Annual Stockholders Meeting

Representatives of the Federal Land Bank Association (FLBA) of Dalhart were among more than 500 attendees at the Farm Credit Bank of Texas 1992 Annual Meeting for FLBAs, according to Association President Randy Breitting.

The annual stockholders event, held in Austin, commemorated FLBAs 75th anniversary of making long-term agricultural land and rural housing loans.

Local FLBA directors and staff who attended were Wendell Stacy and W.L. Pendleton of Stratford, Eddie Stallwitz of Dumas, Roy Browder of Sunray, Ronnie Brorman, Mark McKay and Randy Breitting of Dalhart.

Highlights of the year included interest rate reductions to variable rate stockholders, bringing the

rate from 9.75 percent at the beginning of the year to 8.95 percent currently development of a lending division geared specifically to the needs of agribusiness; and introduction of an adjustable rate loan program, with rates tied to a Treasury index.

In addition, the district bank returned \$14 million in patronage refunds to District FLBAs last year to help them build financial strength.

The FLBA of Dalhart has \$32.14 million in long term agricultural loans to farmers in four counties. Offices are located in Dalhart.

The Tenth Farm Credit District has approximately \$3.6 billion in loans outstanding to nearly 60,000 borrowers.

A good education is important to all of the children in the Stratford Independent School District. I would strive to serve the best interests of the children in the SISD and I would appreciate your vote.

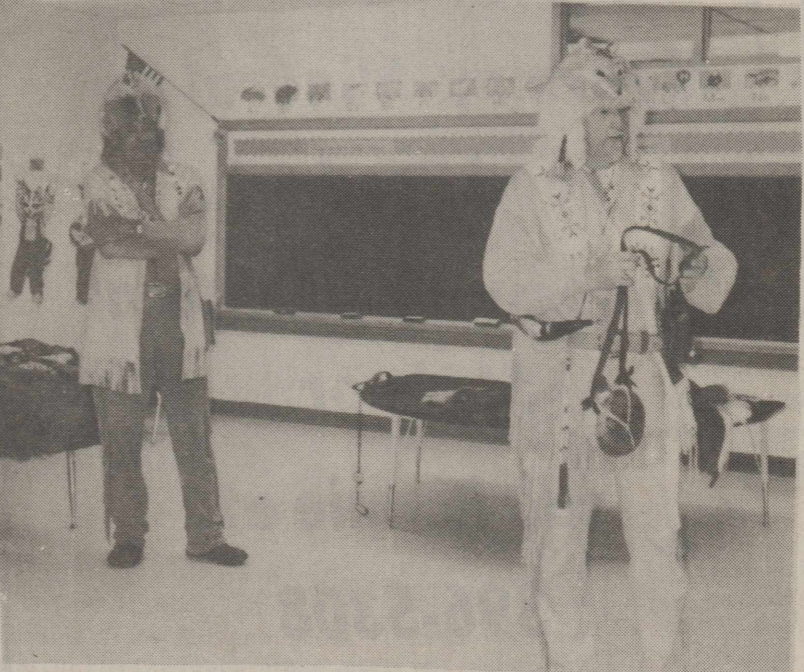

Now is the time to think through: where you are going to go to take cover and what you need to take with you. If you have any questions about your personal plan for safety, call or come by the office and ask for help.

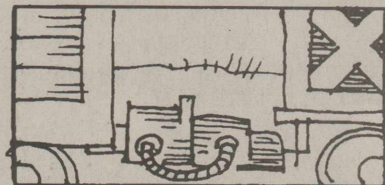

Cindy Russell from Stratford will have a booth for her stained glass art at the Craft Bazaar.

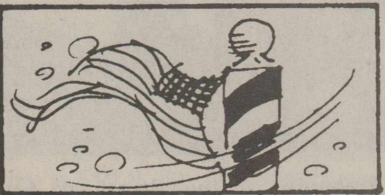
