## Rick Moeller to head Paint Creek ISD

Paint Creek School will have a change in leadership, as they begin a new school year. After forty-three years in education, including eleven years as superintendent of the school district, Don Ballard has retired. Stepping up to take the reins is Rick Moeller, a very familiar face in this area.

The son of Ernest and Zella Moeller, Rick was born and raised in Haskell. After graduating from Haskell High School in 1984, he attended Howard County Junior College and then Tarleton State University, graduating in 1988 with a Bachelor of Science in Agricultural Science.

He began his first Ag Science job in January 1989 at Munday High School. It was a good fit, and he spent the next fifteen years in that capacity. After completing

requirements for a Master's Degree in Mid Management Administration at Texas Women's University, he served as principal at Munday Elementary for a year.

The next stop in his career was at Alvarado High School, where he taught Ag Science. Deciding the big city traffic was not for him, he moved back to Knox City and taught Ag Science for two years, before becoming high school principal for the next seven years.

Moeller seized upon the opportunity to work toward his superintendent's certification through the Region XIV Education Service Center's Alternative Superintendent Certification Program. After passing certification testing in March, he completed the program in July 2014.

Moeller and his wife Kristi, who will teach 5th grade at Paint Creek, are excited about this new opportunity. Feeling that it is important to live in the community where they work, the Moellers will soon be moving to Paint Creek.

Their family includes Lynndy and husband L.P. Adams and son Kaven of Haskell, Bandy and wife Xalee and daughter Xander of Kermit, and Tanna who is attending Western Texas College in Snyder.

Moeller has some new ideas he would like

to eventually implement, but knows he needs to evaluate the things that are working well, before making changes.

While continuing to meet the goals and requirements of the state is a priority, Moeller also feels strongly that learning should be fun and teaching should be enjoyable. To that end he wants to encourage students and teachers to try new things, to think "outside the box" and to

find that special quality in every child and build on it. Moeller is very aware of the advantages many students reap from attending a small school, but he is intent on preparing them for a future which will require them to compete in college and the work force with graduates of much larger schools.

Moeller says his door is always open and he looks forward to the task as he begins this new chapter in his career.

## City of Rule sets cleanup week

## Special senate election set Sept. 9

Governor Rick Perry has called for a special election to fill the unexpired seat of Senator Robert Duncan, who earlier resigned his position to serve as Chancellor of the Texas Tech University System.

The special election, set for September 9, is designed to give District 28, encompassing some forty-six counties, senate representation at the beginning of the 2015 legislative session.

County Clerk Belia Abila announced that early voting for Haskell County will take place Monday, August 25 through Friday, September 5. Early voting will be from 8:30 a.m. to 12 noon, and 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. in room 9 on the west end of the Haskell County Courthouse.

On Tuesday, September 9, between the hours of 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. registered voters will cast their ballots at the polling place designated for the precinct in which they live. These include Precinct 1, St. George's Catholic Church; Precinct 2, Assembly of God Church; Precinct 3, Extension Office; and Precinct 4, Experienced Citizens' Center.

Six candidates filed to run for the remainder of Senator Duncan's term, which expires in 2017. Placing their names on the ballot are republicans Jodey Arrington, former Tech Vice Chancellor; Wolfforth resident E.M. Garza; former state representative Dalwin Jones; and state representative Charles Perry. Also seeking the senate seat are former Sweetwater mayor and democrat Gregg Wortham, as well as Libertarian party candidate Kerry McKennon.

It is important to be informed and go vote.

## Aug. sales tax receipts show small increases

Texas Comptroller Susan Combs said that state sales tax revenue in July was \$2.34 billion, up 6.3 percent compared to July 2013.

"The growth in sales tax revenues reflected strength in both business and consumer spending," Combs said. "The increase was led by remittances from the construction, services, and oil and natural gas-related sectors, as well as from retail trade and restaurants. Fiscal year-to-date, state sales tax collections are now up 5.3 percent."

Combs will send cities, counties, transit systems and special purpose taxing districts their August local sales tax allocations totaling \$706.9 million, up 5.3 percent compared to August 2013.

The sales tax figures represent monthly sales made in June as well as April, May and June sales by businesses that report tax quarterly.

Haskell County had a 1.70 percent increase for August 2014 of \$50,409.89 in comparison to \$49,566.61 for August 2013. 2014 payments to date of \$387,432.201 reflect a 5.95 percent increase over 2013 payments to date of \$365,665.61.

The City of Haskell had an .86 percent increase for

August 2014 of \$45,747.38 in comparison to \$45,353.84 for August 2013. 2014 payments to date of \$358,497.49 reflect a 4.88 percent increase over 2013 payments to date of \$341,785.31.

The City of O'Brien had a 13.59 percent decrease for August 2014 of \$274.75 in comparison to \$317.97 for August 2013. 2014 payments to date of \$2,490.25 reflect a 7.02 percent increase over 2013 payments to date of \$2,326.78.

The City of Rochester had a 34.24 percent increase for August 2014 of \$728.77 in comparison to \$542.86 for August 2013. 2014 payments to date of \$4,727.74 reflect a 39.45 percent increase over 2013 payments to date of \$3,390.10.

The City of Rule had a 5.03 percent increase for August 2014 of \$3,231.83 in comparison to \$3,076.99 for August 2013. 2014 payments to date of \$19,338.78 reflect a 19.72 percent increase over 2013 payments to date of \$16,152.73.

The City of Weinert had a 55.35 percent increase for August 2014 of \$427.16 in comparison to \$274.95 for August 2013. 2014 payments to date of 2,377.94 reflect an 18.26 percent increase over 2013 payments to date of \$2,010.69.

#### Grand jury indicts governor on 2 counts

AUSTIN—A Travis County grand jury on Aug. 15 indicted Gov. Rick Perry on two felony counts: abuse of official capacity and coercion of a public servant.

Count I alleges Perry, on or about June 14, 2013, intended to harm Rosemary Lehmborg, Travis County district attorney and chief of the state's Public Integrity Unit, by intentionally or knowingly misusing public property in withholding funding approved by the Texas Legislature for the operation of the Public Integrity Unit.

Count II alleges Perry by means of coercion and in his official capacity as a public servant threatened to veto legislation funding the Public Integrity Unit unless Lehmborg resigned as district attorney.

Lehmborg was arrested for drunken driving in April 2013. She served a short jail sentence, publicly apologized, underwent counseling and returned to her elected post as district attorney and chief of the Public Integrity Unit, a division of the district attorney's office that investigates and prosecutes criminal activity involving state government and state government officials.

Lehmborg refused to resign. Perry reacted with a line-item veto of the funding approved for the Public Integrity Unit (\$7.5 million) in the state's 2014-2015 general appropriations bill, SB 1. Perry explained the veto this way: "Despite the otherwise good work the Public Integrity Unit's employees, I cannot in good conscience support continued State funding for an office with statewide jurisdiction at a time when the person charged with ultimate responsibility of that unit has lost the public's confidence. This unit is in no other way held accountable to state taxpayers, except through the State budgetary process. I therefore object to and disapprove of this appropriation."

Mary Anne Wiley, general counsel for Perry, issued a statement saying, "The veto in question was made in accordance with the veto authority afforded to every governor under the Texas Constitution. We will continue to aggressively defend the governor's lawful and constitutional action, and believe we will ultimately prevail."

**Panel votes for censure**  
The House Select Committee on Transparency in State Agency Operations on Aug. 11 met and voted 6-1 to admonish and censure University of Texas System Board of Regents member Wallace L. Hall Jr. of Dallas "for misconduct, incompetency

in the performance of official duties, or behavior unbecoming a nominee for and holder of a state office." State Rep. Charles Perry, R-Lubbock, voted against the action.

Hall, who was appointed as a regent by Gov. Perry in 2011, reportedly has been conducting an independent investigation of UT's fundraising and other activities. Allegations against Hall are detailed in a motion 28 pages in length.

The motion also directs two members of the committee, state Reps. Lyle Larson, R-San Antonio, and Trey Martinez-Fischer, D-San Antonio, to monitor the Board of Regents of The University of Texas System, The University of Texas System and The University of Texas System component institutions.

**Notes get highest ratings**

These annual, one-year notes, Combs explained, are sold to help fund school payments and manage cash flow between the start of the fiscal year and the arrival of tax revenue later in the year.

Combs said the ratings reflect confidence in Texas and its economic growth. The state's sale of \$5.4 billion in Tax and Revenue Anticipation Notes will be conducted Aug. 26 with repayment scheduled Aug. 31, 2015, she added.

**Economy adds jobs in July**  
Texas Workforce Commission on Aug. 15 announced the state's economy added 46,600 seasonally adjusted non-farm jobs in the month of July and the unemployment rate was 5.1 percent in July, while the national unemployment rate was 6.2 percent.

Texas employers have added 396,200 jobs over the last year, a 3.5 percent annual growth rate, said Andres Alcantar, chair of Texas Workforce Commission. "The Texas economic engine is strong, with every major industry posting positive annual growth in July," Alcantar added.

Also, all of the major industries in Texas expanded during July, with professional and business services adding 10,600 jobs in the month.

Christi Craddock of Midland on Aug. 12 was elected chair of the three-member Texas Railroad Commission, the state agency that oversees the regulation of the oil and gas industry. She succeeds fellow member Barry Smitherman at the post.

## Back to school safety tips for motorists and kids

Seems like summer is just starting to really heat up in Texas, yet it is almost time for children to go back to school. Soon motorists will be sharing the roads with school buses, children walking or on bicycles, and even lots of new teen drivers taking their first car to school. Drivers need to be vigilant because school children can be very unpredictable. They're easily distracted and can often run into traffic or out from behind parked cars. Looking out for children rather than expecting them to look out for us is our best defense as drivers.

Last year in Texas, there were 625 vehicle crashes in school zones resulting in two deaths and 112 serious injuries. The most common factors contributing to these crashes were driver inattention, failure to control speed, and failure to yield the right-of-way at stop signs.

Whether your oldest is just starting kindergarten or taking that first trip to school

in his or her own car, parents can play an important role in keeping their children safe.

For young children, make sure they know the rules about school bus safety when it comes to boarding and getting off the bus. If you are transporting children to school, remember that children under 13 should always ride in the back seat in a car seat (including a booster) or seat belt depending on whether they fit properly in the seat belt. Teen drivers and their parents should be aware of the Texas Graduated Driver License Law and the restrictions it puts in place, including no cell phone use and no more than one passenger under 21 in the vehicle unless the passenger is related to the driver. And, most importantly, always stress buckling up on every trip—even on those short trips to and from school!

DaLinda Black, Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service agent in Haskell County, reminds drivers to follow these safety tips from the Texas Department of

Transportation to prevent needless tragedies.

#### Tips for Driving in School Zones

Put away your cell phone. Cell phone use is banned in active school zones, and violators face fines of up to \$200 in school zones where signs are posted.

Always obey school zone speed limit signs. Remember, traffic fines usually double in school zones.

Drop off and pick up your children in your school's designated areas, not the middle of the street.

Keep an eye on children gathered at bus stops.

Be alert for children who might dart across the street or between vehicles on their way to school.

#### Tips for Bicyclists

As a bicyclist, you should obey all traffic laws, including the following:

Stop at red lights and stop signs.

Pay attention to lane markers.

Ride near the curb, traveling in the same direction as traffic.

Use a light on the front and a red reflector or red light on the back of your bike while riding at night.

#### Tips for Pedestrians

When there is a sidewalk, use it! Most pedestrian traffic accidents happen when someone is walking in the roadway.

Always cross at intersections. Look left, then right, then left again before proceeding.

Look for traffic when stepping off a bus or from behind parked cars.

As a passenger, get in or out of a car on the curb side of the street.

Make eye contact with drivers before you cross the street.

Motorists can make a big difference by remembering to drive with extra caution when driving in and around school zones. Your slower speed and extra attention may very well save a life!

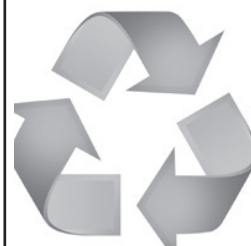

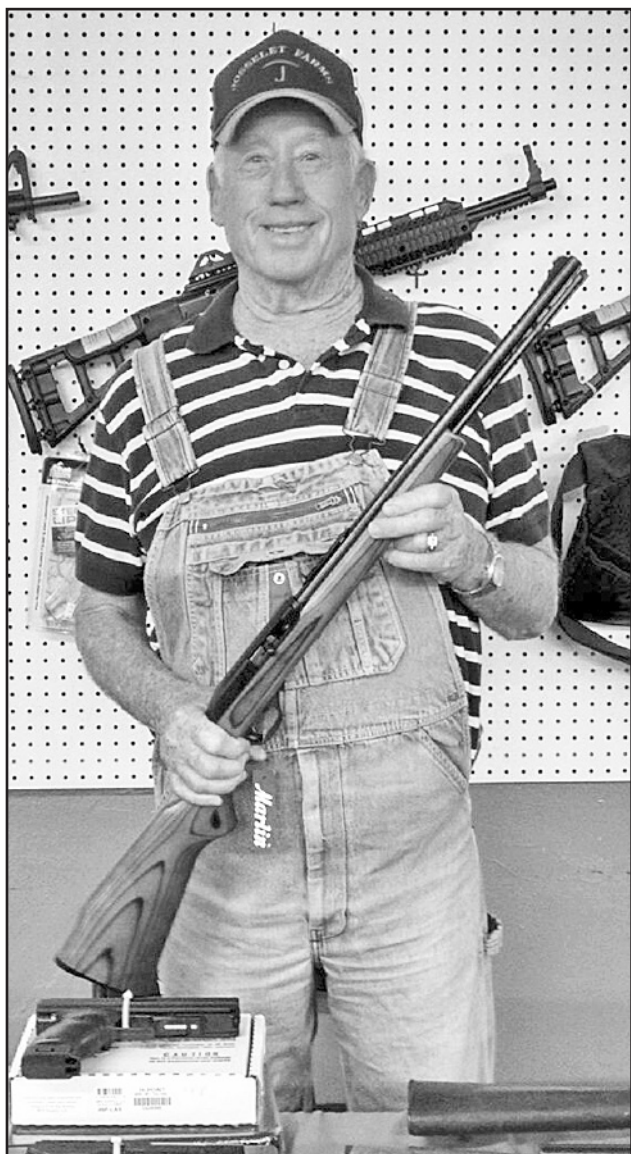

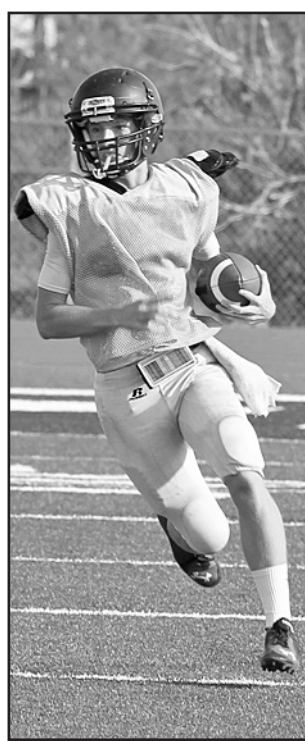

The six month old son of Casey and Heather (Steele) Riley, both graduates of Haskell High School, passed away in March 2010, after being diagnosed with hypertrophic cardiomyopathy.

While there are variations of cardiomyopathy, it generally causes an enlarged heart. It is estimated that 30,000 children have this disease. This "silent disease" is the leading cause of sudden deaths and heart transplants in children under the age of 18. Because the disease may present itself without obvious symptoms, it often goes undiagnosed.

All proceeds go to the

Children's Cardiomyopathy Foundation and families affected by the disease. Since its beginning in 2002, the CCF, a non-profit organization, has grown into a global community of families, physicians and scientists focused on improving diagnosis, treatment and quality of life for children with cardiomyopathy. CCF is involved in all aspects of the disease from research and education to patient support, awareness and advocacy. Nearly \$1.6 million has been committed to research. The Foundation's hope for the future is that more lives will be saved and every affected child will have a chance to live a full and active life.

Searching for a way to honor and remember their precious son, the Rileys in 2010 organized a fund-raiser to help raise awareness of this disease.
