## Medical skills tested

Each year, U.S. Air Force medical personnel are required to attend medical readiness training in field conditions.

Continuing medical readiness training (CMRT) consists of training in basic individual and field medical skills, which are vital to each member of the medical service in preparation for wartime contingencies.

Friday, 90 personnel from the hospital departed the base at 5:30 a.m. for a location near Post, Texas. While in Post, the group underwent 65 hours of field training designed to enhance the skills and confidence of hospital personnel in dealing with disaster and wartime contingencies.

The training consisted of camp

preparation and set up, principles of perimeter defense, map and compass training and field communications. The schedule also included extensive training on medical topics such as principles of triage and initial evaluation, bandaging, splinting, burn management and combat psychiatry.

During the exercise, personnel were required to sleep in 12 man tents and eat meals ready to eat (MREs).

The final portion of training was a mass casualty exercise, which allowed everyone participating in CMRT to apply their field training skills. The exercise consisted of evaluation and treatment of 25 simulated casualties.

The members of the 829th Army reserve hospital and members from the Post Boy Scouts of America acted as simulated casualties.

Thursday, Reese will go smokeless.

The Great American Smokeout (GASO) is a nationwide effort by the American Cancer Society to get America's smokers to go cold turkey for a day, maybe for a lifetime. The GASO is not forgetting the military this year. About a third of us smoke. The Surgeon General of the Air Force thinks that is too many.

This year, Reese is competing with the other three Undergraduate Pilot Training bases for best participation in the GASO. ATC will be the judge. Here are some of the special activities to promote the Reese Smokeout.

- The Base Exchange and Commissary will offer non-smokers the opportunity to "adopt" or help a designated smoker to get through Smokeless Thursday. We know that smokers experiencing nicotine withdrawal do better if they have someone to encourage them.

- Lucky Strike! The Bowling Center will offer a free cold turkey sandwich and three free games to all smokers who turn in their cigarettes there.

- Pall Mall! The Recreation Center is offering 15 free movie tickets to UA Cinema at the Mall or Fox Theater (your choice). They will be raffled off to smokers who stop by on Thursday and surrender their cigarettes. Free gum will be given out to help relieve your oral craving.

- Bel-Aire! The Gym is having a Fresh Air Fun Run (1½ mile or 5k) today at

11:45 a.m. For more information, see page 14.

- Just a Pinch Between Your Cheek and Gums. We will also send teaching teams to the Child Care Center, Reese Elementary School, and Frenship Schools to talk about smoking and dipping. "Smokeless tobacco" dipping is more popular (and more cancer-causing) than cigarettes with teenage and preteen boys. Early education is our best weapon against smoking.

- How about a challenge among our senior staff who are smokers? If the majors, and above, will quit, how about the chiefs?

Quitters Can Be Winners. If you have considered quitting but have not succeeded, try again. A Stop Smoking Clinic is available to help you. Call 3536 to be placed on the list. No pills. No hassles. No gimmicks. Participation in the GASO and the Clinic is open to all military, civilian employees, dependents, retirees, and ROTC cadets.

- More! If you quit on Thursday, complete the Smokeout form below, cut it out, and mail it to the Hospital (SGZ). We'll take your word for it. This serves two purposes:

The form will be used to count the number of 'quitters.' Secondly, it's your


chance to win a turkey. The American Cancer Society is providing Reese with five Thanksgiving turkeys. A drawing will be held on the afternoon of Tuesday, Nov. 23.

Five people will get a free holiday turkey courtesy of ACS. All you have to do is quit for a day!

- Skoal Bandit! The Security Police will be "adopting" our Honorary Reese Smoker of the Year, Captain Danny Thomas. The Captain will show the way by giving up the habit on Smokeless Thursday. The suspect's cigarettes will be placed in protective custody for the day.

### Feeding facilities reminder

The Officers and Enlisted Open Messes are designated as essential feeding facilities. To be established as essential feeding facilities, the clubs must meet certain criteria, that must be adhered to. The primary restriction when both messes are serving a meal is that only personnel in grades corresponding to the appropriate rank or grade of the club are authorized for use of the club. For example, civilian grades GS-7, UA-7, WG-12, WS-8 and WL-6 and above are authorized to use the Officers Open Mess.

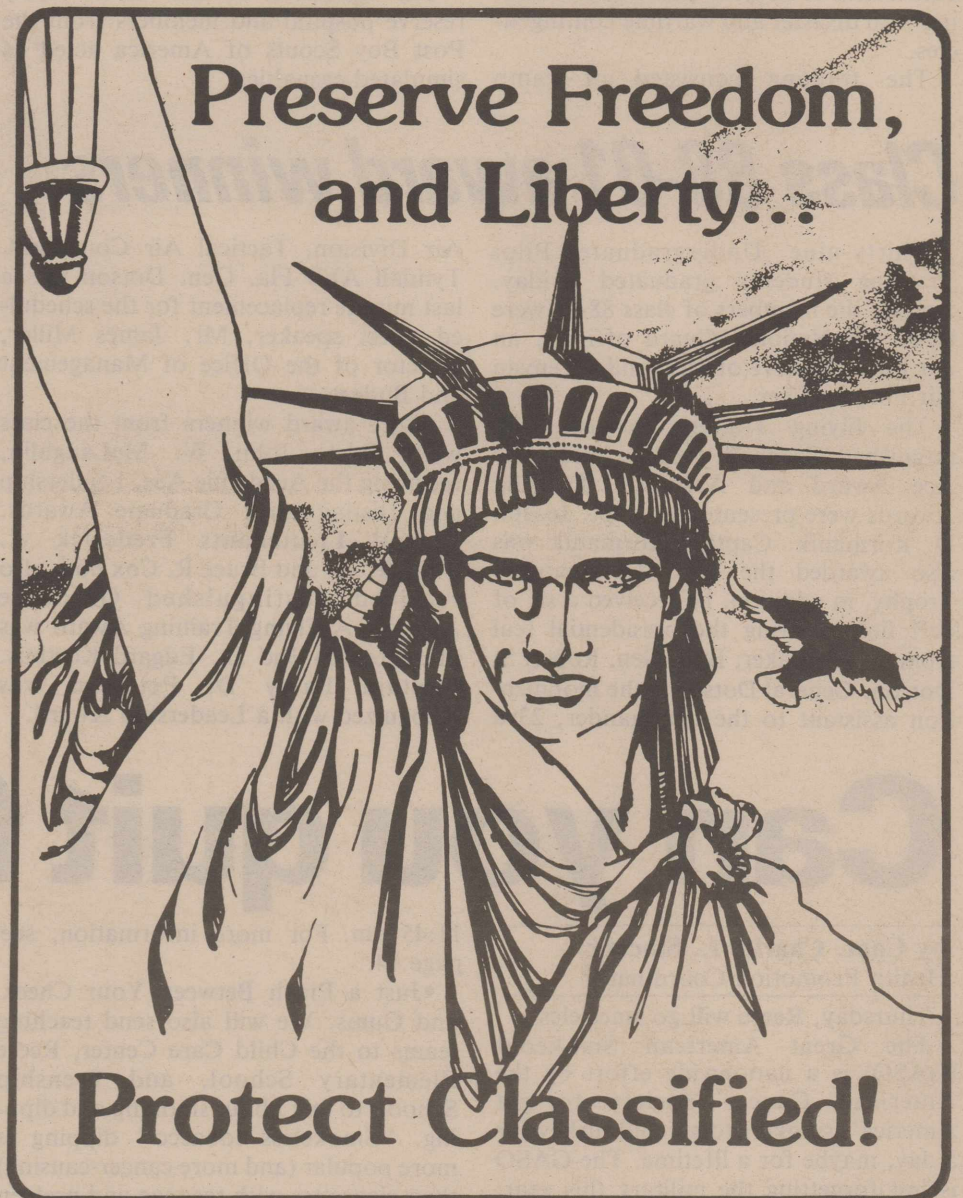

**Readiness Question of the Week:** You have just witnessed a robbery (simulated in this picture). What actions should you take?

**Answer:** Safety is paramount in this situation. Observe the suspect and try to remember as many physical features as possible (clothing, height, weight, color of eyes and hair, distinguishing characteristics, and any other helpful information). Do not attempt to detain the suspect. Keep a safe distance while observing the means of departure (submit to memory the means of escape, make, model and color of vehicle (if used) and the direction of travel). And finally, remain at the scene until the Security Police arrive. The Security Police will question you concerning what you have observed, and then you will be free to leave.

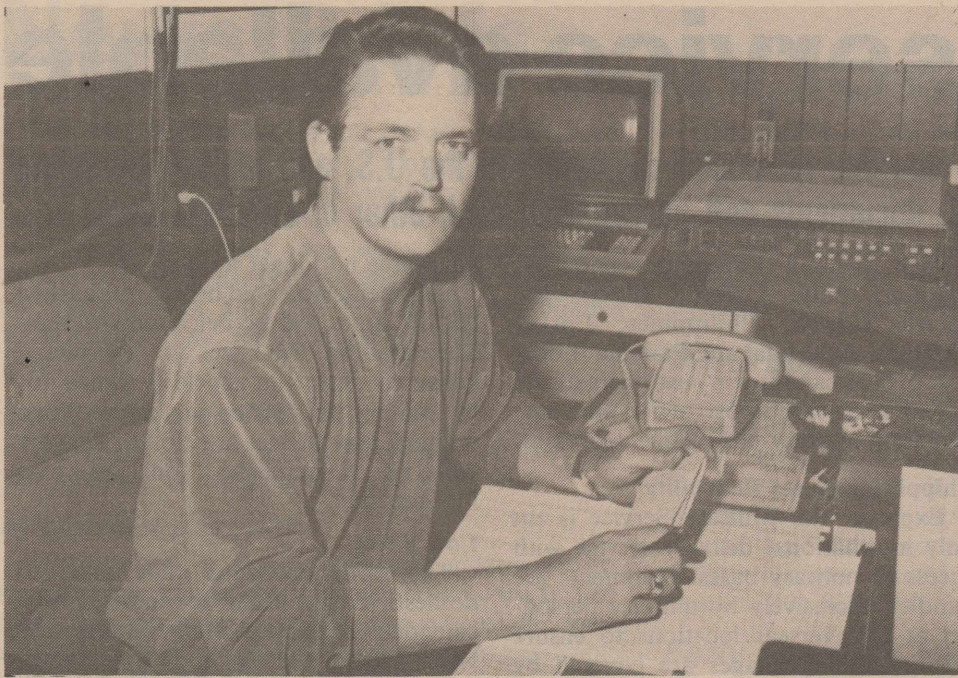

The winners at Reese are, Lt. Col. Clif Hardison, Field Grade Manager;

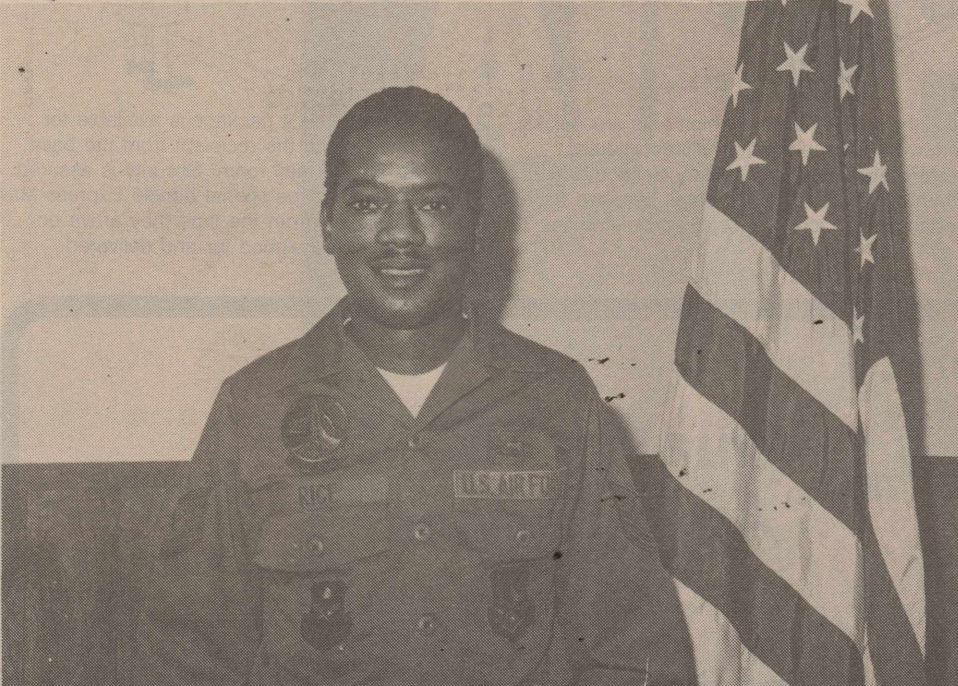

# New mail service available

Express Mail Military Service makes it possible for postal customers in the U.S. and military personnel stationed overseas to send letters, documents and packages to each other in only two days.

WASHINGTON—Military personnel, their friends, families and business correspondents can now mail urgent packages and letters to overseas military bases and back to the United States in two days with Express Mail Military Service.

Letters, cards, holiday gifts, cookies and Grandma's chocolate cake are just a few of the items that can be sent by Express Mail Military Service. The joint venture was initiated by the U.S. Postal Service and the Department of Defense to facilitate faster international communications between branches of the military and their constituents.

Since 1970, Express Mail Service has been speeding packages and letters across the United States and abroad. Now with Express Mail Military Service, military bases overseas become part of the vast Express Mail network at the same domestic rates that are less than half of what other international expedited services charge.

The service is available at selected acceptance sites across the country and more than 200 military post offices in

Europe (United Kingdom, Germany, Belgium, Italy, Greece, Spain), the Pacific (Japan, Philippines, Korea, Okinawa, Australia) and Panama. Local post offices can inform customers of the closest acceptance post office and participating military post office addresses.

### Shipping Ensures Reliability

Express Mail Military Service is the only international delivery service with access to military bases. Shipments are handled exclusively by military personnel at all overseas locations to ensure security. All packages are covered by merchandise insurance up to \$500 and document reconstruction insurance up to \$50,000 at no extra charge. On-time delivery will be made or the sender receives a full refund.

Packages sent by Express Mail Military Service are subject to standard customs requirements. Necessary customs forms and pamphlets detailing what may be sent to each military address are provided at acceptance post offices. If shipments are delayed by customs inspection, the on-time

guarantee no longer applies.

Shipments accepted before established cut off times will be delivered two days after mailing. Packages are considered delivered when the article is signed for by military post office personnel. When military post offices are closed, delivery will be accomplished on the next business day.

### Low Rates

The same low rates that apply to domestic Express Mail Service have been extended to Express Mail Military Service: \$10.75 for up to two pounds; \$12.85 for up to five pounds; rates for five to 70 pounds are based on weight and distance.

### Convenient Packaging

Shipping containers in various sizes are provided at local post offices. The Express Mail envelope is convenient for letters, cards and other personal documents. The flexible 2-Pound Pak is ideal for smaller packages or unusually shaped parcels, while mid- to large-size packages can be accommodated by the 5-Pound Pak.

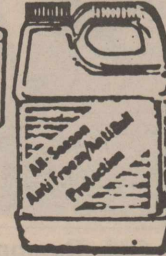

An Air Base Group airman was reduced in rank and ordered to forfeit \$75 for using marijuana and failure to go.

An Air Base Group airman was ordered to forfeit \$100 for assault and indecent assault.

An Air Base Group airman received a suspended reduction, a \$50 forfeiture, and restriction to base for 14 days, for failure to go and failure to pay debts.

An Air Base Group airman was reduced in grade and given extra duties for dereliction of duty and negligently discharging a weapon.

An Air Base Group airman was reduced in grade for disobeying an order and being disrespectful to an NCO.

An Air Base Group airman received a suspended reduction and extra duties for dereliction of duties.

Two airmen from Air Base Group were given correctional custody and forfeitures for larceny.

An Air Base Group Noncommission-

ed Officer received a suspended reduction for writing bad checks.

An airman in Maintenance was ordered to forfeit \$100 for destruction of government property, assault and communicating a threat.

An airman in MA received a suspended reduction and a \$200 forfeiture for drinking under the legal age and driving under the influence.

An airman in MA was reduced in grade and ordered to forfeit \$329 per month for two months for using marijuana and making a false official statement.

An NCO in MA received a suspended reduction, \$75 forfeiture and extra duties for drunk and disorderly, assault and resisting arrest.

An airman in Resources was reduced in rank for damaging government property and drinking under the legal age.

An RM airman was reduced in rank for drinking under the legal age.

Offenses involving alcohol constituted a sizeable percentage of the actions taken. It has been proven that alcohol affects judgement. People do things under the influence of alcohol that they wouldn't even consider doing when they're sober. If you drink remember the rules:

- You must be at least 21 years old.
- Know what your limit is—stop before you get there.
- Don't drive. The legal limit is set at a very low figure. You may be "legally drunk" but not feel drunk.

# High value suggestion recognized

Randolph AFB, Texas—Maj. Michael Chalifoux's idea to save the Air Force more than a million dollars has fattened his pay check by \$8,221 and earned him recognition in the high-value suggestion program.

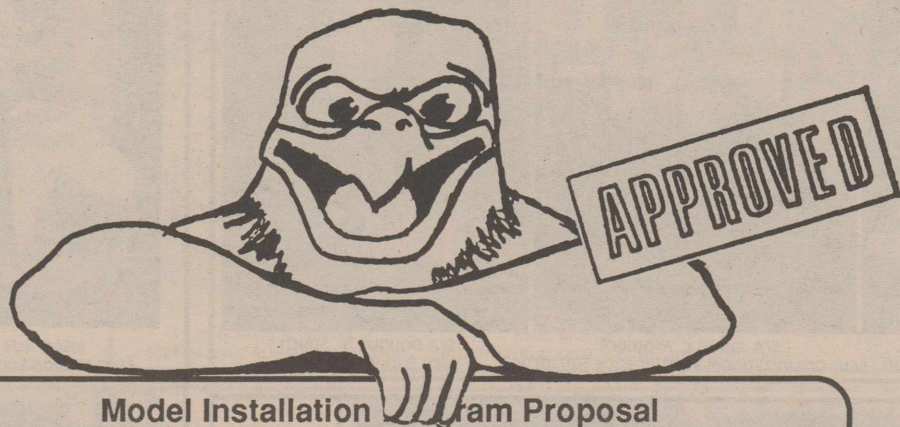
Major Chalifoux, a former B-52 radar navigator currently assigned to Edwards AFB as short-range attack missile II

program manager, suggested the Air Force use microcomputers to help plan bomber missions. The small, lightweight machines allowed the creation of B-52 mission data cartridges at forward operating locations.

His suggestion saved the Air Force \$1,004,195 and increased the usability of the B-52 weapon system.

The Major's \$8,221 suggestion award also qualified him for an Air Force high-value suggestion award, which consists of a certificate and congratulatory letter signed by the Air Force Chief of staff, and a plaque.

The high-value suggestion program is managed by the Air Force Management Engineering Agency at Randolph AFB.

- Open your curtains when it's sunny and close them when it is dark or cloudy.

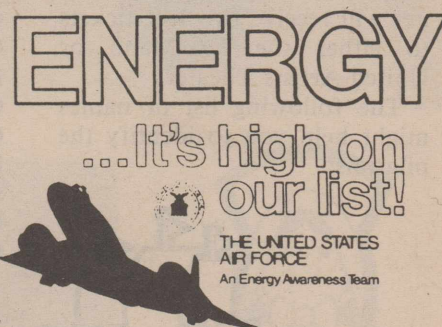
- Cover windows with plastic, at home and work.

# DANTES

## A good direction

"I didn't see any point in going to college while on active duty." That was Master Chief Petty Officer Don Carunchio's philosophy early in his naval career. He planned to use the GI Bill to further his education after leaving active duty.

He revised that philosophy, however, when he just missed being selected for promotion to senior chief petty officer: A review of his service record revealed that he was very strong in all criteria used for promotion except one—off-duty educational credits.

About that time, he heard about the educational opportunities available through the Defense Activity for Non-Traditional Education Support—or DANTES. He started by taking the College Level Examination Program general tests and built up 24 semester hours of college credit for his personnel record.

Now the special enlisted adviser at DANTES headquarters and holder of a bachelor's degree in history, Carunchio earned all the credits for his degree without setting foot in a college classroom. While his feat isn't typical, it's an excellent example of what can be achieved through the program.

The non-traditional feature of DANTES is a valuable benefit for service members. While some are able to continue their education through traditional classroom programs offered locally, others can't. Many service members are stationed at isolated sites, perform shift work, are transferred before completing a degree program or require courses that are not offered at their installations.

For them, DANTES offers educational opportunities through a variety of tests and self-study programs. In fact, more than 250,000 service members took advantage of

DANTES programs last year alone.

Service members can earn high school equivalency credentials by passing the General Educational Development test or the California High School Proficiency Examination. DANTES sponsors the GED test at all overseas sites and in most states. Military personnel stationed in California or California residents stationed outside the state are eligible to take that state's exam on a self-pay basis.

One useful program sponsored by DANTES is the Military Evaluations Program. The American Council on Education evaluates military occupations and service schools and recommends college credits be given accordingly.

Through this program, colleges and universities awarded more than 400,000 semester hours last year to service members for their military experiences.

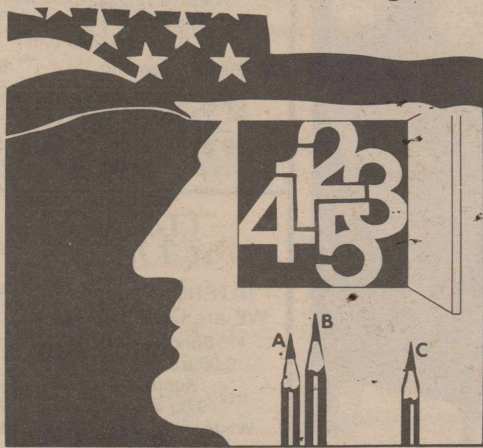
Another means of receiving college credit for knowledge already gained on the job or through independent study is the College Level Examination Program. It is one of the more popular DANTES test programs and is widely accepted by colleges and universities. DANTES also gives subject standardized tests in vocational-technical and traditional academic subjects.

For someone getting ready to enter college or an officer accession program, DANTES sponsors some examinations required for admission, at both the undergraduate and graduate levels.

Many service members may already have the knowledge required to gain certification in professional associations such as the American Medical Technologists or Electronics Technicians Association, International. DANTES has agreements with 25 nationally recognized certification organizations to administer their exams.

Another major DANTES program is the Independent Study Support System. Through this program, service members may complete correspondence courses from accredited colleges and universities. More than 6,000 courses are available.

"We're here to support the service member," said Barry Cobb, DANTES director. "In today's military and general social environment, the individual is required to have higher levels of skills and knowledge. Service members have tremendous educational opportunities available through their service's off-duty voluntary education program."

# Facts may be inspirational

Here are some of the latest tobacco and health-related findings, from the Office of the Assistant Secretary of Defense (Health Affairs) and the American Cancer Society:

More than 320,000 Americans will die prematurely this year of diseases linked to smoking.

The Office of the U.S. Surgeon General estimates that 60,000 Americans will die this year from chronic obstructive respiratory conditions such as emphysema and chronic bronchitis. Between 80 and 90 percent of these deaths are attributable to smoking and, therefore, can be considered preventable and premature.

According to a 1985 survey by the National Center for Health Statistics, 43 percent of black men and 33 percent of black women smoke versus 35 percent and 30

percent of white men and women, respectively. However, black smokers tend to smoke less than white smokers. Only 11.6 percent of black males consume 25 or more cigarettes a day; the same consumption for white males is 36.3 percent. For black female smokers, 5.3 percent smoke 25 or more cigarettes a day, whereas for white women it's 21.7 percent.

Smoking is less prevalent among officers in all branches of the service. Among officers, according to a 1985 survey, smoking rates ranged from about 14 percent in the Air Force to about 23 percent in the Army.

The same survey found the highest rates of smoking in all branches of the armed forces in pay grades E-7 through E-9. At these levels, 49 percent of Marine Corps personnel, 50 percent of Air Force personnel, 54 percent of Navy personnel and 63 percent of Army personnel smoked in 1985.

DoD permits designated smoking areas in eating facilities, common work areas and waiting rooms of medical treatment facilities only where space and ventilation are adequate to provide a healthful environment for non-smokers.

Smoking increases the risk of stroke, according to Framingham Heart Study researchers, who published their findings this year in the *Journal of the American Medical Association*.

Smoking is on the decline. Americans smoked 584 billion cigarettes in 1985, down from 594 billion in 1984, according to the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

Formal military child-care programs in all services will be using a smoking prevention package for preschoolers. Called "Starting Free—Good Air For Me," the package includes hand puppets and fun activities in an upbeat prevention program for children aged 3 to

5. This is connected with the services' goals to be smoke-free by the year 2000 and to have a smoke-free Class of 2000 (children born in 1982).

Smokeless tobacco (snuff and chewing tobacco) is linked to oral cancer. According to the *Journal of the American Medical Association*, the use of smokeless tobacco products increased steadily from 295 million cans in 1978 to 481 million cans in 1985. In 1986, a National Institutes of Health paper noted a disturbing trend—many smokeless tobacco users were young. Some local studies have reported use by as many as 40 percent of high school boys, and one state found significant use by kindergarten-age children. Following a 1986 federal law requiring smokeless tobacco products to carry warning labels about the health hazards of their use, the largest manufacturers' snuff sales have declined by 3.7 percent.

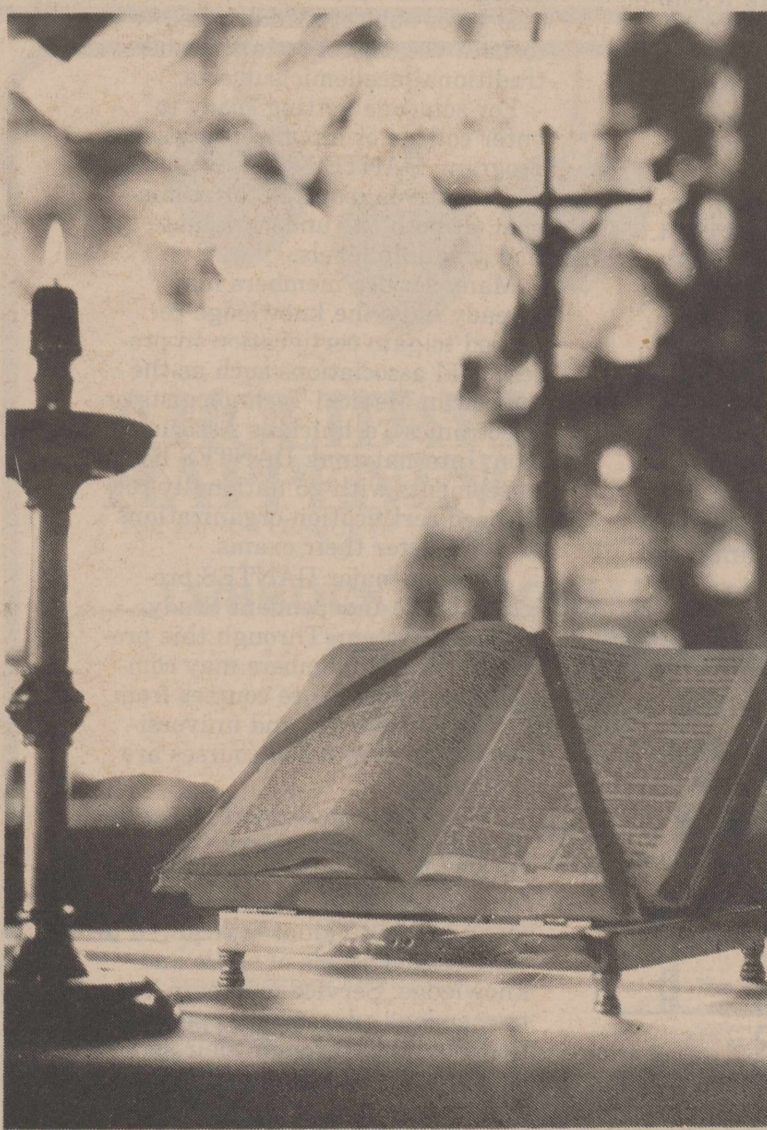

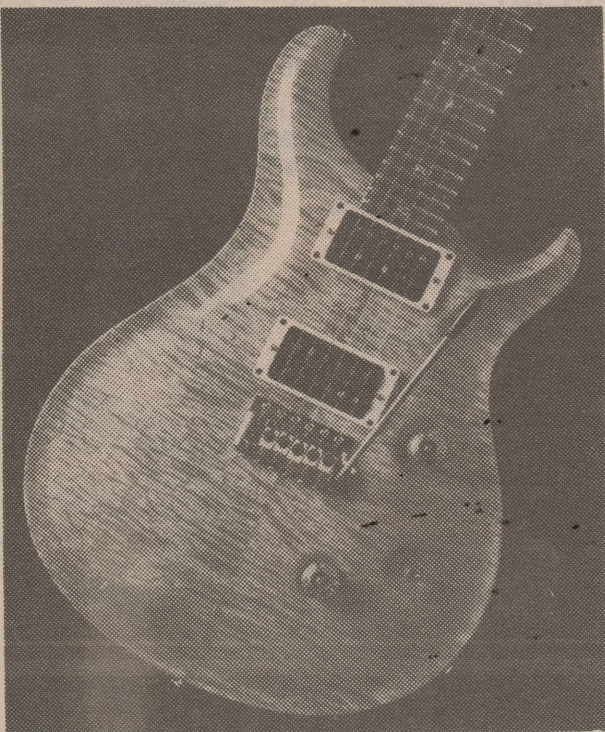
