Here October 24

The county home demonstration council set the date for the annual county exhibit in Jayton, October 24.

All foods will be judged and exhibited in the morning, and during the afternoon each club will give a fifteen minute demonstration on food preservation, or kitchen improvement.

The following canned foods may be entered by individual club members:

- 1 qt. snap beans.
- 1 qt. field peas.
- 1 qt. tomatoes.
- 1 qt. tomato juice.
- 1 qt. carrots.
- 1 qt. beets.
- 1 qt. okra.
- 1 qt. English peas.
- 1 pt. greens.
- 1 pt. kraut.
- 1 qt. plums.
- 1 qt. peaches.
- 1 qt. pears.
- 1 qt. berries.
- 1 qt. pickled watermelon rinds.
- 1 pt. pepper relish.
- 1 pt. green tomato relish.
- 1 pt. other relish.
- 1 qt. pickled beets.
- 1 qt. brined cucumber pickles.

All entries must be in by 5 o'clock October 23. The following are standards on scoring that will be used in judging the products:

General - all containers should have a good seal and should be attractive. Jars should be filled with in one fourth inch from the top and the label should be placed one fourth inch from the bottom of the jar. The contents of the jar should not be crowded enough to destroy the texture or shape of the products so that the product would not be attractive for serving. There should be a full pack. The liquid in the jar should come over the product. Fancy pack will not be considered for judging.

Plums - Shape held, skin unbroken, good even color, graded for size, syrup clear.

Peaches - Pack halves in overlapping layers. The concave surface of each half should be downward. Color should be good for type of peach. Even ripeness, uniform size, shape held, syrup clear.

Tomato Juice - A rich red color with not more than one inch separation per pint or one and a half inch separation per quart.

Canned Tomatoes - Even, rich red color, packed in their own juice with only a few seed visible.

Greens - Good, even color, stems removed, liquid clear.

English peas - Uniform size, good green color, clear liquid.

Green snap beans - Pod about one fourth inch in diameter, even lengths, liquid clear, uniform maturity.

Black Eyed peas - Uniform maturity, graded, good color, clear liquid, about half mature.

Carrots - About one inch in diameter, deep orange color, practical pack and clear liquid.

Beets - Deep red color, evenly graded, one and a half to two inches in diameter, liquid clear.

Kraut - Color uniform, cream free from whitish unfermented pieces, uniformly shredded, medium fine.

Okra - Good color, graded for size.

Pickles - Dark olive green without, uniform size, neatly and practically packed.

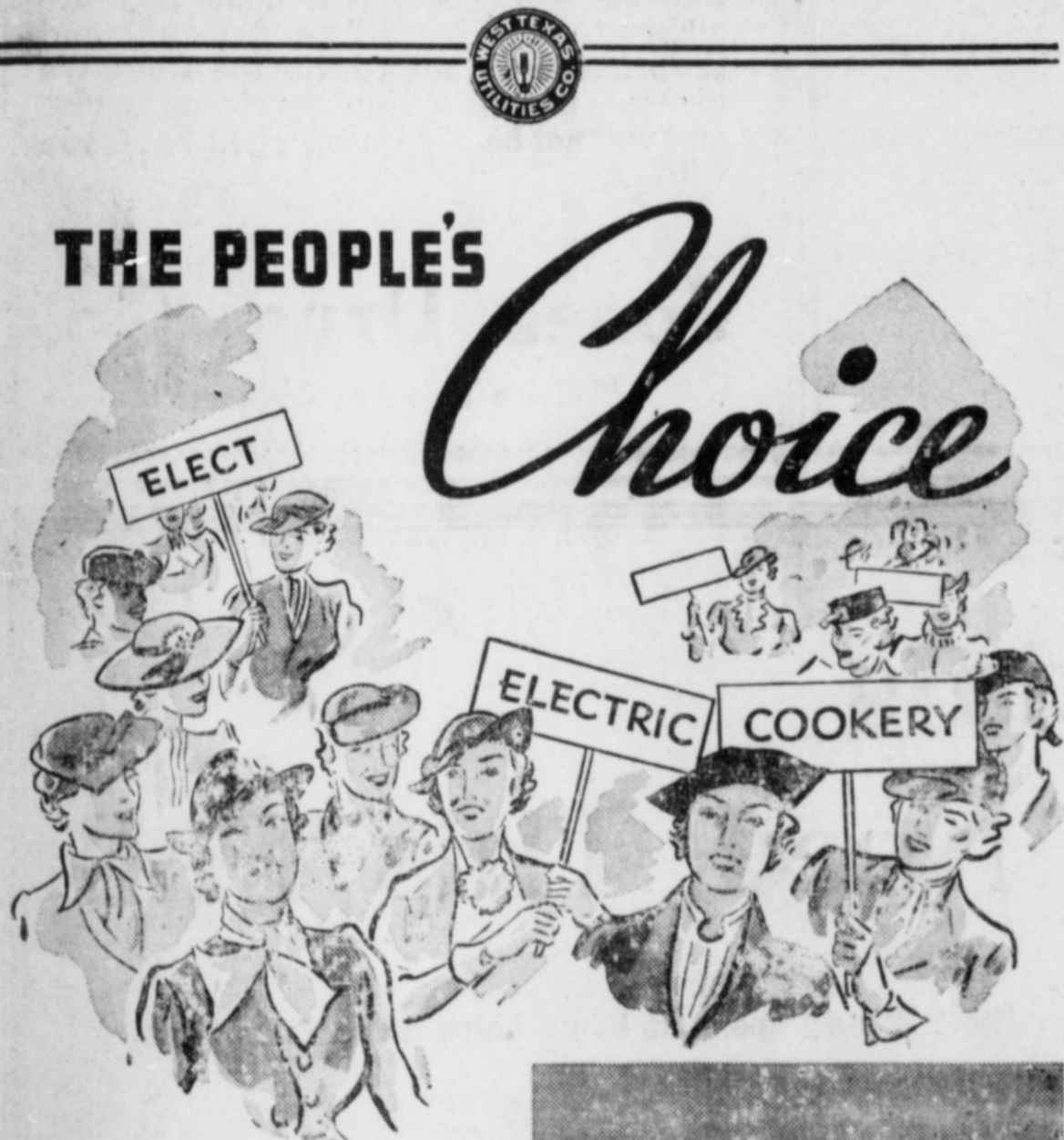

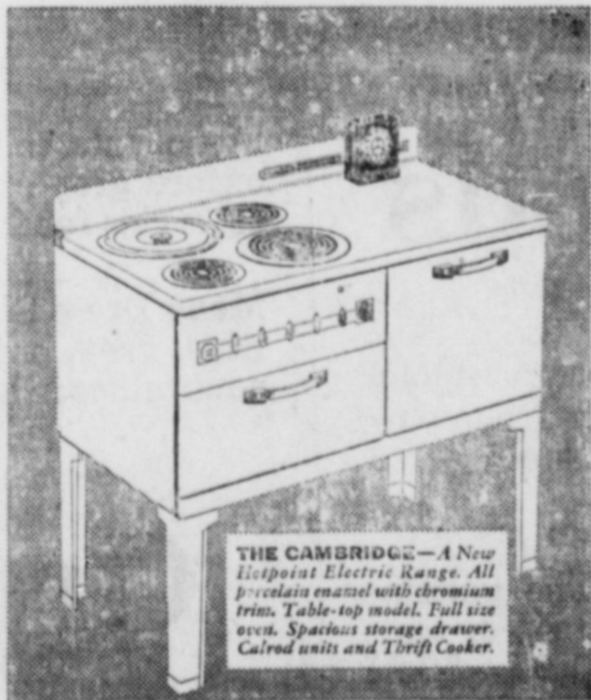

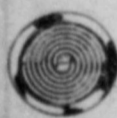

PHYSICAL CHECK-UP NEEDED EVERY YEAR

Great strides have been made in mass control of public health in the past twenty five years by public health officials and the use of scientific methods in the control of disease. The job of the individual in getting fit and remaining in good health, however, is a personal rather than a public matter, according to Dr. John W. Brown, State Health Officer.

"While the ravages of diphtheria, smallpox, typhoid fever, and other devastating diseases have been definitely checked by public health measures," he said, "there are left many

health enemies which are stealthy, and whose approach is definitely individual. Heart disease, cerebral hemorrhage, nephritis, and cancer continue to stand high in the list of major killers.

"As these degenerating diseases cannot be controlled by quarantine and immunization, each individual should see to his own protection against these diseases if they exist, while they are in a state where control may be effective. The annual physical health examination is the major defensive weapon against such diseases.

The annual physical examination has two definite objectives in the life of an individual; namely, to establish the fact that there is or is not present a disease which calls for prompt control measures, and to determine the margins of safety in health habits. When the family physician has established the facts
