






Blizzard over the weekend

Elwyn Leon Bass, born January 26, 1934, in Vealmoor. TX, to Fred Leon and Beuna Otto Bass, passed away April 26, 2017, in Sugar Land, TX.

E.L. Sam Bass graduated from Ackerly High School at the age of 16. He married Johnette Carr at 17, and attended college at Baylor University before being drafted into the army immediately following the Korean War. Upon graduating from college, Elwyn served as a teacher and principal at Dawson High School, superintendent at Grady ISD, Follett ISD, and Stratford ISD. He retired in 1990 after 35 in public education. Elwyn married Jo Anna Morton in 1994. He then returned to his teaching roots at Faith Lutheran School in Sugar Land; TX; and taught and coached basketball for 10 years. Elwyn was always active in the churches and the communities in which he lived. He served many years as a deacon of First Baptist Church in Stratford. Most recently; he served on the board for the Parkway United Methodist Church in Sugar Land; TX.

Stratford Memorial Day Remembrance, May 29

Memorial Day Remembrance Monday May 29 at 10:00 a.m. A day of remembrance for veterans and families. Remembering the 100 years of the US Soldiers in WWI "The Great War".

American Legion and Sherman County Historical Committee will honor the 41 veterans from World War I buried in the Stratford Cemetery. As the names are announced, families and family friends are invited to stand in their honor.

Tales From No Man's Land Museum

The No Man's Land Museum in Goodwell especially reflects on the early history of the area in the month of May. With the passage of the Organic Act, No Man's Land became part of Oklahoma Territory on May 2, 1890, - (127 years ago). The area was populated with farmers and ranchers who anticipated Statehood.

Cimarron, Texas, and Beaver Counties were covered with one room school houses to serve the children of those early settlers. Many of the one room schools existed into the 1930s. The Museum has a small, much used, and much loved artifact that was an important part of school life for a young Panhandle girl. An earlier generation would have carried a lard bucket, but Virginia Hart had a beautifully decorated lunch pail to take to the first grade in Anchor Dee School. The blue painted scenes portrayed happy little girls playing amid flowers. Virginia carried the metal pail in circa 1936 - 1937 to Anchor Dee School, 1 ½ miles north of Eva and 5 miles east. In a Guymon Daily Herald article in 1976, the Webb family recounted that the first Anchor Dee School burned but was later rebuilt. When one room schools were consolidated in the late 1930s, the building was moved to Unity School and became a teacher age. It was later torn down and sold.

Years before there was an Anchor Dee School there was the Anchor D Ranch that existed before the 1890 congressional action. It was established in the 1870's by Ezra C. (E. C.) Dudley, a Bostonian, who purchased it from another man from Boston, named Harwood. It has been suggested that his brand used an anchor that reminded him of the ship anchors he saw in Massachusetts, and he used his initial "D". Dudley's ranch was west of the present town of Guymon on the Beaver River. An Oklahoma Historical Society item states, "At its peak it pastured thirty thousand head on an estimated 960,000 acres".

In a Panhandle Herald article by Rev. R. L. Wells, he reported that Dudley maintained his eastern residence but did come to the Ranch for round ups, shipping, and branding. Charlie Hitch worked for him in 1887 when they headed southeast to Canadian, Texas for a grand round up. Dudley had purchased the finest "eats" in Boston for the mess wagon pulled by four big mules. He remembered that they had nine riders who each had eight horses. After a national depression in 1893, Dudley sold the ranch, cattle, and about 95 saddle horses to T. C.

By the turn of the twentieth century, Howard Stonebraker was one of the next owners. On the occasion of their Golden Wedding Anniversary, Julius Kohler of Cimarron County recalled his experiences as a young German immigrant on the Anchor D. He was trained as a

blacksmith and made the first three dozen branding irons for Stonebraker. The branding irons were made with the Anchor and D Connected.

In the 1976, Volume 6 of Panhandle Pioneers, it was related that in 1947, Morris and Mattie Freeman of Texhoma bought the west acreage of the Anchor D Ranch from the Coon Estate. They were established ranchers who had already faced the challenges of the Panhandle. Their descendants still maintain the ranch and have expanded the Anchor D name to their banks in Texhoma, Goodwell, and Guymon.

The No Man's Land Museum invites everyone to visit the museum which is open Monday – Friday, 10:00 AM – 12:00 AM, 1:00 PM – 4:00 PM and Saturday 10:00 – 4:00 PM.

(1977 Code, sec. 10-19)




