Take A Train Ride On The Stamford And Northwestern
 in any inventor's eye and trips by train usually ended with
the traveler's collar and shirt speckled with soot and
sometimes with cinder burns. I was on my way to Spur, Texas in Dickens County to
visit my Grandmother. The first lap of my journey was on

next tap was on the Wichita Valley to Stamford. The T\&P train was as modern as you could find anywhere sixty years
ago, and the Wichita Valley was not far behind. But the
Sta Stamford \& Northwestern train I rode from Stamford to
Spur Spur looked more ancient than the Santa Fe's "Cyrus K.
Holliday" except for the locomotive which had a straight
smokestack. The train mokestack. The train had a consist of two chair cars, a
mail car, and a baggage-express car Just as soon as the train was called, I elbowed my way
ahead of the crowd, boarded the train and got a good seat
next to the next to the window. The little pot-bellied stove at the front
end of the car was not in use as the weather furnished all
the the heat we needed; but behind it next to the wall was a
well-stocked coal bin and some kindling wood. Under and
arown around the stove was a layer of sheet metal to protect the
floor from turning coals that might be knocked out by
stokifin stoking. The metal mat was covered by what appeared to
be dried tobacco juice. Every seat was served by a brass
spit spitoon but enrooute to Spur I I saw more than one tobacco

The next attraction for me was the lighting system-..a
series of four big chandlier-like oil lamps hanging from the series of four big chandier-like oil lamps hanging from the
ceiling of the car and two little lamps at each end. As my
ride was during the day, I didn't see any lighting of the ride was during the day, I didn't see any lighting of the
lamps. The window shades were old and dingy but not used
much as all the windews lamps. The window shades were old and dingy but not used
much as all the windows were up to provide natural
air-conditioning. In a loud voice the conductor hollered "A-1-1
"B-o-a-r-d" and in seconds the little engine gave a jerk, a

little wooden coach swayed fom side to side but settled
down somewhat as we got underway. The track was in pretty bad shape and frequently we
were up on one side and down on the other, swaying
continuously When continuously. When the track permitted, we attained
speeds up to 30 miles per hour, but more often the speed ranged from 20 to 25 .
After huffing and puffing for four hours including stops in Sagerton, Aspermont, Peacock, Jayton, Girard and
Gilpin, we arrived in Spur, the end of the line Eighty miles in four hours! An average speed of 20
miles per hour and mighty good considering the six stops. miles per hour and mighty good considering se six slops,
the light rail, bump roabded and the primitive rolling
tock. Really, I enjoyed every minute of it in spite of the cinders, smoke and bumps.
The little line for many years was operated by the
