COUNTY LAWYERS STILL UNABLE TO IDENTIFY BODY

Callahan County authorities are back to zero in their attempt to identify the body of a man found May 13 in the southwestern part of the County.

Sheriff Bill Skinner went to Rusk State Hospital in East Texas and a Dallas crime lab in an effort to identify the man. However the effort didn't work.

While at Rusk State Hospital, Sheriff Bill Skinner obtained some medical records that may be helpful but are still

confidential.

The Dallas crime lab has been comparing medical and dental records with records of several missing persons.

The body has been kept at the lab after an autopsy. A road crew found the body 12 miles southeast of Abilene and one mile south of Highway 36. The dead man was clothed, but carried no identification and only 3 cents in his pockets.

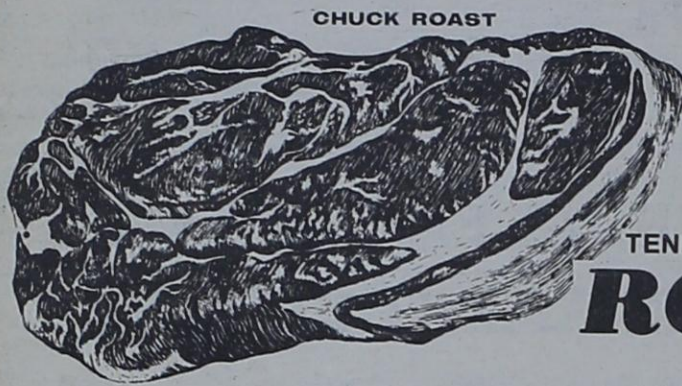

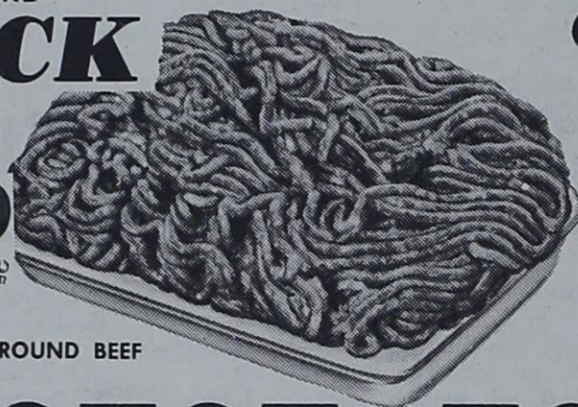

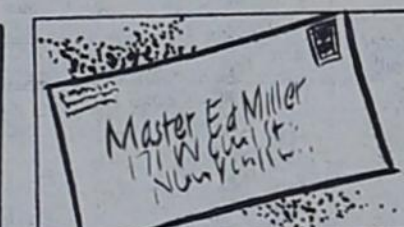

Brother of Localite Judson Atchison: All American

Judson Atchison carries his 63 years well. Just looking at this soft spoken insurance man, one would never suspect that between 1934 and 1939 he was an All-American halfback on the University of Texas' football team, ran sprints on the track team and participated in the long jump and was on the NCAA Track Honor Roll three years in a row.

Where most folks with even a claim to fame would trumpet themselves into their own personal limelight, Jud maintains a sense of modesty and perspective quite becoming in this age of hustle and type.

In the days of the Notre Dame box and the single wing, Jud played left halfback. When transcribed into contemporary football terms, it is equivalent to the tail back position at USC. It is the premier position. At six feet and 175 pounds, he was big by the standards of the day. He could run the 100 yard dash in 9.6 seconds which was considerably faster than any of his contemporaries in the Southwest Conference at the time.

Equally proficient in track and field, Jud ran in the sprint and sprint relay teams and competed in the long jump. With his jump of 24'9½", he won the 1939 NCAA collegiate competition. Max Gordon
