

HUBAM IN SMALL GRAINS Two farmers in the Hale Soil Conservation District give their experiences with Hubam sweet

Progressive Farmer magazine. Both M. F. McKnight and C. L. Hattsell had success with the clover on their farms. On the Mc-Knight farm, land that had been in maize for around 10 years was planted to Hubam clover and wheat. After one year to clover, his wheat yields increased from 21.7 bushels per acre to 30.5

bushels. C. L. Hartsell overseeded his wheat with Hubam on March 23, 1953. His yield was 10 bushels per acre. On the same land in 1954, he harvested 29 bushels per acre. Mr. Hartsell felt that he planted the clover too early because it caused a little trouble in the wheat harvest.
