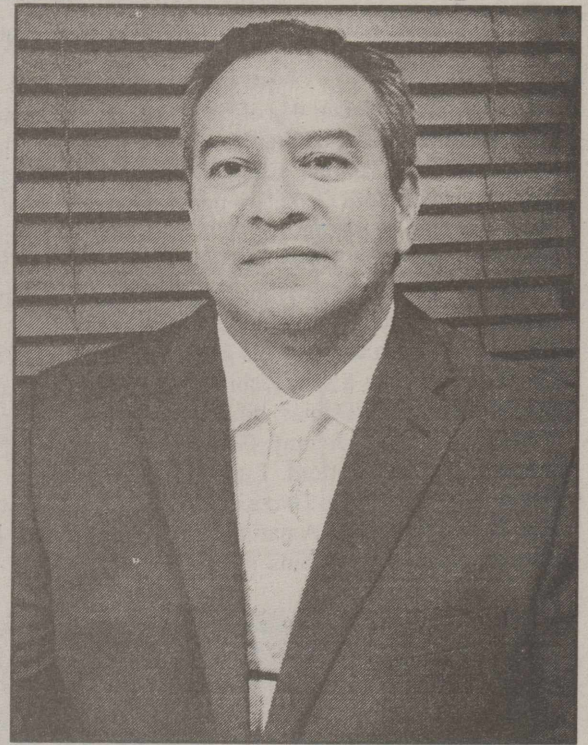


Good Luck at Regionals

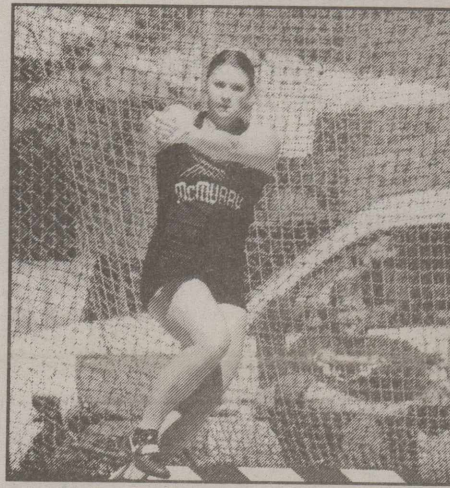
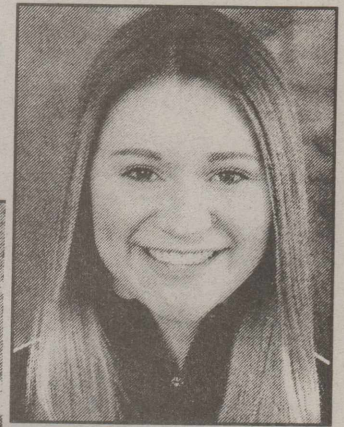
Everett Earns NCCAA Weekly Honor

GREENVILLE, S.C.- McMurry University sophomore Bethany Everett (Stratford, Texas/Stratford H.S.) has been named as the National Christian College Athletic Association (NCCAA) Student-Athlete of the week for women's track and field (field events), it has been announced by the national office.

Everett, who has been having a career season for the War Hawks in 2017, had that on display last Saturday at the Angelo State David Noble Relays. Facing a field entirely comprised of NCAA Division II competitors (other than her), Everett uncorked the longest mark in the NCCAA this season in the hammer throw. Her effort of 50.52 meters was a full 13 feet further than any other NCCAA competitor this year and was her personal career best, earning her a second place in the Noble Relays field.

Everett also chalked up a personal record in the women's discus, as well, hitting 39.50 meters. Everett's discus distance moved her up to No. 5 on the NCCAA's leader board in that event, nationally.

McMurry will next be in action at its own McMurry Open on Thursday (April 13).

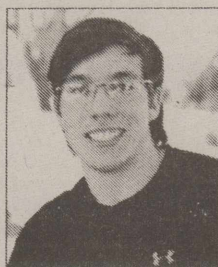
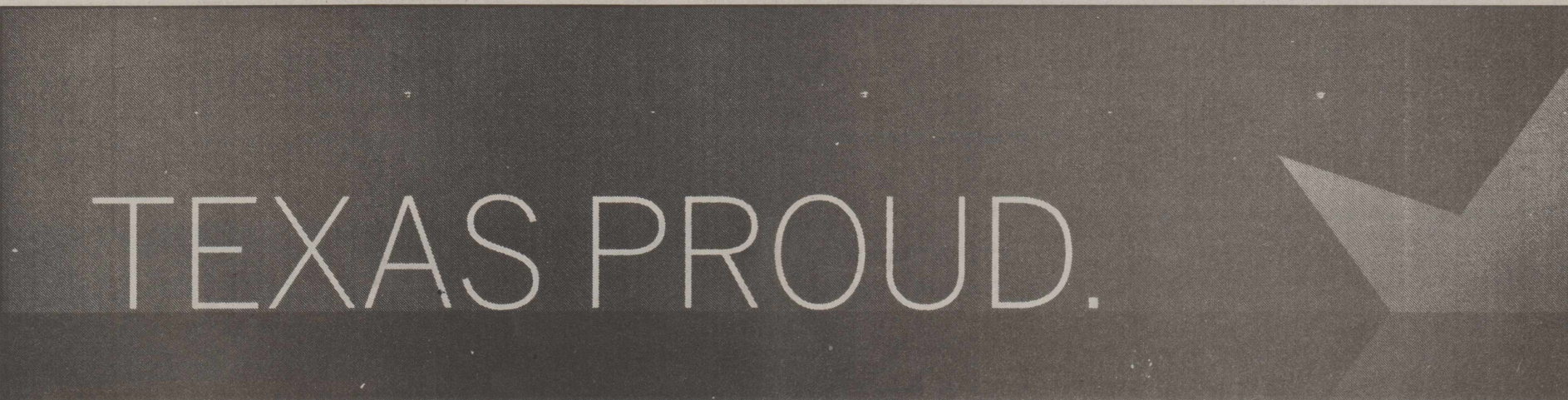


Burr Sets New School Record

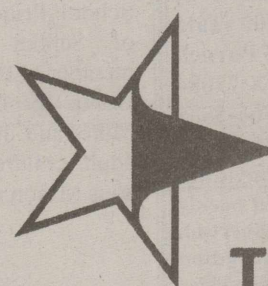

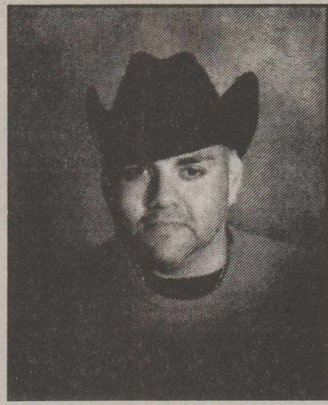

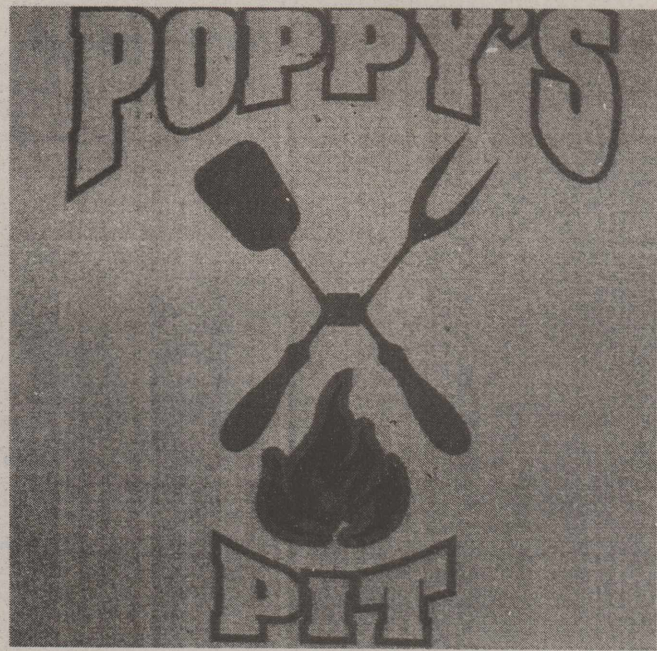


Ricardo "Rick" Garza

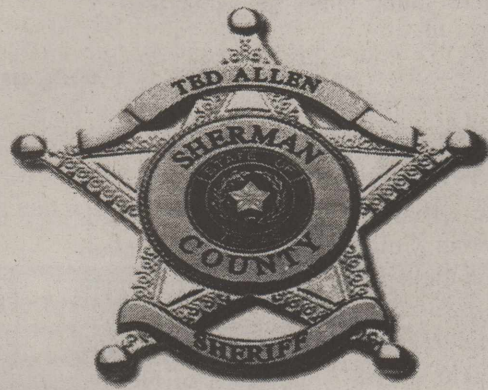

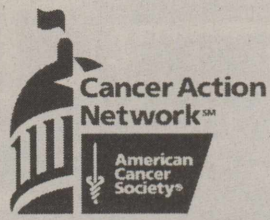

Day at the Capitol

Dear Editor,

Last week, approximately 100 of my fellow American Cancer Society Cancer Action Network volunteers and I had the amazing opportunity to travel to Austin. We were there to talk with our state legislators about a passion that unites us: the fight to end cancer.

We met with lawmakers in regard to passing legislation to raise the age limit to 21 years old to purchase tobacco in our state. Each year in Texas, more than 13,000 kids become new smokers. SB 910, which raises the legal age limit for purchasing these tobacco products to 21, is critical to reduce and eventually eliminate the toll tobacco takes.

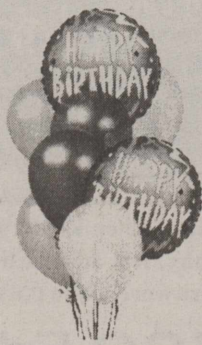
Statistics show nationally that almost 95 percent of adult smokers started before they turned 21. The current age limit to purchase tobacco products is 18 years old. And when using tobacco is the "cool" thing to do among older kids, younger ones are also eager to fit in. What begins as curiosity can quickly turn into a lifetime tobacco addiction, with many harmful side effects.

The unfortunate reality is that many of these young people will eventually lose their lives to tobacco-related cancers and illnesses, but with SB 910, the Texas Legislature has an opportunity to change that. I would like to thank Representative Four Price and Senator Kel Seliger's staff for listening to my concerns.

And I urge you to support this bill, and I hope you will vote for it.

The United States was officially engaged in World War I from April 6, 1917 until the signing of the armistice on Nov. 11, 1918.

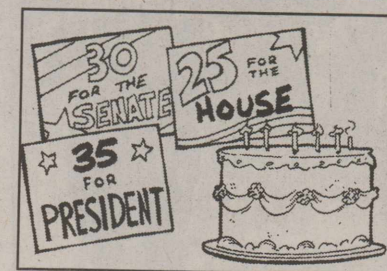

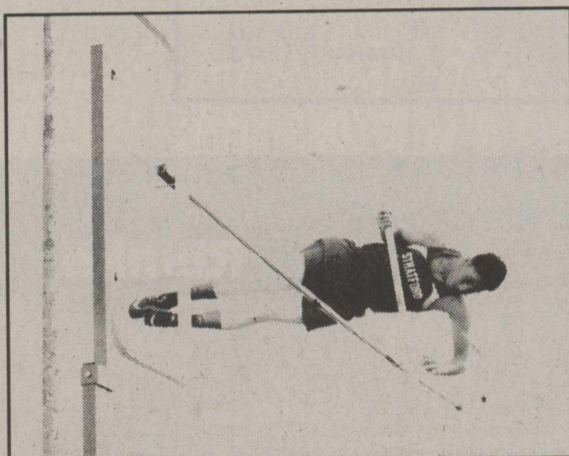

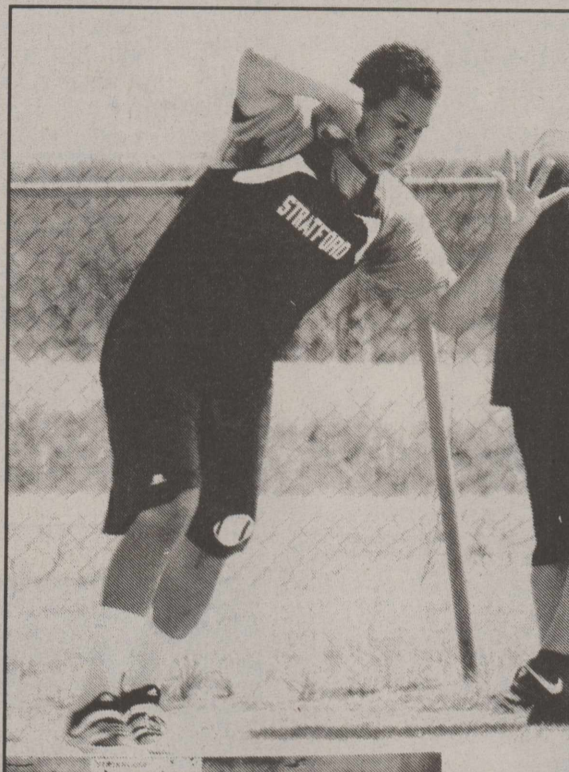

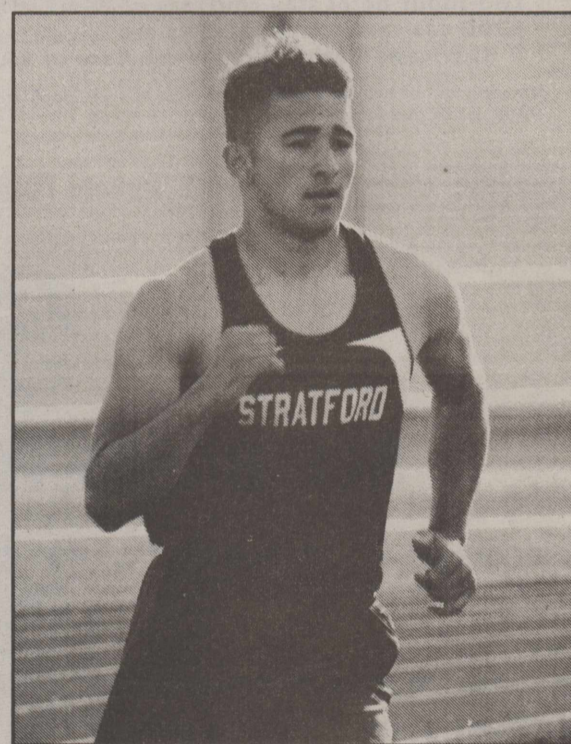

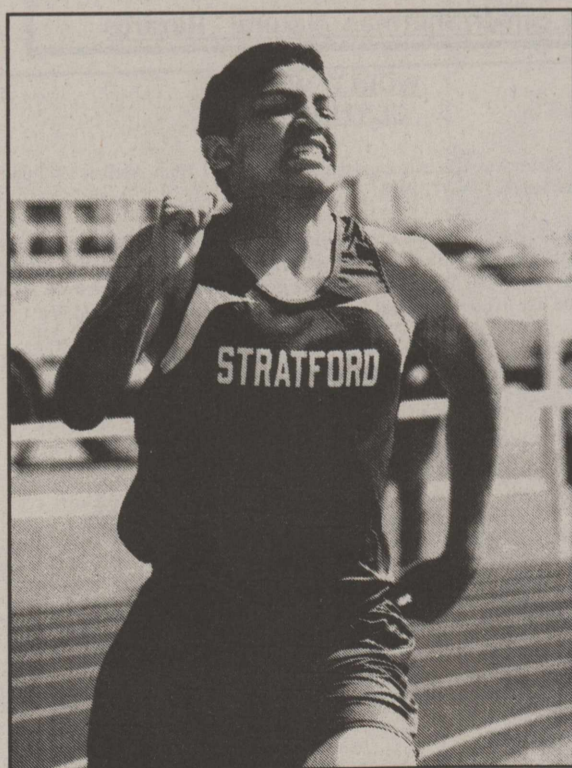
