# **Great American Smokeout Turns 13**

The American Cancer Society's Great American Smokeout turns 13 this year, which could bring good fortune to those smokers trying to quit. As it does each year on Smokeout Day, the American Cancer Society will encourage all smokers to try their luck in remaining smoke-free for 24 hours--in the hope that they might quit for life. Last year's Smokeout proved to be the magic charm for approximately 10.7% of the nation's smokers, or 5.4 million people, who gave up cigarettes the entire 24 hours. One to three days later, 3.4 million of those people still were not smoking.

Held each year on the third Thursday of November, this year on November 16th, the Great American Smokeout is a nationwide celebration featuring rallies, races, more. In short, the goal is to work a little magic to help smokers quit and stay quit.

This year the Great American Smokeout will become even more MAD, thanks to Jack Davis, a cartoonist for MAD Magazine. Davis's message to smokers to leave the pack behind will appear on a poster, postcard, and tent card. The Smokeout will also go where no smoker has gone before-- outer space-thanks to Lenard Nimoy and Paramount Pictures. Star Trek's Mr. Spock will be featured on a postcard and poster with the message "Don't Smoke, Live Long

and Prosper." Bringing everyone back to Earth will be C. Everett Koop, MD. The recently retired Surgeon General, one of the most vocal opponents of smoking, has signed on

with the American Cancer Society to sound the alarm against smoking. "Smoking Is Real Gross" is a rock video style public service announcement that should alert teenagers to smoking's "gross" results -- bad breth, zits, and being in the wrong social group. The Clio-nominated spot has appeared in the Kansas City, Dallas, and Los Angeles markets as well as on MTV and should be showing up in other areas during this year's Smokeout. For the teens' younger

brothers and sisters is a new button featuring a Teddy Bear and the message "Be Beary Healthy...Don't Smoke." There's even something new for adults, a two-fingered ring to inhibit a smoker's ability to hold a

cigarette.

Whether the frontier is in the Wild West or in outer space, it's becoming clearer that smoking is the villian that brings misfortune to people's lives. This year's Great American Smokeout, Number 13, could break that streak of bad luck for the nation's smokers and bring good health to all.
