Renwar Slates Wildcat; Opener Finals

Renwar Oil Corp. has scheduled a deep wildcat 5 1/2 miles west of Rockport.

The firm's No. 1 United Carbon Co. is permitted to 9,000 feet and will be 330 feet from the north and 660 from the west lines of a 180-acre lease in I. Gilliland Survey, A-71. Ground elevation is five feet.

Renwar has offset acreage to south and west on the R. A. Kubena, to the southwest on the M. J. Anderson, and to the south on the R. McDonhie. Magnolia has a lease to the north.

Mazie Wrather No. 1 Live Oak Apartments, new well in the East Fulton Beach Field, one mile north of Fulton, has been completed as a discovery for the D-1 Sand in the field.

Daily flow has been gauged at 80.4 barrels of 44.6 gravity pipeline oil daily from 24 perforations at 7,467-71 feet, with 5 1/2 inch casing set at 7,358 feet. Total depth is 7,862 feet.

Gas-oil ratio was 4,570-1 and tubing pressure was 1,600 pounds with 7/64 inch choke. Location is in Lot 2, A. L. Bachman subdivision of Outlot 7, Fulton Townsite, in W. W. Carper Survey, A-47.

Union Producing Co. No. 10 Taton, wildcat nine miles north of Lamar, was running electric log at 9,775 feet. The projected 10,000-foot test is in J. M. Shreve Survey, A-186.

Arkansas Fuel Oil Corp. No. 1 State Tract 4, wildcat five miles north-northwest of Aransas Pass, was drilling below 5,056 feet in shale.

The test is being directionally drilled from a surface location in block 58, McCampbell subdivision, James Orick Survey, A-167. Whipstock has been set at 3,996 feet and 4,138 feet. Bottomhole target is about 630 feet north of the surface location in Puerto Bay.

A. B. Williams No. 1 A. B. Williams, slated 8,000 foot test in the East Fulton Beach Field, one mile north of Fulton, will be drilled as an exception to Rule 37 on a 1.72-acre lease in Block 88, Fulton Townsite. Location will be 50 feet from the north and 125 feet from the west lines of Block 88.

Need For Blood Continues Unabated

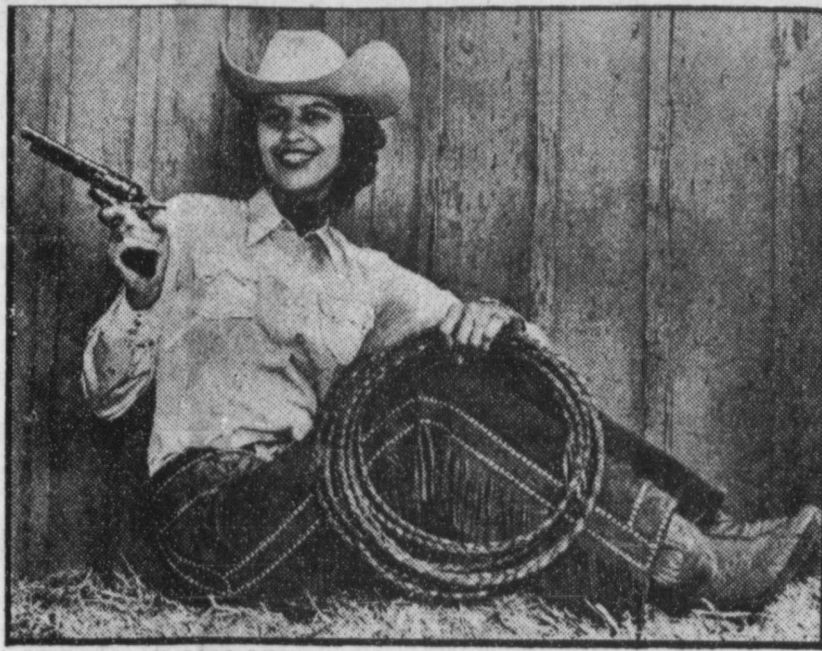

City Now Using New Dump Ground

This truck was able to pick up in one load the garbage that has been requiring at least five loads with the present truck that is being used. Due to the efficient operation, the Pak-Mor truck completed the job in four hours, as against the usual eight hours required.

At the City Council meeting held Tuesday, it was decided to accept bids on a garbage disposal truck similar to the one demonstrated.

As soon as the new grounds are officially opened, the old site will be closed and dumping there prohibited. Appropriate signs will be placed so that persons desiring to use the new dump may locate it easily.

The alley or street north of the postoffice has been designated as a one-way street, with entrance on Magnolia Street, running east to Austin Street. As soon as they can be obtained, the necessary signs will be placed.

The fence erected by residents on Water Street in the south end of the city has been removed. Contemplated action by the council should remedy the situation that has risen.

Legislature Creates Small Claims Court

House Bill No. 495 passed by the 53rd Legislature creates a Small Claims Court and provides that Justices of the Peace shall be judges of such courts. Amounts involved shall not exceed \$50, except in claims for labor which shall not exceed \$100, exclusive of costs.

Such claims shall be for money only and may be filed directly with the local justice. In no case may the claim be filed by an assignee, nor by a person, partnership, firm, association or corporation engaged primarily or secondarily in lending money at interest, nor by a collection agency or collection agent, provided however, that nothing in the said act shall prohibit the bringing of any action by a legal heir or heirs.

All laws or parts of laws in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of said conflict. Here in Rockport, all claims in equal or less than the amounts stated, may be filed in Judge C. O. Bailey's court after Aug. 26, on which date the law becomes effective.

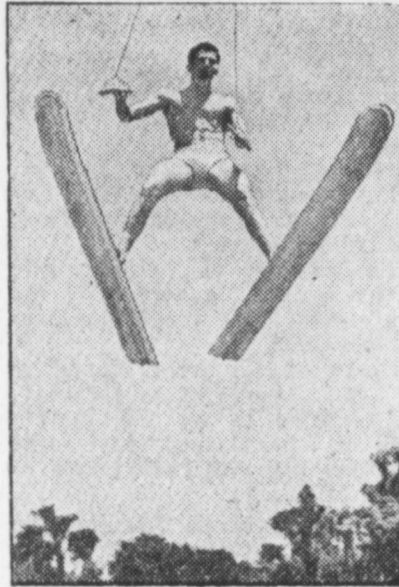

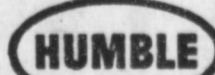

ORDER FOR RE-ALLOCATION OF ELECTION THE STATE OF TEXAS) COUNTY OF ARANSAS) ON THIS, the 13th day of July, 1953, the Commissioners' Court of Aransas County, Texas, convened in Regular Session, at the regular meeting place thereof in the courthouse at Rockport, Texas, with the following members of the Court, to-wit:

JOHN WENDELL, COUNTY JUDGE, Presiding, and W. B. ALLEN, COMMISSIONER, Precinct No. 1; J. M. SPARKS, JR., COMMISSIONER, Precinct No. 2; A. L. DAVIS, COMMISSIONER, Precinct No. 3; J. H. MILLS, COMMISSIONER, Precinct No. 4; present, and among other proceedings had by the Court were the following:

Commissioner Mills introduced an order and moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Sparks. The motion, carrying with it the adoption of the order, prevailed by the following vote:

AYES: Commissioners Allen, Sparks, Davis and Mills.

NOES: None.

The order is as follows:

WHEREAS, at the general election held throughout the State of Texas on November 7, 1944, the qualified electors of the State, voting on the proposition, approved the amendment to Section 9, of Article 8, of the Texas Constitution, which amendment provides that the Commissioners' Court in any county may re-allocate the county tax levies authorized in said Section 9, of Article 8, by changing the rates provided for any of the purposes authorized in

said Section by either increasing or decreasing the same, but in no event shall the total of such taxes exceed Eighty Cents (80c) on the one hundred dollars' valuation for any one year, provided that before the Commissioners' Court may make such re-allocations and changes in such levies the same shall be submitted to the qualified property taxing voters of such county at a general or special election; and in event such re-allocations and changes are approved by a majority of the qualified property taxing voters of any such county, such re-allocations and changes shall remain in force and effect for a period of six (6) years from the date of the election at which same shall have been approved, unless the same again shall have been changed by a majority of the qualified property taxing voters of such county, voting on the proposition; and WHEREAS, the Commissioners' Court of Aransas County, Texas, deems it advisable and to the best interest of said County to re-allocate the county taxes authorized to be levied annually by Section 9, Article 8, of the Constitution, by changing the rates in respect to certain county taxes as provided;

TEXAS: That a special election be held in said County on the 20th day of August, 1953, which is not less than Thirty (30) days from the date of the adoption of this order, at which election the following proposition shall be submitted to the qualified property taxing voters, who own taxable property in said County and who have duly rendered the same for taxation, for their action thereupon: "SHALL the Commissioners' Court of Aransas County, Texas, be authorized to levy and collect in each year for a period of Six (6) years from the date of said election, county taxes as follows: Not exceeding FORTY CENTS (40c) on the \$100 valuation, in any one year, for County purposes; Not exceeding THIRTEEN CENTS (13c) on the \$100 valuation, in any one year, for roads and bridges; Not exceeding TWO CENTS (2c) on the \$100 valuation, in any one year, to supplement the jury fund of the County; and Not exceeding TWENTY-FIVE CENTS (25c) on the \$100 valuation in any one year, for the erection of public buildings and other permanent improvements." In the event that the annual levy of a tax not exceeding FIFTEEN CENTS (15c) on the one

hundred dollars' valuation for the further maintenance of the public roads of said County has heretofore been, or shall hereafter be, authorized by a majority of the qualified property taxing voters of the County, voting at an election held for that purpose, nothing herein shall be construed as rescinding or in any manner affecting the power and authority of the Commissioners' Court to levy and to continue to levy said tax.

The said election shall be held under the provisions of the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, particularly amended Section 9, of Article 8, of the Constitution, and Section 3a, Article 6, of the Constitution, and all persons who are legally qualified voters of said County, and who are resident property taxpayers who own taxable property in said County and who have duly rendered the same for taxation, shall be entitled to vote at said election. The ballots for said election shall have written or printed thereon the following: "FOR RE-ALLOCATION OF COUNTY TAXES." "AGAINST RE-ALLOCATION OF COUNTY TAXES." Each voter shall mark out with black ink or black pencil one of the above expressions, thus leaving the other as indicating his or her vote.

The polling places and presiding officers of said election shall be respectively as follows: Precinct No. 1 (Box No. 1); Voting Place, Fire Station, Rockport, Texas; Presiding Officer, Mrs. Fay Brundrett. Precinct No. 1 (Box No. 1a); Voting Place, Alamo Courts, Aransas Pass, Texas; Presiding Officer, Glenn Ellis. Precinct No. 2 (Box No. 1); Voting Place, Courthouse, Rockport, Texas; Presiding Officer, Mrs. Alma Ratliff. Precinct No. 3 (Box No. 1); Voting Place, Schoolhouse, Fulton, Texas; Presiding Officer, W. J. Moss. Precinct No. 4 (Box No. 1); Voting Place, Concession Hall, Lamar, Texas; Presiding Officer, Mrs. Alma Johnson. The manner of holding said election shall be governed by the laws of the State regulating general elections. A copy of this order, signed by the County Judge of said County, and certified to by the County Clerk of said County shall serve as proper and sufficient notice of said election. Notice of said election shall be given by posting a copy of this order at the top of which shall appear the words "NOTICE OF ELECTION FOR THE RE-ALLOCATION OF COUNTY TAXES."

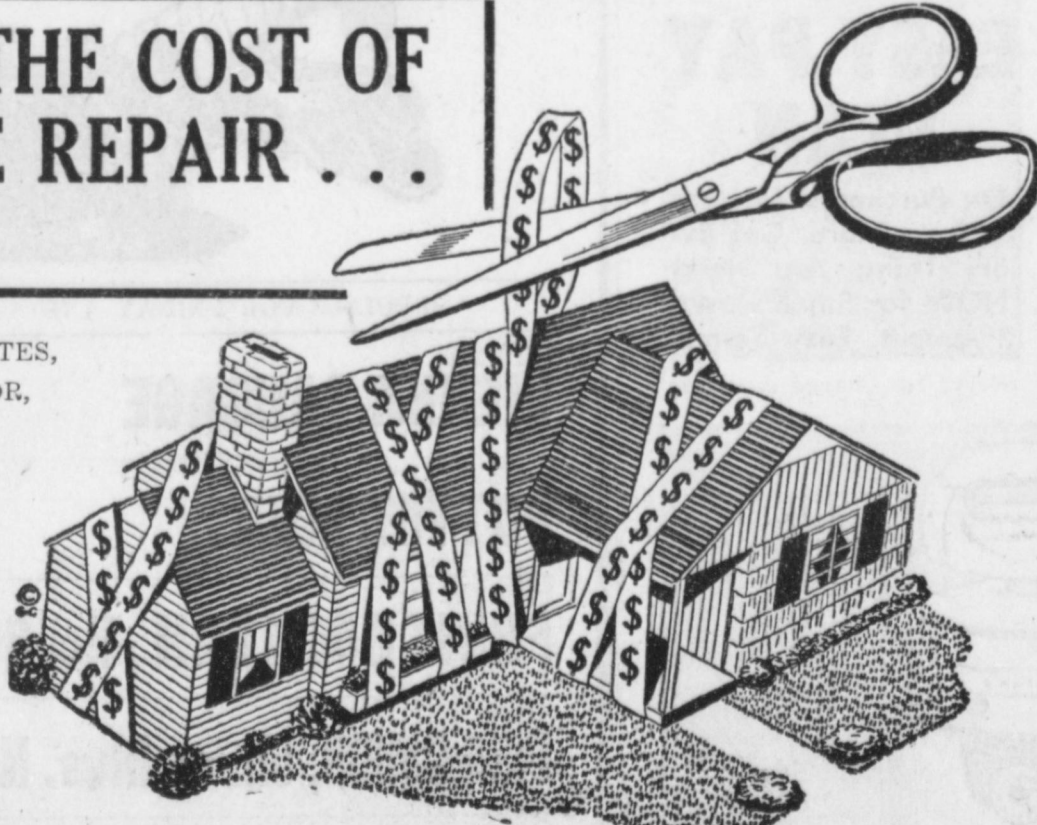
