### January 19, 1988 Beginning Date For Recruit Training School

The Texas Department of Public Safety announced that January 19, 1988 has been selected as the beginning date for a recruit training school for the position of State Trooper according to Major V.J. Cawthon, Regional Commander for the

Entrance exams and agility tests will be given at the Lubbock, Amarillo and Wichita Falls Department of Public Safety offices every Tuesday and Thursday beginning on July 28, 1987.
