## Local Crime Wave Mere Ripple Now

Local Sheriff's Department Aided By Special Officer From Cattlemen's Association, Highway
Patrolmen and Post Office Inspector Solve Crimes

| The local crime wave is a mere ripple now, thanks to the work of Sheriff A. C. Shivers and Deputy Sherman Mundine, whose investigations were climaxed by Mundine's arrest, last Saturday morning of four Rockport youths who admitted entering six Rockport business houses; incarceration of a fifth early Sunday morning; the arrest of a Gregory youth on Monday and a pick up of a seventh man on Tuesday evening, clearing up nine more robberies and re- covering much of the loot. <br> Charged in Justice of the Peace court on Wednesday morning with burglarly in the nighttime were: Alfonso (Pancho) Zavala, Joe Torres, August Rodriguez and | Gregory. They were held for the Grand Jury under $\$ 2,500$ bond each.
