since the City of Stratford has been and is continuing to improve its water supply,

pursuing the purchase of a new water tower through State and Federal Grants. The reason being that the Stratford needs to be replaced. It has been serving our city since 1908 and has had some repairs over the years old, there comes a time when replacement is inevitable. Our overhead storage tank
holds 100,000 gallons but
