Southwestern Public Service Company (SPS) an-
nounced today it is preparinto file for an annual rate decrease of approximately $\$ 13$ million, or $2.8 \%$, for its residential, commercial, incustomers in Texas, primarily due to savings resulting from federal tax reform. In addition, SPS is requesting to credit to its Texas retail customers \$11 and interest.
The lower rates and the one-time credit could be effective by December, said
Sam Hunter, SPS vice Sam Hunter, SPS vice
president of rates and economic research.
Currently, SPS is conferring with the cities it serves in Texas and with the Public (PUCT) on the amount and timing of the rate reduction. In Texas, cities have original
jurisdiction over base rates jurisdiction over base rates
within their city limits. The PUCT establishes base rates in rural areas and regulates the fuel-cost portion of electric rates.
