Oven 325 Degrees 10-inch Tube Pan

In large mixer bowl, cream butter and dry frosting mix at medium speed, until light and fluffy, about 5 minutes. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each. Gradually beat in flour and baking powder. In a small mixing bowl, combine 5 cups batter with poppy seed filling; blend well. Spread half of plain batter over bottom of greased 10-inch tube pan. Then alternately add spoonfuls of poppy seed batter and remaining plain batter.

Bake at 325 degrees for 1 hour and 30 minutes to 1 hour and 45 minutes. Cool cake in pan 15 minutes before removing. Cool completely. Sprinkle with confectioners' sugar or drizzle with glaze.

Gloss: Combine 1 cup confectioners' sugar with 2 tablespoons milk or lemon juice.  
\* Soft-Rising flour is not recommended for use in this recipe.
