





The Pirates' second touchdown came when Shivers flipped a pass to John Goff that was good for a little better than 45 yards. The extra point try on this was missed.

John Cabaniss carried the ball over from the nine in the third quarter for the score, and Happner hung up another couple of points when he carried after the touchdown.

Two other touchdown runs made by Cabaniss during the game were called back, due to clipping penalties assessed against the Pirates. The first of these came in the opening quarter when he crossed the line after a 40-yard burst of speed, and the second was in the second quarter, when Shivers' pass to Cabaniss netted

15 yards. The Wildcats made their lone score in the fourth quarter, with a 60-yard drive, climaxed when David Salinas, their quarter, went over from the one-yard line for the score.

In the first part of the game, Gregory-Portland's defense and offense operated well, but in the second half they were hampered by backfield injuries. Their top backs were Salinas and Whittaker, who gave the Pirates plenty of trouble.

The Pirate offense clicked beautifully most of the night, however, although the defense was ragged at times.
