



# FACTS on the ROAD BOND ISSUE

TO THE VOTERS

Would you support a program for more paved roads in Hale County if they could be built without additional taxes? If the Road Bond Election called for December 28, 1940, carries, the people of Hale County have a chance for such program.

The petition asking for a road bond election and the order of the Commissioner's Court calling such election has the following conditions and stipulations therein, which are:

The Board of Indebtedness receives its money from 1c of the gasoline tax, which we pay, and we will continue to pay the full gasoline tax whether we avail

A vote against the bond issue is a vote against further highway construction in our County for an indefinite period, and leaves the burden on the County to provide work projects out of other funds which it does not have. ourselves of the above opportunity or not.

As a second benefit to the County, such road construction will afford a worthy project for permanent improvements in the County and will provide a great deal of work for our unemployed.

A vote for the bond means more paved roads for our County without additional taxes, and providing work for our unemployed.
