HC trustees meeting Monday

The Howard County Junior College District Board of Trustees will meet Monday for their regular monthly meeting. Board members will begin their day with an executive session at 10 a.m., followed by lunch and the regular open meeting at 12:30 p.m.

During the executive session, Big Spring Economic Development Corporation Executive Director Mark Willis will address the board regarding a economic development prospect and activity on economic development projects. The board will also discuss cabinet leadership.

During the regular meeting, following the invocation and recognition of guests, the board will consider approval of routine matters, including minutes of the Feb. 28 regular meeting, financial statements for February, monthly reports of auxiliary services, personnel matters, and an internal audit report.

In New Business, the board will hear its 23rd COVID-19 Response Status report, including the status of the Open Howard College plan. The board will also hear recommendations for cabinet positions at the college.

The board will hear a proposal regarding an honorary degree. The board will consider performance measures and outcomes, including performance

the Big Spring campus and consider a routine item regarding the Texas Association of School Boards Interlocal Participation Agreement for Risk Management Coverage Programs.

The board may discuss handbook and catalog changes and new positions, followed by updates of construction and renovation projects including: Big Spring and SWCD Roof Project updates; Library and Music Buildings renovation update; and an update on the SWCD Diagnostic Center abatement and demolition.

The board will hear an update on the Student Information System Project's implementation.

College President Dr. Cheryl Sparks will report on upcoming activities and recognitions.

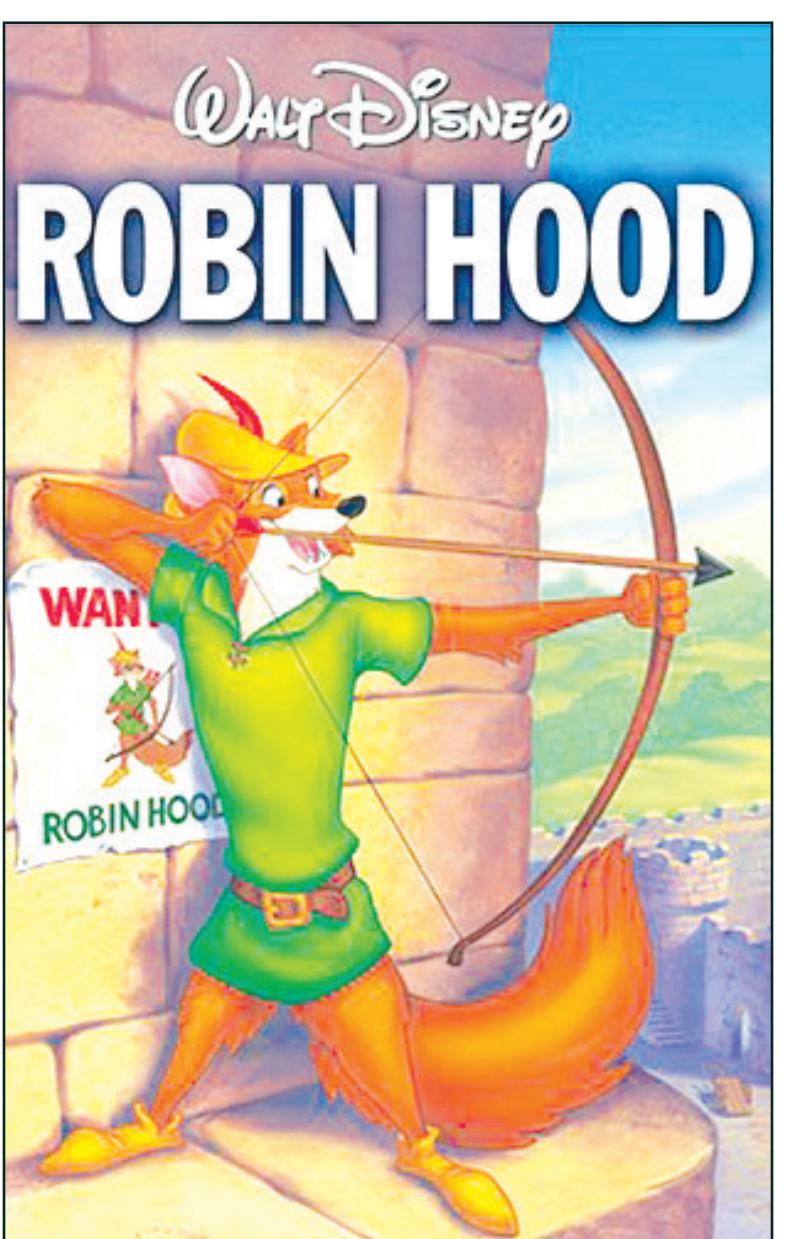

Glasscock County wreck causes one fatality

A Midland man is dead, and a Luling man is hospitalized following a two-vehicle collision Monday in Glasscock County.

According to a press release issued by the Texas Department of Public Safety, at about 6:30 a.m. Monday, Jordi Rafael Cruz, 22, of Luling was traveling south on State Highway 137 about 12 miles west of Garden City in a 2015 Chevrolet Silverado, while Aaron William-Thomas Weber, 31, of Midland was driving north on the same

highway in his 2016 Honda Accord. Cruz veered across the roadway into the east barrow ditch at the side of the highway. Attempting to correct, Cruz drove back onto the roadway, where he collided with Weber.

Weber was pronounced dead at the scene of the accident by Glasscock County Justice of the Peace Brandy Farris.

Cruz was taken to Midland Memorial Hospital was in stable condition.

According to the TxDPS report, weather conditions at

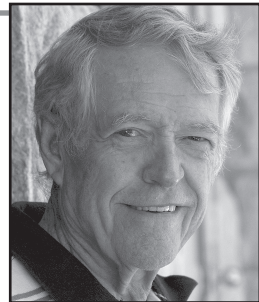

FOLKLORE IN A FUDGE

Dean Jones grew up in Carthage and worked in different businesses around town since he was 16. Many of those businesses have closed and most everybody has forgotten about them. But Dean tries to jog their memory. Every Tuesday he'll post a clue about a forgotten retail business on Facebook. The first 3 people to name the business get prizes in the form of fudge from Dean's Fudge Shop called Fudge and More, located on the square in downtown Carthage. First place winner gets a pound of fudge, second or third places get a half-pound each.

Dean has had his shop 27 years and makes everything from scratch. He makes some chocolate items. "I do white chocolate, dark chocolate, milk chocolate, dark chocolate sea salt caramels, but fudge is my main product," says Dean. "I do many different flavors like tiger butter, vanilla pecan, chocolate pecan, good ole plain chocolate, amaretto chocolate swirl, vanilla chocolate swirl, mint chocolate swirl and pumpkin pie fudge with pecans in it."

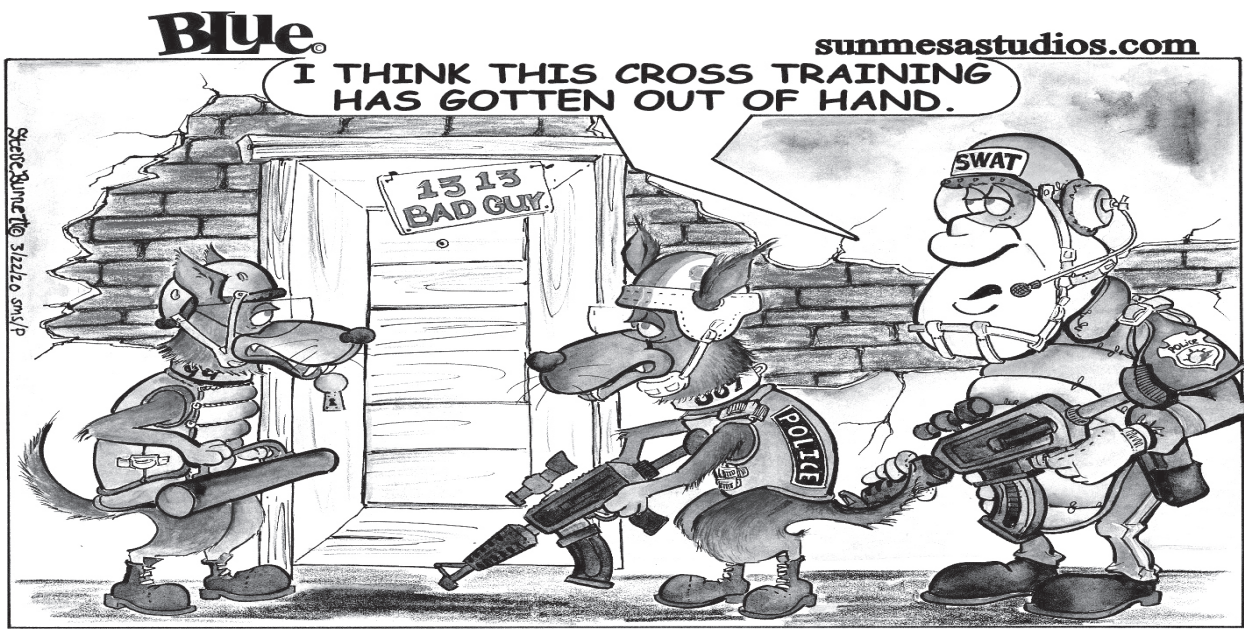
He doesn't do Internet or catalogue business, just walk in. He has generations of customers. "Some of them tell me they used to come in when they were little girls or little boys and now they're bringing their kids in."

Dean's place is in the old post office building and it lives up the name of the business, "We do sell more than fudge," says Dean. "I sell arts and crafts, some of which I make. My wife and I used to do craft shows, selling the items we made. We saw that when people go to craft shows they might not buy any art or crafts but they always buy something to eat. A friend of mine made fudge. I decided that's what I needed to do, open a fudge shop in Carthage. I really enjoy it. It's so much fun to see who comes in the front door."

Dean decorates his store according to the season. Last Halloween he had the Ghost Busters Vehicle in front of his shop while an electronic spook show played in his store window.

Among the many items in his shop is one called a Dumb Bull that creates a scary sound. "My grandfather used to scare us kids with it. It's basically a nail keg with both ends knocked out and a deer hide stretched over one end with a string through the middle of the hide. When you reach in the keg and pull on that string, it lets out a roar that scares little kids when they're in the woods, especially at night. If you put resin or bees wax on your fingers and pull on the string it makes the sound louder. It has been known to stampede cattle."

Dean says he went in a hardware store to buy a keg of nails and the storeowner said he hadn't carried nails in kegs for years. The storeowner asked Dean, "What in the world do you want a nail keg for? Are you going to make a Dumb Bull?" I've reported on that thing for years and never knew the name of it until I met Dean.



Third Baseman on the Mound...

A dozen years before "Sir" was added to his name, Winston Churchill motivated Britons with his unforgettable "never give in" speech.

It lifted spirits for freedom as World War II raged, and frequently is quoted even now, 70 years later.

His message was to "never give in, never given in, never, never, never--in nothing great or small, large or petty--give in except to convictions of honour and good sense."...

Two dozen years after Churchill's speech, on a beautiful spring day in April, 1965, Sul Ross State University third baseman Billy Carthel saved the day for his team against the mighty Division I Wildcats of the University of Arizona in Tucson.

In comparison to the import of World War II, his pitching prowess is reasonably viewed as small, but Carthel wouldn't give in, either. His move to the pitching mound from his usual third base assignment seemed unlikely. A baseball lifer, he had already blasted a pair of doubles, giving the Lobos leads of up to eight runs before the home team started its ninth inning rally. Late Coach Ray Van Cleef had used his entire pitching roster as the game slipped away.

With his team leading 11-10 and the Wildcats loading the bases with no one out, he yelled, "Has anyone here ever pitched, even in Little League?" Carthel, saying he had done so almost a decade earlier, was handed the ball. He retired the next three batters, striking out two and getting the third on an infield pop-up....

I was present as Sul Ross sports information director and remember the unlikely heroics of this college freshman as one of life's most memorable "never give in" sports moments.

His lifelong humility adds to the sweetness of the feat. He has an "awe shucks" view of his accomplishments, and there were many. One of note occurred when he played for the Memphis Blues in an exhibition game with the New York Mets. He

played a different position every inning!

He's retired now with wife, Pat, on their ranch near Silverton in northwest Texas. He was a guide for hundreds of hunters (wild hogs, turkeys, aoudad sheep and mule deer) for 20+ years. At age 76, he's slowed by several illnesses, including COPD that sometimes makes communication difficult. Still, his personality sparkles. He remembers the big game in Tucson against a team that later had a win streak of 17 games, finishing the season in the NCAA's top 25 teams. He's fuzzy on the pitching part, however. Thankfully, Tom Cunningham, a teammate, remembers it keenly. He says Carthel's ninth inning heroics dominated conversations at the team's reunion more than 25 years ago....

I remember phoning Plainview's Daily Herald and Radio Station KVOP concerning what the community's favorite son had accomplished that day in Tucson.

Carthel spent most of his adult life playing and coaching in professional baseball, including stints with the Montreal Expos and New York Mets.

He seemed destined for the majors, but a collision with Carlton Fisk at home plate in a minor league game caused serious injuries that took away that dream....

He's a realist, knowing that many others are sidetracked on their trails to the "biggs."

The Carthels are happy living on their northwest Texas ranch. Friends say it doesn't take much to excite the couple. They're tickled pink that they have a Dollar General store nearby now, so they don't have to drive a dozen miles for milk or bread. They are heirs of many memories, not only of baseball, but also game hunts and ranch life that Billy loves so much. There also are crates of clippings, and they cherish phone calls from grandsons Billy, a freshman baseballer at Oklahoma Wesleyan University in Bartlesville, and Jeffrey, a high school junior player in Tulsa, OK. Their dad, Thad Carthel, has coached them in summer leagues over the years.

There is much love in this family, whose conversations always include baseball, "back when" with granddad, and the grandsons' here and now....

Twenty-plus years later. Here comes this young man from Midland High, Bryce Hoppel. Both Stallings and Hoppel are two specimens you rarely see. Both ran under 1:50 in high school. Stallings went to the University of Florida and had a stellar career, running in the 1:45-1:46 range, qualifying for the 1996 Olympic Trials.

The 24-year old Hoppel is now one of the best half-milers in the world. He ran for the University of Kansas and won some national titles. He competed in the 2021 Olympics and has the best time of 1:43.23. Last week he finished third in the world indoor track championships in Belgrade, Serbia.

Two weeks from opening day, MLB teams work to set rosters

PHOENIX — In this year's lightning-round version of spring training, just two weeks remain until Major League Baseball's opening day on April 7.

That's not much time to get hitters and pitchers ready for a 162-game regular season, especially since games started a week ago. Many players are just now getting their first spring at-bats or innings on the mound. The sport's 99-day labor lockout from December to mid-March forced the schedule squeeze.

Clubs are also still scrambling to fill their rosters through free agency and trades, processes that were frozen during the lockout.

Among Thursday's moves, the Toronto Blue Jays traded outfielder Randal Grichuk and just over \$9.7 million to the Colorado Rockies for outfielder Raimel Tapia and minor league infielder Adrian Pinto.

The 29-year-old Grichuk hit .241 with 22 homers and 81 RBIs in 149 games last season. He was dealt two days after hitting a grand slam in a spring training game against the Yankees.

The cash will offset a little more than half the \$18.7 million Grichuk is owed over the final two seasons of his \$52 million, five-year contract.

Tapia agreed this week to a \$3.95 million, one-year contract and is eligible for free agency after the 2023 season.

Colorado's free agent signing of infielder/outfielder Kris Bryant had a big impact on Tapia, who was penciled in as the team's left fielder before Bryant's arrival. Tapia became the odd-outfielder-out with Sam Hilliard in center and Charlie Blackmon in right.

ROMO SIGNS WITH MARINERS

The Seattle Mariners bolstered their bullpen by signing veteran right-hander Sergio Romo to a one-year contract.

The deal was finalized following a physical and is for \$2 million.

Adding another proven right-hander to the bullpen became a major need for Seattle after Casey Sadler was lost for the season when he required shoulder surgery.

Romo, 39, spent last season with Oakland, the sixth different team in his career. Romo had his greatest success during his nine seasons with

San Francisco. He's also pitched for Tampa Bay, the Los Angeles Dodgers, Miami and Minnesota.

Last season with Oakland, Romo appeared in 66 games and had a 4.67 ERA and 60 strikeouts in 61 2/3 innings.

DAVIES TO DIAMONDBACKS

Right-handed pitcher Zach Davies agreed to a one-year deal with the Arizona Diamondbacks that includes a mutual option for the 2023 season.

The Diamondbacks hope Davies can have a bounce-back season after a rough 2021 when he was 6-12 with a 5.78 ERA for the Chicago Cubs and led the National League with 75 walks.

The 29-year-old had a 3.79 ERA over his first six MLB seasons with the Milwaukee Brewers and San Diego Padres. He'll compete for a spot in the D-backs' starting rotation behind Madison Bumgarner, Zac Gallen and Merrill Kelly.

The D-backs also placed reliever J.B. Bukauskas on the 60-day injured list to make room for Davies on the roster.

AROZARENA, ALVAREZ CONTRACTS RENEWED

Rookie of the Year winners Randy Arozarena and Yordan Alvarez and All-Star shortstop Bo Bichette were

among 16 players whose contracts were renewed by their teams rather than reach negotiated agreements.

Arozarena, the outfielder who won the 2021 AL Rookie award, was given a \$716,600 salary for 2022 while in the major leagues by the Tampa Bay Rays, according to contract information obtained by The Associated Press. That is up from \$581,200 last season. He batted .274 with 20 homers, 69 RBIs and an .815 OPS.

Alvarez, the Houston Astros designated hitter and outfielder voted a unanimous winner of the 2019 AL award, was given a \$764,600 salary, up from \$609,000 last year. He hit .277 last year with 33 homers, 104 RBIs and an .877 OPS.

Bichette was given a \$723,550 salary, an increase from \$587,800 last year, when he also earned a \$10,000 bonus for making the All-Star team. He hit .298 with 29 homers, 102 RBIs, an AL-leading 191 hits and an .828 OPS.

Atlanta right-hander Ian Anderson was renewed at \$710,000 after pitching five hitless, scoreless innings to win World Series Game 3 over Houston. He had been renewed at \$575,500 last year.

“This program is an open door for teachers and students to talk about a very real issue and provide encouragement to them. Sometimes we need to remind our youth that it is okay to speak up, and that they shouldn’t let their age limit them and the power that they hold to make a difference,” she said. “Every voice matters and every student is important. We want to make sure that they know that, and this is just one way that we can do that.”

US, EU announce new partnership to undercut Russian energy

BRUSSELS — The United States and European Union on Friday announced a new partnership to reduce the continent's reliance on Russian energy, a step top officials characterized as the start of a years-long initiative to further isolate Moscow after its invasion of Ukraine.

U.S. President Joe Biden asserted that Russian President Vladimir Putin uses energy to "coerce and manipulate his neighbors" and uses the profits from its sale to "drive his war machine."

Biden said the partnership he announced jointly with a top European Union official will turn that dynamic on its head by reducing Europe's dependence on Russian energy sources, as well reducing the continent's demand for gas overall.

The president said such a step is not "only the right thing to do from a moral standpoint" but "it's going to put us on a stronger strategic footing."

Under the plan, the U.S. and other nations will increase liquified natural gas exports to Europe by 15 billion cubic meters this year, though U.S. officials were unable to say exactly which countries will provide the extra energy this year. Even larger shipments would be delivered in the future. .

At the same time, they will try to keep their climate goals on track by powering gas infrastructure with clean energy and reducing methane leaks that can worsen global warming.

Although the initiative will likely require new facilities for importing liquified natural gas, the partnership is also geared toward reducing reliance on fossil fuels in the long run through energy efficiency and alternative sources of energy, according to the White House.

Ursula von der Leyen, head of the EU's executive arm, said it is important for Europe to shift away from Russia and toward energy suppliers that are trustworthy, friendly and reliable.

"We aim to reduce this dependence on Russian fossil fuels and get rid of it," she said.

Russian energy is a key source of income and political leverage for Moscow. Almost 40% of the European Union's natural gas comes from Russia to heat homes, generate electricity and power industry.

Biden was leaving Brussels after the announcement and heading to Rzeszów in Poland, where U.S. troops are based roughly an hour's drive from the Ukrainian border.

He will be briefed on the humanitarian response to the refugees streaming out of Ukraine and those still suffering inside the country. He also will meet with U.S. service members from the 82nd Airborne Division, who serve alongside Polish troops.

Biden is then expected to fly to Warsaw for talks Saturday with Polish President Andrzej Duda and an address to the Polish people before he departs for Washington.

While in Brussels, Biden participated in a trio of summits hosted by NATO, the Group of Seven industrialized nations and the European Union, all on Thursday. The extraordinary series of meetings reflects heightened concerns about the war in Ukraine, which has entered its second month.

Although Ukraine has resisted the Russian invasion much more successfully than initially expected, the conflict has become a grueling and bloody affair, with thousands of casualties on each side and millions of refugees fleeing the country.

Western leaders are also concerned that Russian President Vladimir Putin could use chemical or even nuclear weapons to regain momentum in the war.

Getting more liquefied natural gas to Europe could be difficult, even though the U.S. has been dramatically increasing its exports in recent years. Many export facilities are already operating at capacity, and most new terminals are still only in the planning stages.

Most U.S. shipments already go to Europe, according to the Center for Liquefied Natural Gas, an industry lobbying group. Although much of the supply is already contracted out to buyers, there are still opportunities to shift its destination.

"The U.S. is in a unique position because it has flexible LNG that can be re-routed to Europe or to Asia, depending on who's willing to pay that price," said Emily McClain, gas markets analyst at Rystad.



Seafood Pancakes
Makes 4 to 5 pancakes

- 2 ounces mussels, cleaned and debearded
- 2 ounces clams, cleaned
- 3 1/4 ounces rice flour
- 2 tablespoons cornflour
- 2 1/2 ounces self-rising

flour

2 tablespoons dweng-jang (Korean soy bean paste)

1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper

3 large pinches of sea salt

3 1/2 ounces brown shrimp

5 spring onions, julienned

1 teaspoon garlic, grated or finely chopped

2 red chillies, thinly sliced at an angle

Vegetable oil for frying

In a large saucepan, add enough water so that it's three-quarters full and bring to a boil. Add the mussels and clams and cook until the shells open. Remove the shellfish and set aside to cool.

Retain 3/4 ounces of the cooking liquor then strain it to remove the meat from the shells of the mussels and clams and set aside.

In a large bowl, gently whisk together the rice flour, cornflour,

self-rising flour, dweng-jang, pepper, salt and 8 ounces of cold water and liquor from the cooked shellfish until smooth. Add the brown shrimp, mussels, clams, spring onions, garlic and red chillies (keeping the seeds, if you like more heat) and stir batter until thoroughly combined.

In a large nonstick frying pan, heat a generous drizzle of oil over a medium-high heat. Spoon in the batter and spread it evenly to form a pancake about 5 inches wide.

Fry until golden brown and crispy on the base, about 3 to 4 minutes.

Carefully flip and cook for a further 3 to 4 minutes until the other side is golden.

Transfer to a kitchen paper-lined plate to drain.

Repeat with the remaining batter, adding more oil to the frying pan as needed.

Serve immediately with a favorite dipping sauce.

Opening lead — king of diamonds.
A declarer should be willing to sacrifice a trick if it increases his overall chance of making the contract. Thus, if South makes exactly four hearts in the present case, he scores 620 points (at duplicate or Chicago scoring); if he makes an overtrick, he scores 650; but if he goes down one, he is minus 100.
The 30-points declarer can gain by making five hearts are obviously a drop in the bucket compared with what he can lose if he goes down

trying for an overtrick.
Observe how this applies to today's deal. South takes the diamond lead with the ace and sees that he could lose a spade, a club and an unknown number of trumps. How many trump tricks he will lose depends on how the trumps are divided or on how he plays the suit.
At trick two, declarer plays the ace of trump, on which East produces the jack. If South carelessly continues with the king, he goes down one, losing two trump tricks, a spade and a club. But South should not play the king after East's jack appears, since if the jack is a singleton, the king play will almost surely prove fatal.
Declarer should reason that East started with either the singleton jack or the doubleton Q-J. By leading a low trump next, South can restrict himself to one trump loser in either case. This safety play will cost him a trick if East started with the Q-J, but South should be willing to lose 30 points to ensure the contract.
In the actual deal, if South decides to play safe and leads a low trump toward dummy at trick three, he loses only one trump trick — regardless of which heart West chooses to play — and so finishes with 10 tricks.

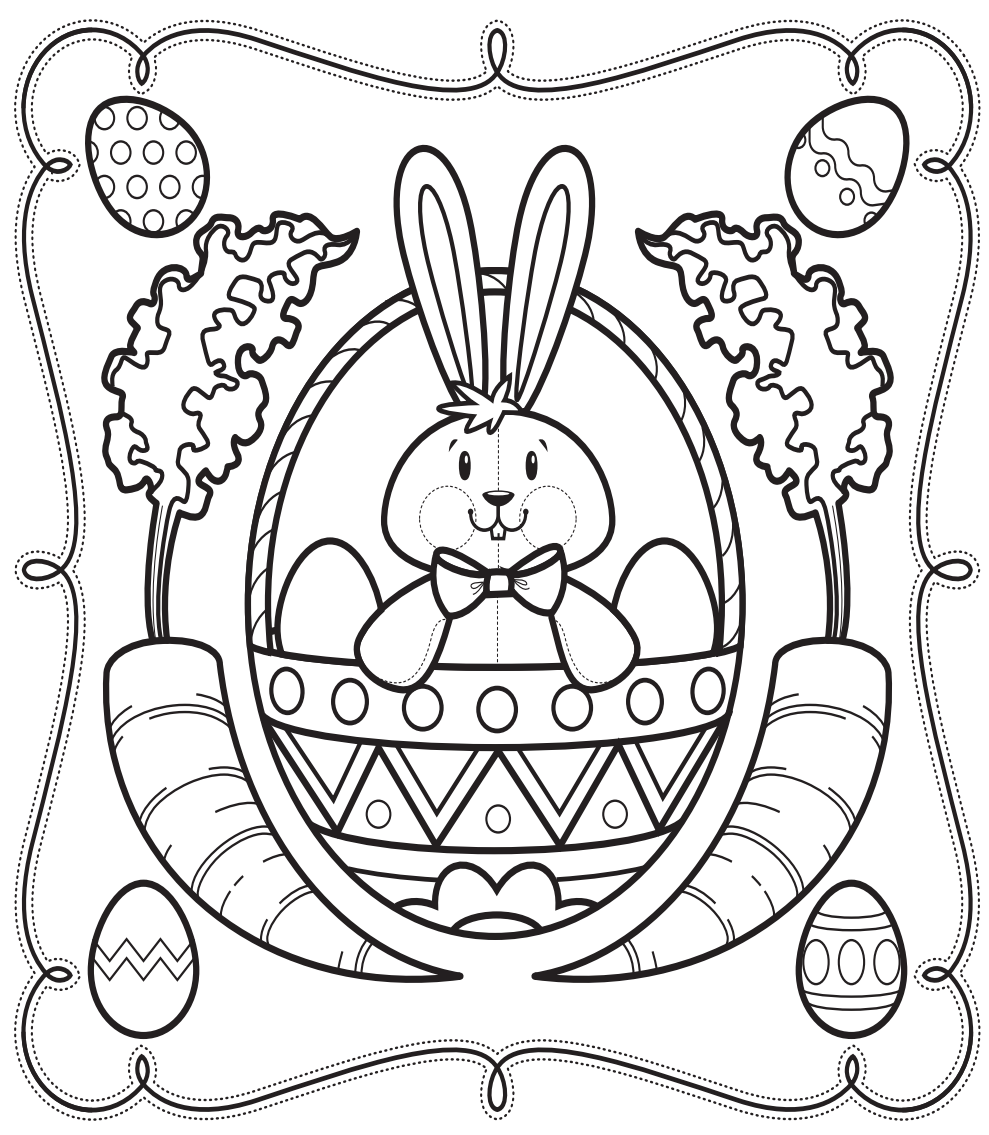

'How We Roll' is right up Pete Holmes' alley

In his new sitcom, Pete Holmes has a ball, very literally.

The comedian who previously starred in "Crashing" and "The Pete Holmes Show" makes a leap from cable to broadcast television – and also from semi-autobiographical material to someone else's saga – in "How We Roll," a CBS sitcom debuting Thursday, March 31. The show is based on the true story of Tom Smallwood, a downsized Midwestern auto worker who decides to pursue his dream of becoming a pro bowler, supported by his wife ("Scandal" alum Katie Lowes) and an alley proprietor (Chi McBride, "Hawaii Five-0").

Noting such previous bowling-themed projects as TV's "Ed" and the movies "The Big Lebowski" and "Kingpin," Holmes muses, "I'm not too familiar with the lingo, so I'll just say that this is about real, heavy-ball bowling. My experience with bowling is similar to that of maybe most Americans ... it's something I don't do that often, but when I do, I remember how much fun it is.

"I was lucky enough to have a few lessons with professionals," Holmes notes of his preparation for the series. "I didn't learn so much how to bowl, but how to look like I know how to bowl. And they told me very interesting stories about hustling when they were growing

up and taking people for a lot of money, because nobody expects anyone to be very good at bowling. But these people were."

Still, Holmes is relieved that he has to look proficient only to a certain degree: "Even when we do an episode that hinges on a tournament, in most of the scenes, I've either just finished bowling or I'm about to bowl. The reason for that is that the show really is about friendship and family and the work relationships you have. In this case, the job is bowling."

Since much of his earlier comedy stemmed from his own life, Holmes finds "How We Roll" a major change in that way. "I really like it," he maintains. "Coming from a comedy background, my first concern is always nailing the joke. Then, it slowly hit me that I have an opportunity to build a character here. It's what so many actors do on so many jobs, but so often, I've played myself. I'm starting for the first time to go, 'Wait. I'm going to answer some questions about this person just for me.'"

In the end, Holmes hopes the appeal of "How We Roll" will be that of the game it deals with. "One of the things I've learned," he reflects, "is that bowling used to be a sport for the elite, and it's just sort of evolved into an event for everyone."

The movie industry still is having its biggest night of the year, but with some differences.

Regina Hall, Amy Schumer and Wanda Sykes are slated to share the hosting duties when ABC televises the 94th edition of the Oscars on Sunday, March 27. Each host will preside over one of three "acts" staged at Hollywood's Dolby Theatre, and in a move that has drawn mixed reactions, film fans will have their chance to weigh in with picks in two categories.

Twitter users have been able to vote for their favorite movie and favorite movie moment of the past year, with the Motion Picture Academy maintaining it's an extension of this year's Oscar theme, "Movie Lovers Unite." At the same time, added controversy has greeted the decision to cut the live on-air presentation of eight categories including best film editing and best original score.

Also a potential source of comment on Oscar night will be the COVID-19-related protocols, amended somewhat from their initial deployment last year. (The 2020 event preceded the pandemic.) Nominees and their guests will have to be vaccinated (with proof of such shown), but performers and presenters won't ... with some individuals falling into both categories. Additionally, "relaxed" masking requirements reportedly will be in effect.

Even with all of that, the basic purpose of the Academy Awards will remain the same – to honor the

Field had her dreams: An Oscar winner's TV roots



Q: I enjoyed seeing the recent weekend marathon of Sally Field shows on Decades. How many series did she star in before she became a movie star? – Ron Hire, Columbus, Ohio

A: The three she starred in were the three that were encompassed by that marathon: "Gidget," "The Flying Nun" and "The Girl With Something Extra." Field started doing movie roles over the course of those shows – in 1967, "The Way West" proclaimed that it was "Introducing Sally Field," though she already had done a season of "Gidget" – but her big-screen stardom really started to kick in after those series, with such features as "Stay Hungry," "Smokey and the Bandit" and certainly "Norma Rae," the latter bringing Field her first Oscar.

Q: I recently saw the movie "The Apartment." Did Fred MacMurray make that while he also was making "My Three Sons"? – Tom Curtis, Grand Junction, Colo.



A: MacMurray actually completed the Oscar-winning 1960 film before he started the long-running comedy series. "The Apartment" was released in June of that year, and "My Three Sons" premiered three months later. However, the actor already had a reputation for family-friendly fare thanks to the Disney movies he had made. That gained him some interesting responses for having played the philandering boss in "The Apartment," since he said women regularly would come up to him and scold him for having taken the part (which originally was intended for Paul Douglas, who died before production began). MacMurray also claimed that one woman walked up to him and hit him with her purse over it.

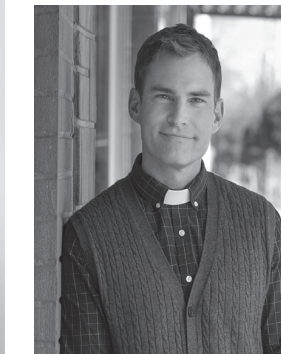

OF 'WELCOME TO FLATCH' ON FOX



What prompted you to take on the role of Father Joe in "Welcome to Flatch"?

I may have talked about Ricky Gervais' character in "The Office" and how much I loved that format and would love to find a project like a docu-comedy.

I think (Fox entertainment chief Michael Thorn) and I were talking about it when we were shooting one day, or we were in Wilmington to shoot the pilot. And we all had dinner afterwards and we were like, "Oh, my God, we're actually doing it. We talked about, you know, doing a comedy like this, and now we get a chance to do it." Yeah, it was awesome.

What do people in your life think about your playing a clergyman?

My mom was very, very excited about this, because she's heavily involved with the church. When I said, "I'm playing Father Joe," she was like, "Amen. Finally."

What made you feel equipped to play Father Joe?

I remember reading the pilot, and I saw that Father Joe was from Minneapolis. I was like, "Oh, I'm from Minnesota I'm perfect. I'm perfect for it."

I think it was one of the first things I said to (the executive producers), too, when I was trying to sell myself for it: "Guys, listen, I'm from Minneapolis, I'm from Minnesota, so let's just do this thing."

Do you consider Father Joe vastly different from most other parts you've done?

This is a very different character than I've played, because he's a sweet, good guy who's trying to do the best he can. I think he's kind of a guy that might be a little in over his head in taking on a leadership role ... maybe not the best guy to have this sort of responsibility, but he really tries. And I think it's a lot of fun to play, and comedically, too.

He's just trying to keep it together. But I definitely should never be a pastor, a minister, ever. Nobody wants that.

Chefs look for a 'Rat in the Kitchen' in TBS cooking competition show

There is a "Rat in the Kitchen" – but no need to call the health department – in a cooking competition show upcoming on TBS.

The premise of the 10-episode hourlong series that debuts Thursday, March 31, is pretty straightforward. Professional chefs and home cooks compete in a series of creative cooking challenges, earning cash in their bank for every dish that chef Ludo Lefebvre ("The Mind of a Chef," "Ludo Bites America") gives his thumbs up. But one is the titular rodent trying to sabotage the others' creations. So in addition to impressing Lefebvre, they're also trying to determine the mole among them.

In the end, if the cooks correctly guess the guilty party, they win the contents of the bank. If not, the saboteur gets the cash.

Bringing the layperson's perspective is comic and actress Natasha Leggero ("Another Period," "Let's Be Cops"), whose job as host is to keep things light as the competition progresses. But she also found her palate getting sharper with all the tasting.

"Now, it's just very hard for me to go to any restaurant," Leggero explains. "My husband's telling me

I'm complaining about food all the time, and I'm like, 'No, I'm just dissecting it.' So I think that just really getting into the food and the game, it just kind of all came.

"And Ludo is so passionate and serious about the food and his standards are so high," she continues. "So just having fun with that and defusing it, and I think that we did strike a good balance between how serious Ludo is about the food and also not taking it completely seriously. He was very fun to riff with, and Ludo's very funny, too."

But spotting the rat wasn't so easy. Sabotage on this show comes in so many forms, from slipping unwanted ingredients into a dish to neglecting to plate a part of the meal to encouraging a fellow cook's bad idea. Lefebvre admits he was glad he didn't have to do it.

"It was hard to figure out what's going on in the kitchen," the chef says. "I was not used to seeing a kitchen, like so many different foods in the kitchen, movement, creativity. I mean, there's a lot of chefs in one kitchen, and a lot of things going on. It's very difficult to find the rats. ... The kitchen was very painful."

OF 'KILLING EVE' ON BBC AMERICA

Was it sad saying goodbye to your character Carolyn and "Killing Eve"?

It's so sad. I can tell you I was really, really sad. I ended my bit on a kind of iconic bit of London and that was rather wonderful, that my last scene was on a wonderful bit of London near the river, and I was very sad to see it all go. But you know, we were all sad saying goodbye to each other, but particularly the camera crew, who were pretty well the same crew all the way through. That's been amazing. Julian (Court), the cinematographer, has

really set the tone of it and somehow you felt very close to those guys who spent all those years (with us).

How was it working with a new writer in each of the four seasons?

It's very interesting. As I say, Carolyn is very proscribed. I mean, she exists within a certain framework. So I've always enjoyed the new writers because in the end, everybody has to come in and landed on the same mental energy of Carolyn. And in terms of plotting, I think "Killing Eve" like many series that are very popular becomes a huge

pleasure for the audience just to spend time with those characters.

So the issue of plots or style – you know, it's four years old, the show, and even in four years the world has changed a lot. So it's been quite interesting to have new writers who have a slightly different take on things than the writers ... at the beginning. You know, it's good that it changes. You set up a prototype with the first writer. That's where the thing is conceived, really. The first writer is more than a writer. The first writer is God (laughs).

Checking in with OMAR BENSON MILLER

celebrity scoop

When the world was shut down during the pandemic, Omar Benson Miller found a productive outlet in voice work.

Indeed, the 43-year-old native of Los Angeles and actor in the currently streaming Apple TV+ drama “The Last Days of Ptolemy Grey” managed to keep busy in a variety of projects, including his ongoing gig as Raph in the forthcoming feature film “Rise of the Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles: The Movie” and the “Rugrats” series of shorts.

Best of all, he didn't have to go anywhere to do it.

“Nickelodeon sent out a whole set-up so that I could record at home,” he explains. “The main thing I needed to provide was obviously my voice but also high-speed internet. And so they sent out a whole set-up with high-end microphones and whatever phone or whatever you needed to soundproof a room. And it was pretty awesome. “And then you're able to work while still feeling safe about being at home. ...,” he continues. “It's been a crazy time period to do anything that gives you some semblance of normalcy, and work gives you that structure.”

In “Ptolemy Grey,” Miller plays Reggie, the nephew of the dementia-stricken title character played by Samuel L. Jackson. Miller was excited to work with the Oscar-nominated “Pulp Fiction” actor, calling him generous and lauding him for bringing his longtime vision for the series to fruition.

He also recalls a funny moment during a break in filming last year in Atlanta when he was out on the street with Jackson, who was in full makeup and dress as the haggard 93-year-old Ptolemy.

“I'm standing next to him and he's sitting down,” Miller explains. “People are coming up to me, talking about ‘Ballers’ and ‘8 Mile’ and whatnot and not recognizing that a film giant is sitting right next to me in full makeup.”

Denzel Washington supervises ‘Training Day’

If you like a heavy dose of edge in your Oscar-day movie viewing, it's hard to top “Training Day.” AMC offers the 2001 police drama Sunday, March 27, and what immediately sets it apart from most other films in the genre is Denzel Washington's ferocious, Academy Award-honored work as a narcotics detective whose corrupt ways alarm the young officer (Ethan Hawke) he's evaluating for a day.

While some of his earlier roles also served notice that Washington (an Oscar nominee again this year) is a performer not averse to taking gambles with his image, “Training Day” really shows the extent to which he's willing to go. In tandem with director Antoine Fuqua, with whom he would work again on the two “Equalizer” movies, Washington created what endures as one of the most unforgettable characters in his repertoire.

“Cleopatra” (Fox Movie Channel, Sunday, March 27, and Monday, March 28): The 1963 epic from director and co-writer Joseph L. Mankiewicz that almost sank 20th Century Fox remains a fascinating part of Hollywood history, for a number of reasons ... not the least being the charisma between Elizabeth Taylor and Richard Burton, whose then-blossoming romance was being watched by the public both on the screen and off. Rex Harrison also stars.

“The Rifleman” (MeTV, Monday, March 28): The episode that introduced this Western series in 1958, “The Sharpshooter,” came from excellent pedigree since it was written by genre staple (and later “The Wild Bunch” filmmaker) Sam Peckinpah. The story established the close father-son relationship between Lucas and Mark McCain (Chuck Connors, Johnny Crawford) that was such a hallmark of the show, with Lucas ordered to lose a shooting contest purposely ... or else, Mark will pay the price.

'St. Elmo's Fire' stays lit

Almost 40 years later, its stars largely remain identified as members of the so-called "Brat Pack." Such was the impact "St. Elmo's Fire" initially had ... and continues to have, with Hulu currently streaming the 1985 comedy-drama. Directed by the late Joel Schumacher, the film was seen at the time as a younger take on "The Big Chill," which had been released two years earlier ... and it's no small thing that every major star of the picture has had an enduring career.

The central characters are friends from college who remain a tight-knit group, frequenting a Georgetown bar and leaning on one another while dealing with their respective steps into adulthood. Billy (Rob Lowe) is a big reckless musician who's pretty much a washout as a young husband and father, but his sincere social-worker pal Wendy (Mare Winningham) loves him unconditionally. The emotionally shaky Jules (Demi Moore) worries her buddies through her personal involvement with her boss.

Political worker Alex (Judd Nelson) is unfaithful to longtime girlfriend Leslie (Ally Sheedy), eventually complicating the close relationships both have with aspiring writer Kevin (Andrew McCarthy). And entrepreneur-in-training Kirby (Emilio Estevez) develops a massive crush on an older doctor (Andie MacDowell) that drives him to make some questionable moves.

Much of what makes "St. Elmo's Fire" works is how generally agreeable the cast is, keeping the proceedings interesting no matter what combination the actors are in ... whether it's only two of them or virtually all of them together. By definition, that also keeps the dynamic changing; you get something much different, for instance, from Sheedy with Nelson than you do from Sheedy with McCarthy.

Others drop in along the way – veteran talent Martin Balsam drops in for a couple of scenes as Winningham's father – but "St. Elmo's Fire" has enough pivotal figures for the movie to stay pretty much trained on them, and also on the theme the film really revolves around: Regardless of what the calendar says, when does one's adult life really begin? And are you truly ready for it?

That's the universality of "St. Elmo's Fire," and likely the reason it endures for so many fans while continuing to add new generations of followers. For the stars, it's also an immediate identifier that has earned them many lifelong devotees, some of whom may think of Lowe here as they watch him now in the Fox series "9-1-1: Lone Star." And right there is evidence that this "Fire" still burns.

‘The Queen of Versailles Reigns Again’ revisits the mother of all home construction jobs

In 2012, the documentary “The Queen of Versailles” chronicled billionaire couple David and Jackie Siegel’s quest to build the largest single-family home in the country, one that ultimately was sidelined by financial setbacks, personal tragedy and the pandemic. Now a new series catches up with Mrs. Siegel as she tries to finish what they started.

In “The Queen of Versailles Reigns Again,” which begins streaming Wednesday, March 30, on discovery+, viewers get to revisit the 90,000-square-foot home near Orlando, Fla., modeled after the Palace of Versailles in France, where the couple honeymooned.

Among its amenities are a huge ballroom with marble columns, a stained-glass dome and a floor made from semi-precious gemstones; five kitchens, a 35-car garage, a 100-person dining room and an authentic British pub shipped over from Europe.

But the home has sat vacant and neglected for a decade, resulting in marble panels falling off the house, deterioration in the mahogany doors and windows and water infiltrating in numerous spots. So the place needs to be fixed. And with David hospitalized with back surgery,

the task of overseeing the teams of craftspeople falls to Jackie, a trained engineer who admits she nonetheless was out of her depth.

“I had never built anything in my life,” she says. “I never really decorated anything and it was just a learning process for me. It was really kind of crazy. I mean, all of a sudden I had all these responsibilities in dealing with millions of dollars of making decisions and trying to perform miracles to make things work. And it’s just quite overwhelming.”

Since breaking ground in 2004, the project had to be paused several times, first in 2008 when the Siegel’s finances took a hit during the Great Recession, then in 2015 when their daughter Victoria died of a drug overdose and finally in 2020-21 with the pandemic.

At this writing, the house was still in progress though nearing completion. And with David healthy again, Jackie is more than ready to move forward – and in.

“I can’t wait to start enjoying the house, which we did enjoy it at the finale of the show,” she says. “We were able to enjoy it so that was really nice. We got a little flavor of what it’s going to be like.”

British actress Sarah Lancashire has the title role as Child is seen staging her iconic show “The French Chef,” which had huge impacts in a number of ways ... in becoming symbolic of the women’s movement as the 1960s progressed, in helping to establish public television in the United States, and in making Child a major celebrity.

“There’s such an awful lot of source material available online, that was a starting point to reference her,” says Lancashire, “plus reading the books about her and the letters between her and Avis (DeVoto, Child’s friend and editor, played by Bebe Neuwirth). But at some point, I think I actually put the written material away. It didn’t necessarily make sense with what we were trying to do, which was a drama as opposed to a documentary.”

Still, Lancashire had to meet the task of

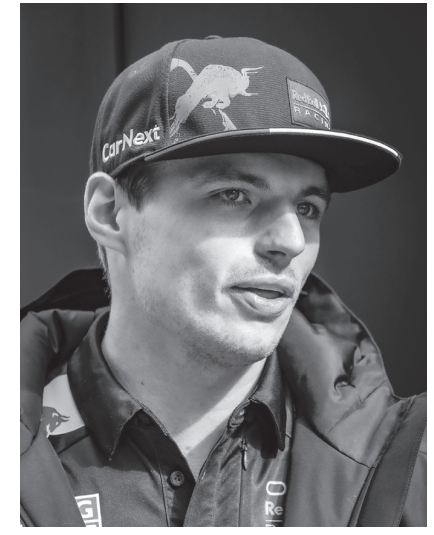

Verstappen out to prove 2021 F1 title was no fluke



Much like Barry Bonds’ single-season and all-time home run records, Max Verstappen’s 2021 world driving championship in Formula 1 was viewed with a jaundiced eye in some corners. Though in this case, banned substances weren’t part of the equation.

At the ‘21 season finale, the Abu Dhabi Grand Prix, the cars between race leader Lewis Hamilton’s No. 44 Mercedes and Verstappen’s No. 1 Red Bull were pulled from the track on the last lap. This enabled Verstappen, on fresh tires, to execute a pass of defending series champion Hamilton, on bald tires, and win his first F1 title.

That led to accusations by Hamilton and Mercedes that the outcome had been manipulated by then-FIA race director Michael Masi, who was then fired following an investigation into the Abu Dhabi decision-making, and calls from F1 fans that the 24-year-old Dutch driver be stripped of his championship.

But a look at the season stats bolsters the argument that perhaps Verstappen was deserving of the title. He had more wins than Hamilton (10 to eight), poles (10 to five), far more laps led (652 to 297) and a better average finish position (1.84 to 2.76). And as Red Bull Team principal Christian Horner asserts, Verstappen was the victim of bad luck in Azerbaijan, Hungary and Silverstone.

As for Verstappen, he was largely oblivious to the controversy and remains focused on racing and defending his title.

He and Hamilton will again duke it out when they vie in the Saudi Arabian Grand Prix – a race that Hamilton won last year – the morning of Sunday, March 27, on ESPN.

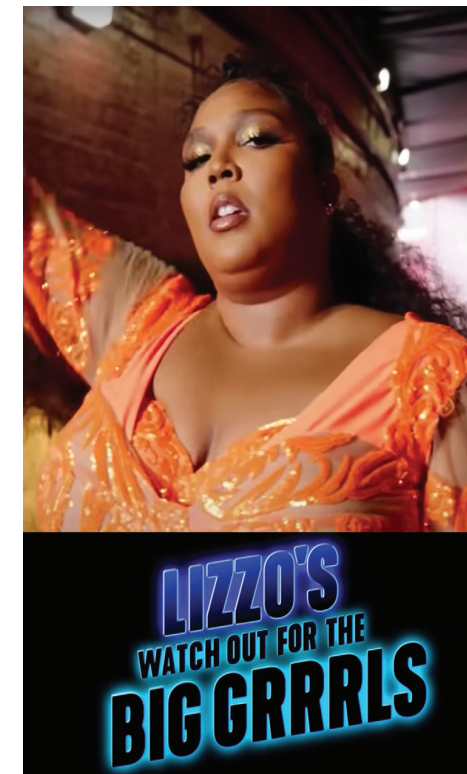

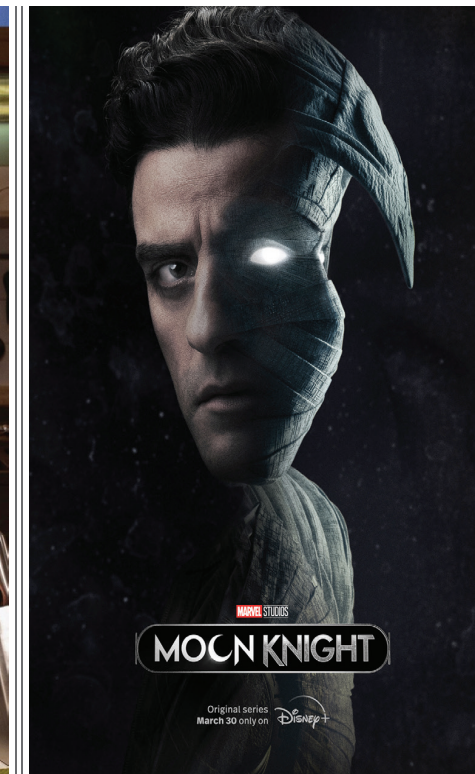
