The Pharmaceutical Manufacturers Association reports these accomplishments by prescription drug industry research scientists over the last twenty years as typical results of a process sometimes called molecular modification.

Nobody has ever seen a molecule, but industry chemists are continually tinkering with them. They are pulling apart these invisible particles of matter, eliminating one atom, or groups of atoms, substituting others, and re-assembling them into better drugs.

Molecular modification enables pharmaceutical chemists to tailor-make medicines for specific attacks upon specific seases, or to produce a whole series of drugs which among them exhibit the range of medical properties that the physician requires to treat each patient as a unique individual.

They have transformed a sulfa drug into an oral anti-diabetic agent. They have modified an antibiotic so that, in the body, it separates into no less than seven different antibiotics, all active.

By now, the original dreams of finding gold and jewels had vanished. The colonists had tried producing glass, pitch and soap ashes. Sassafras and hand sawed lumber had been shipped to England. But there was little

demand and little profit.

John Rolfe provided the answer. He had a hunch that Virginia's soil could produce gold - the golden leaf of tobacco Somehow he got some "Spanish-type" tobacco seed from Trinidad. He cleared the

land and planted his seeds. After harvesting a small cro-- a few hundred pounds a most - he shipped it to England. His tobacco was an im mediate success.

That was the turning point

for Jamestown, for Virginia and for this nation. It was the first successful English settlement anywhere in the world. It showed that settlement and economic develo were possible in the New World Eight years later the Pilgrims

landed at Plymouth Rock, and the rest is history. The tiny seeds John Rolfe planted have grown into a \$7.1 billion industry in the U.S. which yields annual taxes of \$3.1 billion. Some 17 mill Americans get part of their livelihood from tobacco.

This year marks the 350th anniversary of John Rolfe's first crop, and the industry he founded. A special celebration honor ing Rolfe will be held in James town Festival Park this May. The Park includes reconstructions of the original James-town Fort, and replicas of the first colonists' three ships, and special exhibits. Visitors are welcome throughout the year.

## TREMENDOUS TRIFLES Film Clips To

THE WAGER THAT STARTED Be Shwn Here THE MOVIES

No one could have foreseen the connection between a WAGEE and the MOTION PICTURE in dustry . . . Seems like a trivial thing? That's just the point! SO MANY IMPORTANT THINGS HAVE STARTED IN SUCH IN SIGNIFICANT WAYS! But—the

The incident happened in Sac ramento in the year 1877. Two famous sportsmen of the day fell upon a discussion of a sport they both loved: horse-racing. One of these was Leland Stanford (for whom the famed university is today named) and the other was a noted sportsman of the day. The point of the discussion seemed to be whether all four legs of a horse left the ground at the same time

during a run, a gallop or canter. You must remember that this was before the days of advanced photography and it was difficult to prove what today seems simple, indeed! Feeling became keener as the sportsmen differed, irreconcilably, on this point. It ended in a wager of some five thousand dollars. And then it was necessary to devise ways and means of com-

It was finally determined to utilize the talents of a noted photo-grapher of the day, Edward Muybridge of New York, and the solution of the problem was placed entirely with him.

Muybridge ingeniously devised a battery of sixteen cameras, placed within a foot of each other along the course to be traversed by a champion race horse of the day. To each of these camera's shutters a string was attached that would be tripped by the horse's legs as he ran, galloped, cantered graphed in sixteen different posi-

Now, the story ends in two ways: it definitely established the fact that all four legs of a horse DO seave the ground, thereby earning the wagered sum for his sponsor. But far more important was the incidental and accidental re-

Thomas A. Edison was the most important inventor of the day. His interests had led him into many and varied fields. But it was never in the direction of photography.

One day Edison chanced upon the series of pictures that had been prepared by Muybridge in settlement of the wager. In a flash, he saw in it the central idea of continuous motion: if these intervals between the movements could be made shorter, there would be a more realistic effect of contin-

That was all that was necessary for the fertile and inventive mind the Wizard of Menlo Park. It was the beginning of a long series of experiments in the field of continuous motion. It was the beginning of Edison's interest in the pioneer motion pictures with which

THREE PISTOL SHOTS STARTED A WORLD WAR

When a twenty-year-old Serbiar gh school youth fired three shot to the Imperial car of Archduk. anz Ferdinand of Austria, h. le dreamed his act would plunge e great powers of the world into deadly struggle.

The Archduke, rephew to the peror and heir to the Austrian throne, had been warned of the danger to his life if he visited the ttle province of Bosnia which had been under Austrian control since the Congress of Berlin in 1878. Bosnia and Herzegovina, both pre dominantly Serbian, had been wrested from the Turks in the Russo-Turkish War of 1875-76, in which Serbia won its independence from Turkey. However, the big powers didn't see fit to give the provinces to Serbia, but gave railiary control to Austria as spoils of war for her neutrality in the con-

The Serbs had never bowed to Teuton authority. They longed for a united Serbia. Archduke Ferdinand meant to deal with the revolts with an iron fist, and his Imperial visit to Bosnia was to proffer friendship before the military took

On June 28, 1914, the Archduke. accompanied by his wife, rode down the Appel Quay in Sarajevo in Bosnia. Soldiers lined the thorughfare and behind them a cordon police. Special agents moved rough the stoic crowd. The desination of the Imperial car was he Town Hall where there were some speeches.

A bomb was thrown at the Imperial car before reaching the Hall. The Archduke fended it off, the bomb exploding behind the car. At the Town Hall a shortened version of friendship took place. The Archduke asserted himself to the mayor.

The procession retraced the route. Another bomb dropped beside the Imperial car, failing to explode. Then a youth in the crowd appeared brandishing a pistol. He fired three rapid shots into the car, killing the Archduke and his wife.




