, and Trena Howell, XIT Customer Service Relations Representative, then presented the 2017 XIT Rural Telephone Educational Program recipients and their families to the membership. This year, four recipients were chosen to each receive \$4,000 scholarships: Kate Allen, Katherine Bezner, Marissa Espino and Russell Spurlock.

Kate Allen is a senior at Dalhart High School. She plans to attend Texas A&M University in College Station to obtain a degree in Nutritional Science with a minor in Journalism. She hopes to be a large animal veterinarian. Katherine Bezner of Dalhart High School plans to attend Oklahoma State University in Stillwater, Oklahoma, to obtain a degree in Agricultural Leadership-Extension Education. Her plans are to become a County Extension Agent. Marissa Espino of Texline High School plans to attend Amarillo College in Amarillo to obtain an Associates Degree and complete the Dental Assistant Program. She would like to become a dental assistant. Russell Spurlock of Stratford High School plans to attend Oklahoma State University in Stillwater, Oklahoma, to obtain a Degree in Agribusiness. He would like to work as an agricultural lending agent at a bank. Each recipient was presented with a gold engraved key chain. Since the start of the program back in May 2000, XIT has awarded a total of 95 scholarships.

A special presentation was then made by XIT General Manager, Darrell Dennis, to Cathy Taylor, XIT Billing Manager, and Bill Green, XIT Combination Technician, who are both retiring this year. Cathy Taylor was presented with a beautiful bouquet of fresh cut flowers from Gary Finch, XIT Secretary-Treasurer. Taylor is retiring at the end of June after 24 years of service to the Cooperative. Bill Green is retiring in August after 16 years of service. They will both be missed greatly.

The business meeting was convened with J.W. McClellan, Board President, residing.

Darrell Dennis, XIT General Manager, was then introduced and began by thanking The Loose Caboose for catering the meal and the City of Dalhart for their help in setting up the coliseum for the meeting.

Manager Dennis talked about the completion of the construction in 2016 of the Rural Fiber-to-the-Home Project, which included 742 route miles. One hundred percent (100%) of XIT's rural members have been converted over to fiber optic lines, which provided XIT the ability to increase Internet speeds in the rural areas. He also talked about the upgrade to fiber for services in the Vega market, which was also completed in 2016. This provided higher speed Internet in the market, along with other updated services for phone and TV. Dennis also talked about the possible changes being considered this year by the Texas Legislature in regards to the Texas Universal Fund. He concluded by encouraging any member who might have any questions to give XIT a call or to come by the headquarters' office for a visit.

Charlotte Burkhalter, XIT Controller, then presented the financial reports of the Cooperative, and its wholly-owned subsidiary, XIT Telecommunications & Technology, Ltd.

President, J.W. McClellan, Jr., then called on Jeremy Lenz, Chairman of the Nominating Committee, to present the committee report. After reading the report, Lenz then introduced the directors up for re-election. Those nominated were Marcia French, District I, Dallam County; Larry Kemp, District II, Hartley County; and Walter E. Lasley, District III, Sherman County.

President McClellan then called for any nominations from the floor. When there were no nominations from the floor, the directors were elected by acclamation to serve another three-year term.

J.W. McClellan, Jr., Board President, Barry Poling and Gared McBryde, XIT Directors, along with Trena Howell, XIT Customer Relations Representative, then conducted the drawings for door prizes. Brendan & Heidi Schmidt's daughters, Mishayla and Laura, assisted in the drawing of the prize tickets.

The winner of the \$500 cash grand prize was Craig Lawrence. Winners of the \$300 cash prizes were Bonnie McKie, Leo Martinez and Roy Harris. Cece Yelek and Heidi Schmidt were \$100 cash prize winners.

After the drawings were concluded, the meeting was adjourned.


