## Dr. Carlo Is Baird High Commencement Speaker

BAIRD—Dr. Michael J. Carlo of the Angelo State University chemistry department will be the main speaker at the Baird High School graduation exercises Monday night at the high school auditorium.

The service will begin at 8 p.m.

Dr. Carlo received his bachelor of science degree from Texas A&M in 1961 and the following year he received his bachelor of arts degree in mathematics. He also received his master's and doctorate from Texas A&M.

He has taught chemistry at Tarleton State, South Texas College and Texas

Southern University and in addition to his duties as professor, he has served as consulting toxicologist in San Angelo, Austin and College Station for various organizations.

Dr. Carlo has been active in civic affairs in San Angelo and has written numerous articles. In 1971, he was named one of the Outstanding Young Men in America and has won numerous other honors.

Baccalaureate services will be held Sunday in the auditorium, beginning at 8 p.m. Rev. Wayne Shuffield, pastor of the First Baptist Church of Baird, will bring the message.

## NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN BY CALLAHAN COUNTY OF ITS RENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Landlords and persons who live in rental property are urged to contact the Housing Authority of Callahan County concerning participation in a program designed to assist our citizens to secure decent, safe, and sanitary housing.

The program benefits landlords and owners by providing financial assistance during vacancy and certain depository and damage guarantees. The program aids eligible renters by providing financial assistance on the basis of need.

Persons that wish to apply for rent assistance must make application for eligibility and subsequently provide proof of income. Applicants must be a family or head of household. If an individual applies he or she must be 62 years of age or handicapped or disabled.

Cost of housing occupied by the applicant must be within the limits set forth in a fair market rent schedule. Fair Market rents are based on standard market housing, however any standard unit falling within the Fair Market schedule is eligible.

Participation in the rent assistance program is voluntary on the part of owners/landlords and renters.

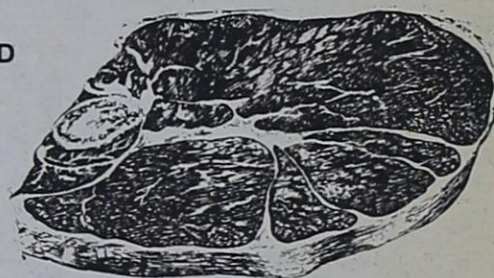

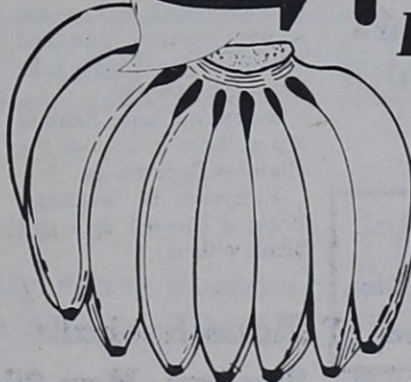

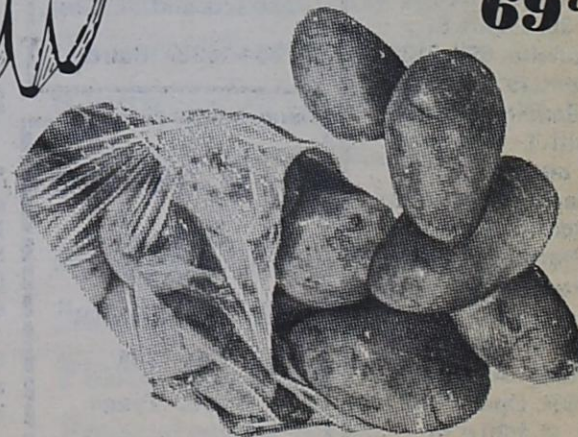

Everyone is welcome. Bring a covered dish and picnic with us.

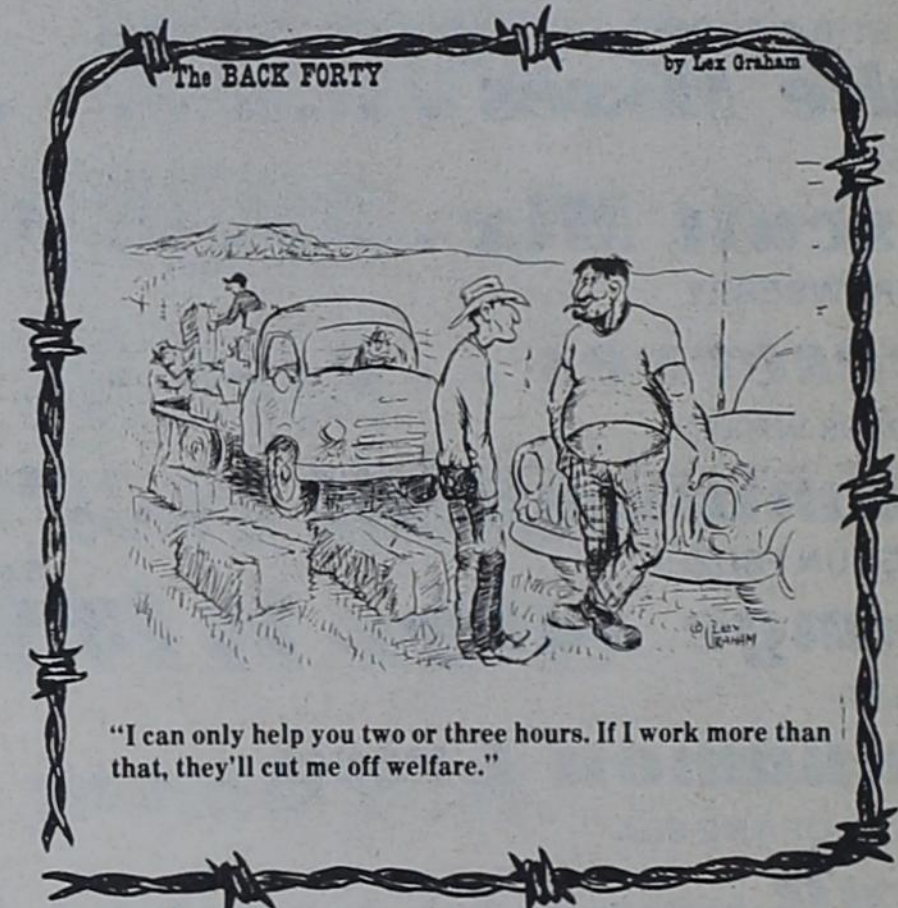

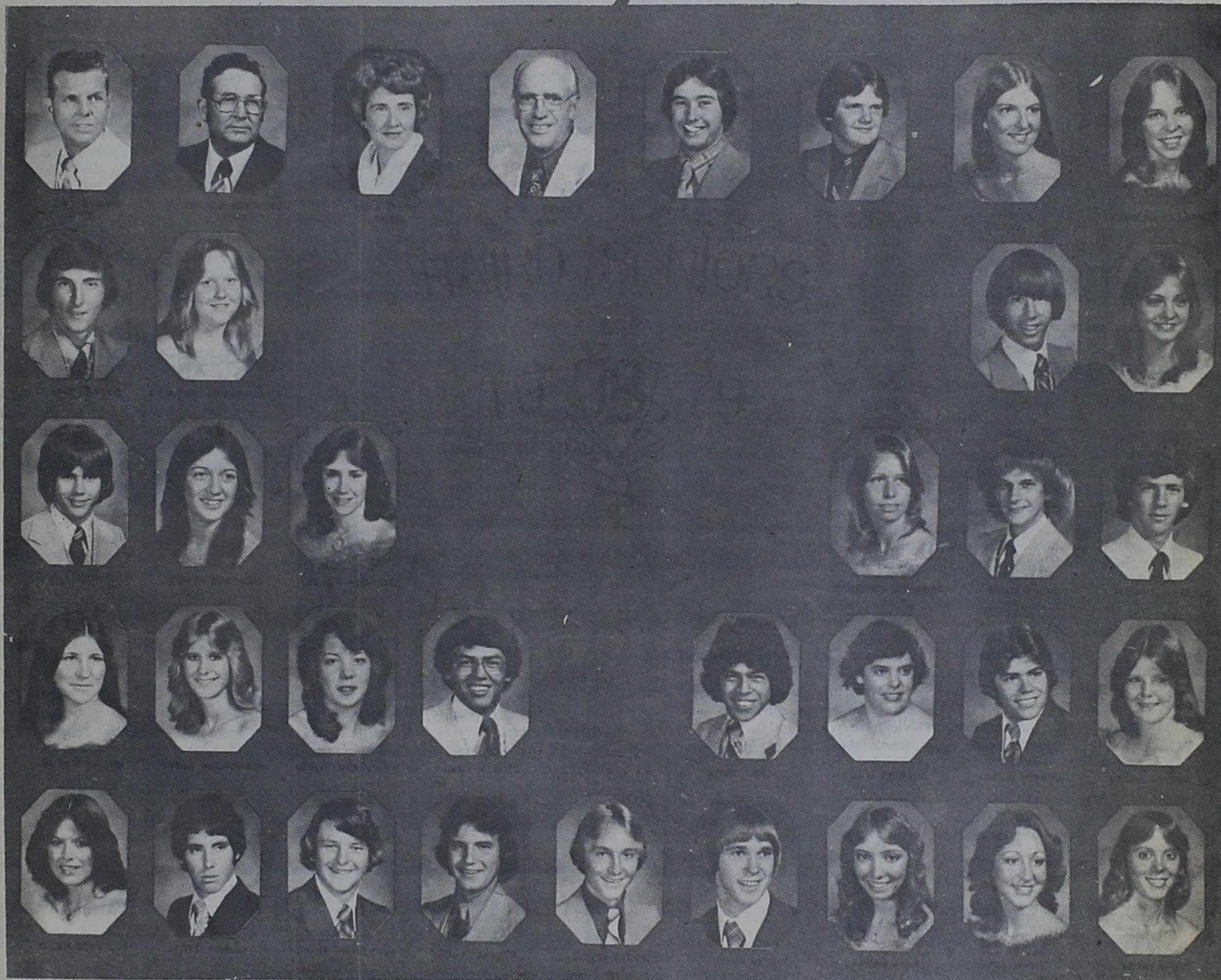
