# Let's Keep the Record Straight

At a political rally held in Fulton Wednesday night two orators made a few insinuations concerning the policy Copano Bay, 9 miles north of of The Rockport Pilot. Since the copy was not a reprint of an article that he claimed appeared in another newspaper and since there were two references to a building and a night club in Corpus Christi Milton Jackson No. 1 expects in which the names of the building and the night club were mentioned in connection with gambling raids, The Pilot was of the opinion that the articles were libelous. The candidate was contacted and he was told that the article could be run in The Pilot but that the names of the building and night club would have to be omitted. These omissions would not in any way affect the meaning of the advertisement, but would relieve The Pilot of any possible libel suits.

The candidate refused to run the ad unless it was run exactly as he wanted it.

# First Cargo Of Oil Barged Out Of Rockport Tues.

Tuesday, for the first time since hides and tallow were shipped from Rockport back in the 1860's and 70's, a cargo left the port. This time it was a cargo of oil which went out by barge. 13,000 barrels of oil were loaded on two tankers, 6,500 barrels on each, to be carried by barge down the intercoastal canal to the re-Co. at Sweeney, Texas. The oil was loaded out by the Herbert oil in the Fulton Beach Field.

The volume of cargo was estimated at \$40,000 worth. The loadng rack is located off State Highway 35, south of the causeway in Copano Bay.

Hide and tallow packeries were established here in the late 1860's Ramo Oil Co. and early 70's. # Parks Need More Than Equipment

How do other cities manage to maintain their public parks and playgrounds? The proper authorities (though it is difficult to establish just who they are) could do well to investigate and perhaps follow the example set by those who maintain clean, if not elaborate, parks.

In the spring the city council turned over to the Chamber of Commerce a sum of money to purchase playground Precinct No. 1: equipment for the triangle. While this equipment is not yet available, the Chamber went ahead and provided shade arbors with picnic tables and benches and two shuffle boards for the use of the public.

At the time the decision was made to place this equipment there, the Navigation Board informed the parties involved that they had a new power lawn mower and that this mower was available that the grounds might be taken

Since that time the boards have been laid and painted Precinct No. 3: and the tables placed under the arbors. Meanwhile the burrs have grown up in the grass and the weeds around the boards until the triangle is not an attractive place to induce passersby to stop and enjoy the facilities provided for them. The triangle does not look like a park with new equipment added but more like an old park abandoned.

It is no wonder that organizations soon lose interest in providing facilities for the public benefit. Can any organization be expected to purchase the supplies and see that they are installed and in return for providing these facilities be held responsible for the care of the lots.

The city officials have ample reason to be discouraged from entering into another such project when so little effort has been exerted to keep up the property where they made it possible for improvements to be made.

Those in the Chamber of Commerce who devoted their time and efforts to carry out the endeavor have reason to be discouraged from repeating it in the future.

The attempt to beautify the city and provide new recreational facilities for the people can very well fail if some arrangement cannot be reached to provide for caring for the upkeep of the grounds. Cannot some solution be reached whereby the efforts of the men and the expenditures made be compensated by keeping the grounds in condition so that the facilities can serve the purpose for which they were provided?

An attractive park is an asset to any city, though it provides only beauty. We have an ideal location for the park with the addition of recreational facilities. As it stands now the organizations have ample reason to be discouraged from making further improvements, if no one is interested in seeing that the grounds are cared for.







to be appropriated, before the tax

can be levied. Unless the 1948 ad valorem tax is assessed, the cities indebted for sea walls, waterfront improvements and river levees will be forced to assess the city property owners to pay the bonded indebtedness which was incurred by the promise of the 46th Legislature by House Bill 180, extended by H. B. 91 in July 1939, extending the period of 20 years the donating of the net amounts of state ad valorem taxes, the proceeds to be used in constructing seawalls, breakwaters and shore protection for coastal and river front cities.

The \$145,000 bond issue was passed in Rockport for the seawall here on the basis of the State's promise to donate to the city the net amounts of the state ad valorem taxes on all property and from all persons owning property in Aransas County, for the purpose of aiding the city in paying the interest and creating a sinking fund upon an issue or issues of bonds, the proceeds of which are to be used in seawalls, breakwaters and shore protection for the City of Rockport.
