# Meeting

The Panhandle Livestock Association-the organization in Northwest Texaswill hold its 77th annual meeting Saturday, February 22, 1992 at the Harvey Hotel.

Nancy McIntyre, President of the organization, said the convention will begin at 9:00 a.m. with registration in the atrium. At 10:30 a.m. the Board of Directors will meet. At noon there will be a luncheon and fashion show, by Images in Pampa. Models will be Association members' wives. The guest speaker will be Mr. Jack Moreman, Director of Clarendon College Ranch and Feedlot Management School.

The Panhandle Livestock Association was formed in 1915 when 18 well known Panhandle Cattlemen got together to form the Buyers and Sellers Livestock Association. The Association began when rail service came to Amarillo.

In 1908, the Santa Fe Railroad made application to the Texas Legislature for permission to abandon its line from Panhandle to Washburn and construct a shorter line from Panhandle to Amarillo.

The Attorney for Santa Fe appeared before the lawmakers in support of the Panhandle to proposition was voted down by a large majority of the legislators.

A prominent cattleman, J.H. Avery, then asked 187 Amarilloans to write legislators to request reconsideration of Santa Fe's application. On the second vote the proposition passed by a large margin.

With the coming of the rail line, it was necessary for the cattlemen to organize. Mr. Avery wrote of the situation at that time:





In a way, laughter is almost musical. The average luration of a single laughter "note" is a little less han a tenth of a second, Dr. Provine reports. The average interval between notes is just over two-

tenths of a second.

The contagion of laughter indicates that its essence is somehow social rather than individual. In the absence of any media to induce laughter, Dr. Provine found, laughter occurs 30 times more often in social settings than solitary settings.

A lot of laughter, he noted, occurs not as the result of some specific joke, but as a natural part of ordi-

### **Earned Income Credit Expanded to Benefit More**

There are new rules affecting 1991 that make the EIC even more \*Five to 10 minutes of warming beneficial for more taxpayers, the Internal Revenue Service says. The new EIC consists of:

> (1) a basic credit—for one child, the credit may be worth up to \$1,192 and for two or more up to \$1,235,

1991—that could be as much as \$357, and

(3) a supplemental credit—for up to \$428 if you paid health insurance that covered at least one qualifying child.

Generally, the earned income credit is a refundable tax credit available to working families who earned less than \$21,250 and have a child who lived with them for more than six months during 1991. The child must be your son or daughter, grandchild, stepchild, foster child or adopted child. A foster child must live with you for the whole year.

To claim the credit, you must file a tax return and attach a Schedule EIC to your Form 1040 or Form
