

Do you need to lose weight? The only way to take in your belt or slip into those spring slacks is to EAT LESS and EX-ERCISE MORE. To develop an effective weight-reduction plan, first determine how much you should weigh. If you are more than 10 pounds overweight, see your doctor. Count your calories! 
