

He may not use an actual glove, for a clean rag or piece of batting does as well. After cleaning the question, he will run the

engine, or make the wheels go around, or apply the brakes, as the case may be. Then he will pass the clean piece of material over suspect parts, and if the comes up oily, grasy or wet, he knows that vital automotive fluids are leaking, the forerunner of serious trouble. Consider brakes, for ex-

ample. Your trained mechanic should remove the wheels of your car twice a year, under normal driving conditions. If his "white glove inspection" reveals fluid seepage around the inside area of the wheels, it could indicate a brake cylinder leaking hydraulic brake fluid. This could result in sudden reduction of braking power-often disastrous at high speeds. The master brake cylinder should be checked for seepage, for if it fails, you may suffer complete loss of your brakes.

K p Your Power Dry Testing for fluid seepage around the engine may show that engine lubricating oil is departing through a leaky gasket. If enough oil is lost, the friction of moving parts in a fast-running engine will generate unnatural heat, and as metal parts expand or warp, the engine can "seize up," leading to complete overhaul or replace-




