He had kind words for Theodore Roosevelt, although, Mr. Carnegie admitted, Theodore every now and then was flighty, and in his recent editorial on the Sherman law took a whole lot of pages to tell what he might have said in one sentence. Mr. Carnegie agrees heartily with Mr. Roosevelt's proposal for a commission to regulate trusts as the Interstate Commerce Commission regulates railroads.

For these questions lying at our door for solution are greater than any that ever confronted society before. The history of evolution has passed the age of Trojan valor and of Spartan courage, which made the human being of value only to serve the state, Dogma no longer holds men subsequent to fate, either of gods or chance, but through the various ebbs and flows of human activity runs the clear and certain tone of individual uplifting. The quality of men is the test of civilization and their integrity the full promise of all that is needed for answering these questions concerning

social regeneration. I earnestly hope our hearts may be reached while we consider the small beginnings that secure this personal integrity, the highest development of men and women. We parents have no right to dally with thoughts unworthy our high calling nor to let worthy ones dwell lightly on the surface of our minds; but we must press them back to their deepest meaning and forward to their wisest possible application; only this method is worthy of any one who deals with children. 
