# **City Water Rates Revised By Council**

In session Wednesday morning, the City Council slightly revised the city water rates to make a more equitable scale for both large and small users. In affect with January Hale Farmers Favor bills, the following rates will apply: charge, \$1.50; next 2,000 gallons at 50c per thousand; next 5,000 gallons at 25c per thousand; all above at 15c per thousand gallons.



A special irrigation rate was Authorized, with rates set at a minimum of \$2.50 for 10,000 gals. and all above at 15c per 1,000 gallons. This rate will be available only for customers who enter agreement to pay months.


