## Bond Forum

This week, Rockport voters will go to the polls to decide he fate of a $\$ 231,000$ municipal water and sewer bond issue We have attempted during the past three weeks to rais and to answer questions in connection with this issue.
We hope you have found our forum helpful.
Below is the final set of questions. Study them care fully. Then go to the polls Saturday and cast your ballot ac cording to the dictates of your judgement.

QUESTION: Why is it necessary for the City to hav additional water wells at this time?

ANSWER: The City has nine wells. Consulting Engineer Irving Seligmann pointed out in a report prepared last December that those wells are capable of pulling up about 312,000 gallons of water a day. By next year, he estimates, Rockport will need a water supply capable of providing 377,000 gallons a day. And for 1960 , he sets the daily supply requirement at 533,000 gallons. The additional wells will relieve the present pinch and provide for the immediate future.

QUESTION: Why, then, is it necessary to spend $\$ 34,000$ for a tank that will increase the City
pacity from 100,000 to 200,000 gallons?

ANSWER: Simply, because the demand for peak use periods-as Mr. Seligmann points out, sometimes Unless there are egalon a day rate for a space of hours Unless there are adequate storage facilities, the water supply will continue to run short

QUESTION: Why is an additional supply pump with a stand-by equipment necessary?
ANSWER: Because the expansion of the water supply means that more water will have to be pumped into the city's mains. The present pump just isn't adequate. Stand by equipment carries the load in emergency,

QUESTION: Just exactly what work will be necesssary for Rockport to secure State Health Department approval of the municipal water system.
ANSWER: Health Department requirements call principally for fencing well areas, and replacing clay
cast iron pipe within 150 feet of water wells.

QUESTION: Why is it necessary to spend $\$ 48,000$ to expand our water distribution system?
ANSWER: An adequate water supply and storage space are essential to any water system. But no more so than adequate distribution facilities. Unless the City has mains that will carry enough water to serve its customers, the water problem-for many of our people-will continue. Right now, says Water Superintendent Tom Shults, we have inadequate pressure nine months a year in many homes. We have lines serving as many as 11 residences which should not, under any circumstance, serve more than one home. We have small lines that are stretched over a distance six have areas where we have no mains at all-and, certainly where we should. That, of course, is from the standpoint of service. If the City is to realize the revenue and service it
should from its water system, it must be able to provide water to its residents and in the amounts necessary to meet their needs.

QUESTION: About 15 per cent of the bond money pro posed for water improvements-and for sewer improve ments, too-is pegged for "engineering and contingencies. What does that mean?
ANSWER: It means that 8.5 per cent has been set aside to cover the inccidental and unforeseen costs attached
to the work, and 6.5 per cent to pay the engineers employed on the project. It does NOT mean that the entire 15 per cent will be paid for engineering services.

QUESTION: Why is it necessary to build a new sewage treatment plant?

ANSWER: First of all, because the present plant is completely out of working order. Each day, it pours approximately 135,000 gallons of raw sewage into an open ditch that empties into Tulle Lake. The ditch is about a mile long circling the northwest section of the city. Tulle Lake is nea the new Aransas County High School and, on occasions, backs onto the school give

ANSWER: It can-but at what engineers consider t be an exorbitant cost. They also consider rehabilitation to be impractical. The present non-functioning plant is a type chat requires expensive mechanical equipment. Once back
in operation, it still would require continuous attention and in operation, it still would require continuous attention and frequent replacement of parts. Engineer Seligmann's report shows it would require an expenditure of $\$ 29,400$ to put the insent plant in condition to handie Rockports present sew future. To rehabilitate the plant and expand it to meet th needs of the next 10 years would, says Mr. Seligmann, involve a cost of $\$ 47,700$, only $\$ 200$ less than an entirely new nonmechanical plant of the type planned under the bond program.
