Aransas County Has 113 Social Security Insurance Beneficiaries

At the end of the last fiscal year, 113 persons in Aransas County were receiving monthly payments of retirement or family insurance under the Social Security Act. The payments totaled \$1,882 a month according to a report just received from H. M. Cleveland, manager of the Corpus Christi office of the Social Security Administration.

This is one of the seventeen counties which are served by the Corpus Christi office.

In Texas, 72,577 beneficiaries were receiving old age and survivors insurance amounting to \$1,244,757 a month as of July 1, 1949, Cleveland's statement shows.

At the same time, benefits for the nation were being paid at the rate of \$51,520,000 a month to 2,554,248 retired workers, their wives, widows, children, and parents.

As explained by Cleveland, workers contribute to the cost of the government insurance system through payroll deductions from their wages. The benefits are also related to each employee's earnings for work done on jobs covered by the law during his working lifetime.

The insurance is paid as a matter of right to those who qualify, but it was intended that the payments should provide only for the basic necessities of life. Therefore, Cleveland said, families are encouraged to save and invest so

Kingsville Ready For An Attendance of 125,000 at Exposition

Kingsville is in the midst of last minute preparations to receive over 125,000 visitors expected to attend the annual South Texas Fair and Exposition which opens there Tuesday, Nov. 8 and runs through Sunday, Nov. 13.

The fair ground gates will swing open at 1 p. m. Tuesday and 15 minutes later a gigantic parade will begin its colorful route through the downtown streets of Kingsville. Governor Allan Shivers, the fair's opening day guest of honor, will lead the procession which will feature a dozen beautiful floats and many bands from South Texas high schools.

Immediately after the parade, thousands of fair-goers will flock to the fair grounds to get their first glimpse of the great agricultural, industrial and educational exhibits on display there by 25 progressive Texas counties.

The Bill Hames Greater Railroad Show and Midway will sprawl over one of the many acres of concrete on the deactivated Naval Air Station (Texas A&I's East Campus) where the fair and exposition makes its home this year. No admission will be charged for entrance to the midway.

During the morning judging of the great livestock exhibits will begin. There'll be exhibits of beef and dairy cattle, swine, sheep and poultry, and a big quarter horse show.

In the spacious commercial and industrial show building will be found spectacular exhibits of South Texas industries. From the stage, located strategically among the exhibits, concerts by South Texas high school bands and musical shows by Denny Beckner and his Madcap Merry Makers will be heard daily.

Gigantic pyrotechnical displays will be seen as the Paramount Fireworks Co. presents its show on the fair grounds at 9 p. m. nightly.

Bus tours of the famous King Ranch will originate from the fair grounds five times daily. The president's ball will be held in the big danceteria on the fair grounds Nov. 11 at 9 p. m. and a great western dance will be presented on the night of Nov. 12. Over a thousand South Texas square dancers will stage a big square dance at 8 p. m. on the opening night of the fair.

Nov. 10, 11, and 12 are the days of the National Intercollegiate Rodeo which will be staged in a new arena at the fair. College and university teams from Texas and Oklahoma will present the first college rodeo ever to be held in South Texas.

Air shows by the famous Navy Blue Angels, the U. S. Air Force and the Air National Guard will be presented this year in the greatest displays of aerial acrobatics ever to be seen in this section of the country.

ficers of the companies as soon as we obtain their identities," the assistant district attorney declared.

For this purpose, he said, the district attorney's office has requested from the Texas secretary of state certified copies of the charters of all of the companies involved that are incorporated, showing the names of the officers and the amount of the capitalization.

"We are requesting that all persons who have complaints against Delta Builders, Inc., Delta Surplus Building Co., Coastal Credit Building Co., Inc. or any of their associated companies to be present at the court of inquiry."

He emphasized that he wanted those persons who dealt with the companies to appear in person and to bring with them "any instruments, documents, contracts, specifications, canceled checks, receipts or releases pertaining to their complaints."

Cook Pork Thoroughly To Prevent Trichinosis

"Please pass the pork" is a familiar sentence around many dinner tables these days, as cold weather approaches. A juicy roast pork or pork chops are dishes that can't be beat, according to many connoisseurs of meat. However, pork can be dangerous if it isn't cooked long enough. So, be sure that pork passes the test of thorough cooking before you put it on the table. Otherwise, trichinosis may result, says Dr. George W. Cox, state health officer.

Trichinosis is a big word, but the disease is easy to prevent. All you need to do is cook the meat until the pink color turns to white. When the change of color occurs, the meat is safe to eat. Farmers who raise hogs for sale as meat, and who feed them garbage, should cook the garbage first, or the meat may become contaminated. If butchered pork is stored at a temperature of five degrees above zero, Fahrenheit, for 20 days, trichinosis parasites should die, if there are any.

If a person eats a pork chop, for example, that contains trichinae, they are swallowed in the form of tiny capsules. In the intestines these capsules develop and discharge minute worms which are carried by the bloodstream to various parts of the body... settling in muscles, where after a period of time they become calcified and die.

What are the symptoms of trichinosis? Stomach upsets and muscular pains, a feeling of chilliness, sore throat, and sometimes considerable fever, are some of the signs. An acute attack of the illness lasts about one or two weeks. The disease has a low death rate, but recovery is fairly slow.
