




BSPD arrests three in car chase shooting

The Big Spring Herald received the following press release Wednesday morning from the Big Spring Police Department:

"On the 8th of January 2022 at approximately 3 a.m., Big Spring Police Department officers were dispatched to the area of the 500 block of North Birdwell in an attempt to locate shots being fired at a vehicle. Upon officers arrival, contact was made with multiple subjects who were recent occupants of a red Dodge Charger. The subjects informed they were being chased by a black Chev-

rolet Camaro and a small white passenger car. The subjects informed the sole occupant of the Camaro was shooting at them. As a result of the chase and the shots being fired, the driver of the Charger wrecked into a concrete pillar in the 500 block of North Birdwell. Officers located several shell casings in the area of the wrecked Dodge Charger. None of the occupants in the red Dodge Charger were hit with any bullets, though all sustained minor injuries from the crash and each were transported to Scenic Mountain Medical Center for treatment.

'This investigation was turned over to the Criminal Investigations Divi-

sion. Detectives followed leads given during the preliminary investigation, and found that the altercation started at FM 700 and South Gregg Street when the occupants of the small white passenger car broke the front windshield of the red Dodge Charger. The red Dodge Charger left the scene and was followed by the small white car. The black Camaro joined in the pursuit of the red Dodge Charger and began firing at the red Dodge Charger at the intersection of North Service Rd IH-20 and Hwy 350. Both the black Camaro and small white

By law, veterans may salute the flag, in or out of uniform

ders back ... salute. All military servicemen and women - those in and out of uniform -now have the right to salute the American flag. According to Senate Bill 1877 - under US Code Title 4, Chapter 1 - veterans and servicemen not in uniform should place their hand over their

heart without clarifying whether they can or should salute the flag.

United States Code

"Members of the Armed Forces not in uniform and veterans may render the military salute in the manner provided for persons in uniform."

-4 USC Chapter 1: The Flag, Sec. 4

that (salute the flag). You get it ingrained that when you are in civilian attire you never salute. You can only salute when in uniform ...there are a lot of protocols and restrictions," Martinez said. "It took several times of encouragement from Mr. Tarpley, and him showing me the (new) law before I would begin to salute the flag."

Martinez continued, "Over the 23 years, anytime the flag would pass, I would place my hand over my heart when in civilian clothes. I was always very proud, and it took me a while to break away from what I had been taught. Once I started doing it, it felt weird, but way past that now."

Martinez recalled attending a Dallas Cowboy game, after reading the new legislation, and as they stood for the National Anthem he stood and saluted.

"I could feel the eyes on me ... when you are saluting your eyes can move, but your head can't. However, you could feel those around noticing," Martinez said. "Now, I'm glad I did it. It makes me that much prouder to let people know that I did serve."

The legislation, which passed unanimously on July 25, 2007, provides clarification and allows for veterans and servicemen to salute the flag whether they are in uniform or not. According to Mike Tarpley, local Vietnam Veteran, this is a piece of legislation that all veterans need to be aware of.

"The pride of being able to say 'Hey, I served.' That pride never goes away and people don't know that you served, but when you have the opportunity to salute... As a community we need to remind our veterans, at every event, whether it be a school function, community event or any other event where they are going to salute the flag, that they are allowed to salute the flag," Mike Tarpley, local Vietnam Veteran, said. "As a veteran you have the right; in uniform, out of uniform."

In several instances Tarpley recalls the demeanor change that takes place in a veteran when they know they have that honor.

"There have been many veterans who I have spoken to, some who are down and out, and I let them know about this legislation and the rights it gives them. You see them snap up," Tarpley said. "Then, you have those older veterans who find out that they have that honor still, and you see the pride in their eyes."





In a key district matchup Tuesday night the Levelland Lobos proved to the Big Spring Lady Steers just why they are ranked No. 3 in the state, cruising to a 58-23 win at Steer Gym.

Both teams entered 3-0 in league pay, tied for first. But this was new waters for the upstart Big Spring team and Levelland made sure they sunk fast - and in a hurry. Levelland is 20-1 for the season, it's only loss was close contest to Argyle, the state's No. 1 4A team. Meanwhile the Lady Steers came in riding a six-game winning streak, already having defeated district foes San Angelo Kake View, Lubbock Estacado and Snyder. What they Lady Steers got was a heavy dose of defense and some pin point passing from a team that has won six state titles over the years.

The only times the score resembled a close contest was when Big Spring's Tristen Smith made two free throws, cutting Levelland's lead to 4-2 two minutes into the game. Levelland outscored Big Spring 12-0 the rest of the quarter to lead 16-2 heading into

the second. Big Spring's only basket in the second quarter came from Ryen Terrazas. For all practical purposes the game was over at the half, Levelland led 35-4.

Levelland's halfcourt zone defense simply suffocated Big Spring's offense. The Lady Steers turned the ball over 19 times in the first half alone.

"They're solid, they are as solid of a team there is," said Big Spring coach Eric Tuttle of Levelland. " They got after us really good. We responded and played a little better in the second half. We have to go to work and keep working. I'm extremely proud of our girls as they continued to battle. We've got to push over the mountains, We still have a lots to climb."

Levelland used all of its 13 players throughout the game. it seemed the Lady Lobos never missed a beat. Point guard Emma Kent paced the win with 21 points and nine rebounds. Laci White was the only other Lobo in double figures with 13 points.

Senior guard Tristen Smith paced big Spring with eight points. With her two three-pointers, Alex Enriquez scored six points







another spade, which would allow West to score the king and jack. Alternatively, if East had the K-J-x and South led the ace and another trump, the contract would still be in danger if East took the second spade and returned the jack. In that case, Becker would not be able to ruff his losing club. Then there was also the possibility that the club loser could be averted by taking a diamond

averted by taking a diamond finesse, or by cashing the A-K of diamonds and ruffing a diamond, hoping the queen would fall. As Becker sifted these options in

his mind, he took lots and lots of time. After a while, Sobel got up from the table, wandered around the room, came back to see whether her partner had played a card yet (which he hadn't), went off again and eventually settled down at a nearby sofa to read a magazine. Meanwhile, Becker's opponents chatted amiably, occasionally getting up to stretch or get a drink of water. Time went on. Finally, after more than 15 minutes, he decided to play the ace and another spade. When the trumps divided 2-2, he claimed the rest. Every other conceivable line of play would also have worked. Sobel returned to the table shortly thereafter and asked anxiously, "Did you make it?" "Sure," said Becker, "it was a laydown!"

Drive While High, Get a DUI

Dear Annie: I had a high school boyfriend 47 years ago but left him. He came to my house the day before I was marrying someone else and begged me not to marry him, but I did. Long story short, after getting divorced, I tried to find him, but I couldn't. I married again and got divorced again. I then focused on trying to find him again only to find out he's been dead since 2007. I don't know how to process my guilt and grief and wondering what might have been. think back to 47 years ago: There was a reason you left him. There was a reason you married someone else. You did the best you could with the information you had. Stop beating yourself up.

Dear Annie: My wife and I recently found out that our 19-year-old son has been smoking pot for about a year. We had been suspicious but didn't have proof until last week. He says that it helps his anxiety (something we didn't know he had), keeps him focused and helps him to have a decent appetite. He insists that it is not addictive, yet he does not want to give it up. He says that he usually smokes it in a remote area and then drives himself to wherever he is going. This is crushing to us on so many levels! No. 1: We would like to see him deal with his anxiety through some

other, safer means (a therapist maybe?); No. 2: He is not legally old enough in our state to have marijuana; No. 3: He insists that he doesn't drive stoned, but it sounds like he has. What if he hurt someone?; No. 4: He has a friend whose sister, just a few years ago, used pot for her anxiety, and when that didn't work, she went to stronger street drugs and eventually overdosed and died. When that happened, we had long talks with our children about drugs, and we thought they were smart enough not to get involved.

We don't know what to do. Right now, we are switching health insurance, so we cannot see a doctor or therapist until he can be added to our new insurance. What should we do? I would love to turn in his supplier to the authorities, but he won't give up the guy's name. Any suggestions? -- Worried for ou

Dear Worried: If

your son gets pulled over while under the influence of marijuana, he'll get a DUI. And the fact that he's underage could result in high fines or even jail time, depending on state laws. A lot of teenagers are under the impression that driving high isn't an issue, so make sure he's aware of the consequences.

His use of marijuana to self-medicate is a different problem entirely. He needs to address his underlying anxiety issues, rather than mask them with a drug. Contact the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration until you are able to find a good therapist for your son.




