BIRTHDAY PARTY

On the second Anniversary of the beginning of the Korean "police action," there appeared to be a faint hope that Major General William K. Harrison, chief Allied truce negotiator had shaken the enemy's composure and his stubborn insistence on repatriation of Communist prisoners.

In replying to General Harrison's observation that the Russians in World War II had twice given German prisoners their choice of countries, North Korean General Nam II retorted that the instances were "out of place" since the Russians were victors and the UN forces are not. "I must remind you," he said, "that your way of speaking, as if your side was a victor, is a great insult to our side . . . I demand your side withdraw such insolent statements."

Harrison then calmly advised Nam to stop making "demands." "The word has no significance," he pointed out, "if it can't be enforced by military power."

And with the memory of the Allied mass bombing of the Yalu River power plants on the day before so fresh in Communists' minds the UN spokesman seems to have made his point.

This anniversary session at Panmunjom might indicate too, that it's quite difficult to convince an enemy without putting him first at some disadvantage.

Victory for Everybody—Almost

By the time you read this, price and wage controls may be a memory. A roll call vote of 210-182 in the House last Thursday made this a practical certainty, since it was felt that a conference committee could speedily iron out the differences between the House and Senate versions.

The principal mourners, we think, will be the Administration leaders. The thousands of Federal employes who operated the controls machinery will, no doubt, be quickly and quietly sucked into other Government bureaus in the New Deal—Fair Deal tradition. But even so, the savings to the national economy will be enormous. Business, which has been forced to spend fabulous sums in compiling and maintaining the required data, may now be able to devote more of its efforts to its own affairs. And whenever business efficiency can be improved, the consumer wins.

Here's A Fad Everybody Likes

We seem to remember when a run in a stocking—especially one of those slinky nylons—was considered a minor disaster. And now, we learn, nylons-with-runs are treasured more than those without. You might say there is a run on runs.

How come? So the gentler sex can turn their damaged hosiery into flowers! That's right, nylon flowers . . . for corsages and boutonnières, for trimming hats, for hair ornaments and for dressing up gift packages . . . are being made like mad from cast-off, re-dyed nylon stockings.

Coal Works For The Farmer

A chemical concern has just announced a new and powerful insecticide that may save farmers millions of dollars worth of crops each year. The insecticide works on a novel principal. It is absorbed directly by the plants and makes their leaves, roots, stems and flowers poisonous to the bugs that feed on them. It is designed especially to rid plants of such destructive insects as aphids, mites, certain members of the prolific beetle family, and the European corn borer.

If you were to take a poll asking from what substance this—and many other valuable chemical products—is derived, not one person in thousands could give the right answer. For the substance is coal—that heavy black stuff which most of us still think, quite erroneously, is useful only for heating. And from coal has come DDT, the effective weed-killer, 2, 4-D, along with chemicals that form the basis for livestock feeds and fertilizers that increase yields.

Coal serves the farmer in many ways, direct and indirect. It is widely used as a domestic farm fuel. It is the basis of the steel that makes today's efficient farming machinery—and it is the source of most of our electricity. Coal has been called, with accuracy, an almost unlimited storehouse of wonders. It has helped greatly in making life better for the farmer—and all the rest of us, too.

Grass On Vacant Lots Is Hazard For Neighbors

People owning vacant lots in Burkburnett, are in many cases, working a distinct hardship on home owners of adjoining property, by permitting grass and weeds to grow rampant on the vacant lots.

Home owners take pride in the appearance of their yards, but the job of keeping them neat and free from Johnson grass is made very difficult if a vacant lot next door has grass two or three feet high. Aside from the extra work involved on the part of the home owner, he is faced with a health hazard presented by mosquitos and other insects which find favorable breeding conditions in tall grass and weeds.

In most instances, owners of vacant lots have not realized their neglect was causing someone else inconveniences, and in lots of instances, hardships. If vacant lot owners will see that the lots are kept mowed or plowed, they will have the undying gratitude of neighbors living on adjoining property.

Texas Teachers Rank 5th In Nation In Preparation

Despite the fact that Texas teachers have not had an increase in their base salaries since 1949, they have continued to improve their professional training. They now rank among the five top states in the nation in teacher preparation, according to Charles H. Tennyson, executive secretary of the Texas State Teachers Association.

Water and Old Age Pensions Topic of Teachers

Obtaining more water for Southwest industrialization and old-age security were among the problems considered by Texas teachers attending a Workshop in Economic Education at the University of Texas.

"A long range, well integrated water policy is particularly important," Dr. John R. Stockton, University Bureau of Business Research director, emphasized in outlining trends and problems in the Southwest economy.

The western half of the state is short of water, while the eastern half needs better provisions for using the water it has, Dr. Stockton explained. Texas has progressed from a state which merely produced raw materials, through a period of developing industry to process those raw materials, and now is entering a third stage—a "more mature" manufacturing economy, Dr. Stockton said.
