New Flowmeter Secured

The Sherman County Soil and Water Conservation District has purchased a new flowmeter. The Stratford Area Foundation and the Texas Water Development Board gave grants to the District so the meter could be purchased.

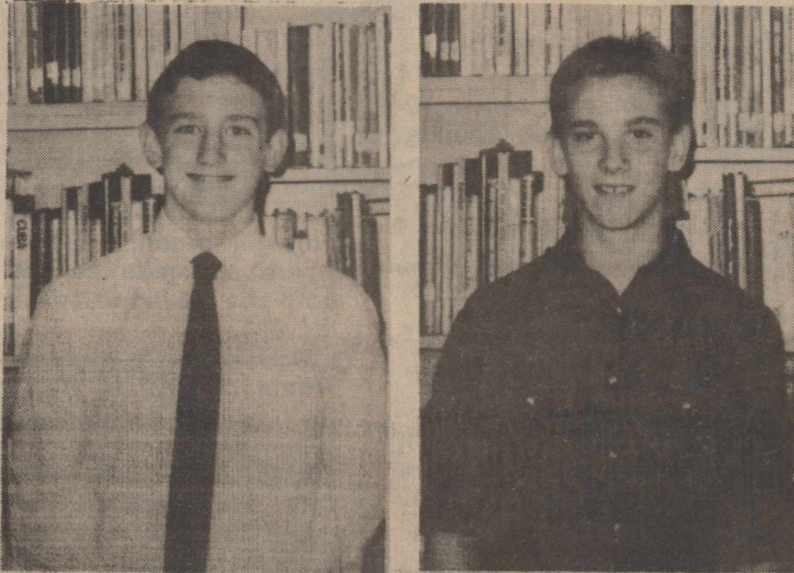
Now the actual flow during irrigation can be checked in gallons per minute (G.P.M.) The new sonar equipment measures the flow while it is attached to the outside of an irrigation line. This new technology allows for a much higher degree of accuracy. The sonar meter is accurate to a plus or minus 1%.

This new meter is on loan to the Soil Conservation Service because they have the field personnel to take the meter to the farms where the irrigation wells are. The unit is strapped onto the irrigation pipe and the flow is measured while irrigation is being done. The old type

flow meters had to be installed into the irrigation system. This required the wells to be shut down while the equipment was installed. The accuracy of such measurements was suspect. It is much better to check the flow while water is actually being applied to a crop and the irrigation well has been running without interruption for several days. Now it can be accurately determined how much water each well is actually delivering to a specific field whether it be through a sprinkler system or gated pipe.

The Sherman County Soil and Water Conservation Districts feels that it is very important for farmers to know how much water each well is pumping. Also it is important for them to know how much water each sprinkler system is applying to a crop so it can be nozzled correctly.

\$3.00 Surcharge Discussed

The Stratford City Council met in regular session May 18, 1989 with the following members present: Mayor Doug Reese, Council members Ronnie Pickens, Don Williams, R.J. Hill and Wanda Riffe. City attorney Kyle Lewis was also present. Minutes of the previous meeting were approved as read.

New councilmembers - were sworn in by Mayor Reese. Those being incumbents R.J. Hill, Don Williams and Wanda Riffe along with Claude Harlow.

Adding a \$3.00 surcharge to all metered customers, in order to help fund a new water tower, was discussed. Don made a motion to pass an ordinance making this surcharge effective as soon as possible. The entire system will be updated making this charge effective on the July billing if possible. The City will continue to apply for a grant. 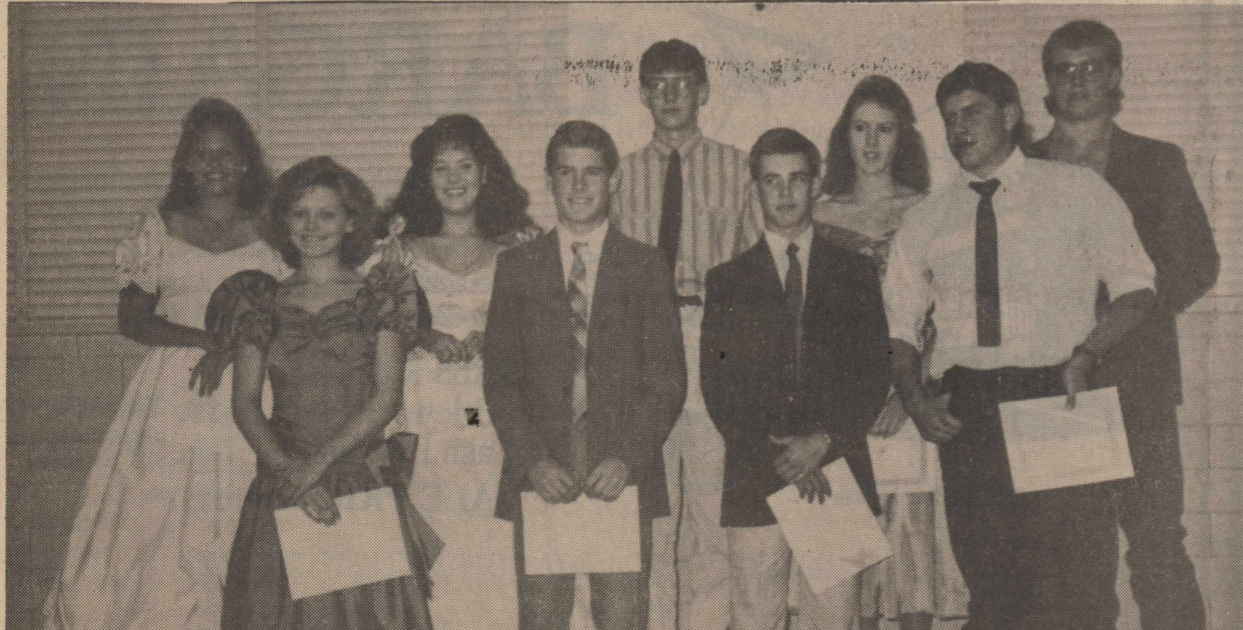

TO ALL INTERESTED PARTIES:

TAKE NOTICE THAT on June 15, 1989 at 7:30 p.m. the City Council of the City of Stratford, Texas, will pass an ordinance authorizing and directing the Mayor of the City to enter agreements for the purchase of two pickups, an automobile, a computer system and a mower and to help defray the costs of a water well and authorizing the issuance of certificates of obligation of the City of Stratford, Texas, for the payment of all or part of the cost of said equipment. The certificates of obligation shall be issued in the principal amount of not to exceed \$60,000.00 and shall bear interest at the rate of 7.25% to 7.5% per annum and shall mature not later than five (5) years from the date of issuance.

This notice is issued pursuant to a resolution passed by the City Council of the City of Stratford, Texas on May 22, 1989, which is recorded in the minutes of the City and such resolution is hereby adopted by reference and shall be considered a part of this notice for all purposes.

ORDINANCE NO. 261

An Ordinance Creating a No Parking Zone; creating a fine for violation of said ordinance; amending all ordinances applicable thereto; and declaring an emergency.

Whereas, improvements have been made to U.S. Highway 54, into the City of Stratford to include a center turn lane; and

Whereas, it is necessary for the City, in order to maintain the appropriate number of lanes of traffic, to prohibit parking on either side of the street; and

Whereas, the Stratford City Council believes it is in the best interest of the public to amend its ordinances to provide for the health and safety of its citizens;

Now, therefore, be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Stratford, Texas:

Section 1

No parking of any kind of motor vehicles shall be permitted on either side of U.S. Highway 54 from the intersection of the Northeast right of way of the Santa Fe Railroad and U.S. Highway 54 to the intersection of U.S. Highway 54 with the Southwest right of way F.M. 2677.

Section 2

Any violation of the above shall, upon conviction, be punishable with a fine not to exceed Two Hundred and No/100 dollars (\$200.00)

Section 3

The provisions of this ordinance shall amend any and all current city ordinances relating to parking on the relevant portion of U.S. Highway 54.

Section 4

An emergency is apparent for the immediate preservation of public safety that requires this ordinance to become effective immediately upon majority vote of the City Council.

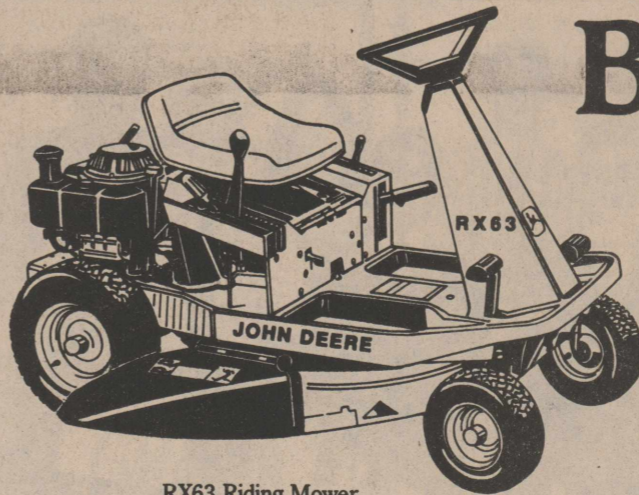

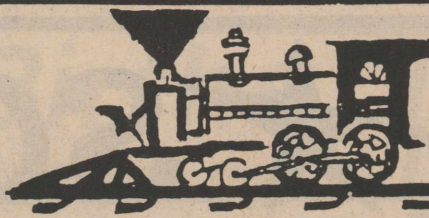

John Deere Answers Your Lawn and Garden Woes

Lawn Improves Property Value

Dear John: My real estate training taught me all about houses, but nothing about lawns. Can you give me some information about grass seed?

Dear Befuddled: Like real estate, grass seed depends on location, location, location. Grass seeds are listed under two general categories: warm-climate grasses such as bermudagrass and St. Augustinegrass, and cool-climate grasses like Kentucky bluegrass or fine fescue. Some types prefer a shady residence; some thrive under full sun. Assess your soil type: certain seed varieties grow better in sandy or dry soil, while others like wet soil.

You can purchase seed as a straight batch, blend or mix. Straight batch seed contains just one cultivar, or type, of grass; a blend contains several cultivars of one common grass; a mix contains several cultivars of different common grasses. It's best to buy either a blend or mix, since some seed types may do better in your area than others.

You can actually improve your property's value by choosing high-quality seed. Look for a high germination rate, less than one percent weed seeds and no seeds of noxious weeds (ones that are extremely difficult to control).

Dear John: I work in an office all day and work on my tan on the weekends. Is it okay to mow the lawn in my swimsuit?

Dear Golden Grass-cutter: As tempting as it might be, wearing swimwear doesn't provide enough protection while you're mowing. You need long slacks and a shirt to cover your bare skin. Wear closed-toe shoes to protect feet from spinning mower blades and any sharp objects that might be hidden in the grass. Be sure your shoes provide traction on slippery lawns. Avoid dangling jewelry or scarves that might get caught in the mower controls. Mow early in the day, so you can suntan in the afternoon.

Dear John: I made a quick trip to pick up some pretty flowers. Do I just set them in my window-box and wait for rain?

Dear Hasty Hanna: Slow down! Wait until after the last frost before moving flowering plants outdoors. While the days may be warming up, one last frost can kill your flowers.

When the time comes, break off the bottom of the peat pot to free the roots. Cover the top edges of the pot when planting; otherwise, they can act as a wick to draw moisture out of the soil. Firm the soil around the plants and water with a starter fertilizer solution high in phosphorus.

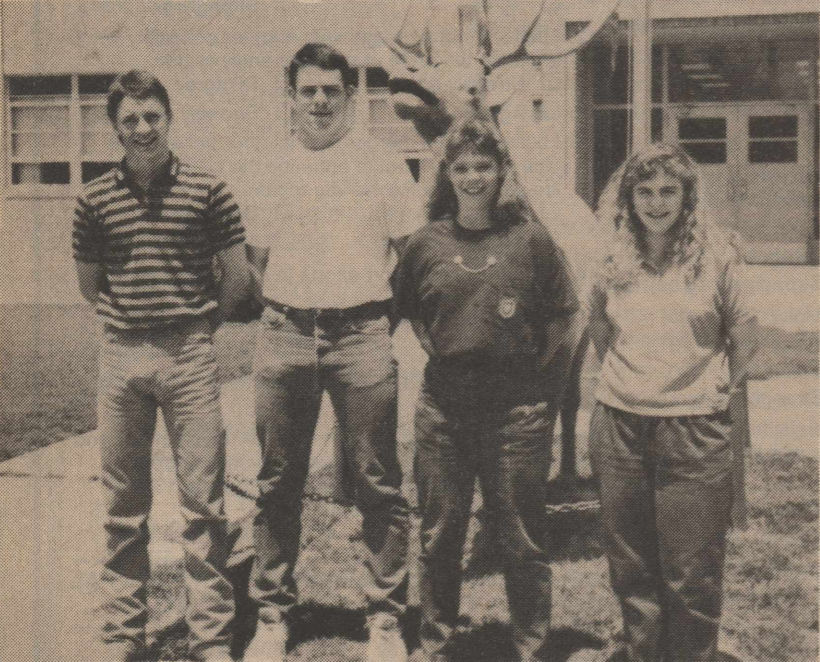

SPS, IBEW Sponsor 'Kid Care' Program



Southwestern Public Service Company (SPS) and the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers (IBEW) local #602 have implemented a community-watch program designed to assist children who are lost, hurt or feeling threatened.

Through the "Kid Care" program, a child needing assistance can go to any utility truck bearing the distinctive SPS logo. These vehicles are equipped with radios allowing SPS employees to contact a company dispatcher with a request for

help. The dispatcher, in turn, notifies the appropriate medical or law-enforcement agency, and the SPS employee remains at the site until help arrives.

The police or other authorities will handle the situation reported by the child. SPS employees have been instructed only to relay requests for help.

"I think there's a natural inclination to try to help a kid in trouble," said Clayton White, business manager for IBEW Local #602. "We're just asking our people to remember that they're utility workers, not policemen or paramedics, and they should let the authorities handle any Kid Care situation that comes up."

Posters featuring large white trucks with SPS' orange-and-black logo have been placed in elementary and middle schools throughout the company's 52,000 square mile service area. Principals and teachers at these schools will help educate students about the program, and parents will be encouraged through flyers and other materials to discuss the Kid Care program with their children.

"Kid's Care is a natural addition to SPS' existing community service programs," said Laura Dudley, SPS communication specialist for community programs. "SPS employees already act as 'Partners on Patrol,' watching for suspicious activities or fires. Through the company's 'Gatekeeper' program, our employees also keep an eye out for elderly persons who might need medical, financial or some other type of assistance.
