### Sound Speech?

Reading Time: 4 Minutes

Speech should be used to further good thoughts. How we handle our words can very well determine our influence upon others. Religious people should always be certain that their speech is right.

Paul's advice to Titus is timely in our day: "In all things showing yourself a pattern of good works: in doctrine showing uncorruptness, gravity, sincerity, sound speech, that cannot be condemned" (Titus 2:7-8). Did you notice his plea for "sound speech" that cannot be condemned?

You may ask, "What is sound speech?" It is speech free from error, flaw, or defect. It is healthy and helpful to the hearer, and founded in truth and right. What is the foundation for "sound speech"? What is the criteria for judging the value of religious talk?

The Bible is our only infallible standard of judgment. Consider these statements: "If any man speak, let him speak as the oracles of God" (1 Pet. 4:11). "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom" (Col. 3:16). "O generation of vipers, how can ye, being evil, speak good things? for out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaketh" (Matt. 12:34). "Hold fast the form of sound words, which thou hast heard of me, in faith and love which is in Christ Jesus" (2 Tim. 1:13).

Now, come along with me and let us consider some modern-day religious expressions which betray a lack of soundness.

**Father**  
Jesus said: "And call no man your father upon the earth: for one is your Father, which is in heaven" (Matt. 23:9). It is evident here that Jesus means that we should call no man "Father" in a spiritual sense. No Christian will call a priest Father in a spiritual sense for neither priest nor pope is mediator between man and God (1 Tim. 2:5). "Father," "Pope," and "Pontiff," are titles of men, and not Bible terms. These expressions do not conform to "sound speech, which

cannot be condemned."

**Pope**  
Many people are told that "the Pope is God." His Vice-gerent on earth, the Vicar of Christ. These terms are foreign to the Bible: "Let no man deceive you by any means: for that day shall not come, except there come a falling away first, and that man of sin be revealed, the son of perdition, who opposeth and exalteth himself above all that is called God, or that is worshipped; so that he as God sitteth in the temple of God, showing himself that he is God (2 Thess. 2:3-4).

**Reverend**  
Can you imagine "the Rev. James," "the Right Reverend Peter," or the "most Reverend John"? Yet, THIS IS THE TYPE RELIGIOUS SPEECH MANY USE TODAY. In the Bible we are taught that children of God were called "saints," a term that refers to all Christians (1 Cor. 1:2). To call men by these titles is not to follow "sound speech."

**Pastor**  
It is common practice with many to call some preacher "our pastor." Is this in keeping with sound speech? Where is the passage that teaches it? Did you know that no congregation of Christ's church has ever had "a" Pastor? They have always had a plurality of men known as pastors, elders, bishops, overseers. These words designate their work and not their rank. (see Acts 20:17, 28; 1 Pet. 5:1-14; 1 Tim. 3:1-7).

**Sabbath**  
Did you ever hear someone refer to Sunday as "the Sabbath"? Is this according to sound speech? Saturday is the old Jewish Sabbath and became invalid to religious observance when the Old Covenant was removed at the death of Christ (Eph. 2:12-16; Col. 2:14; Heb. 8:6-7). The first day of the week is the Lord's Day. It is upon this day that Christians assemble to have communion, fellowship, teaching, prayers, singing, and contribution (see Acts 20:7; Acts 2:42; and 1 Cor. 16:12).

### ... Clip ... Study ... Save ... Until ... Election ... In November

Summary of the nine constitutional amendments to be voted on at the general election November 4, 1958, in the order that they will appear on the ballot.

(1) Provides for annual Sessions of the Legislature, changing the compensation, per diem and travel expense of the Members of the Legislature; authorizing temporary residence of the Lieutenant Governor and Speaker of the House in the Capital.

(2) Authorizes each county to establish, after approval by its voters, a retirement, disability, and death compensation fund covering the elective officers of the county or precinct, as well as the appointive officers and employees of the county or precinct.

(3) Provides that vacancies in the office of County Judge and Justices of the Peace shall be filled by the Commissioners Court until the next General Election.

(4) Provides that any District, County, or Precinct official serving a four-year term must resign before announcing for a different office if there remains unexpired more than one (1) year of the term for which he was elected.

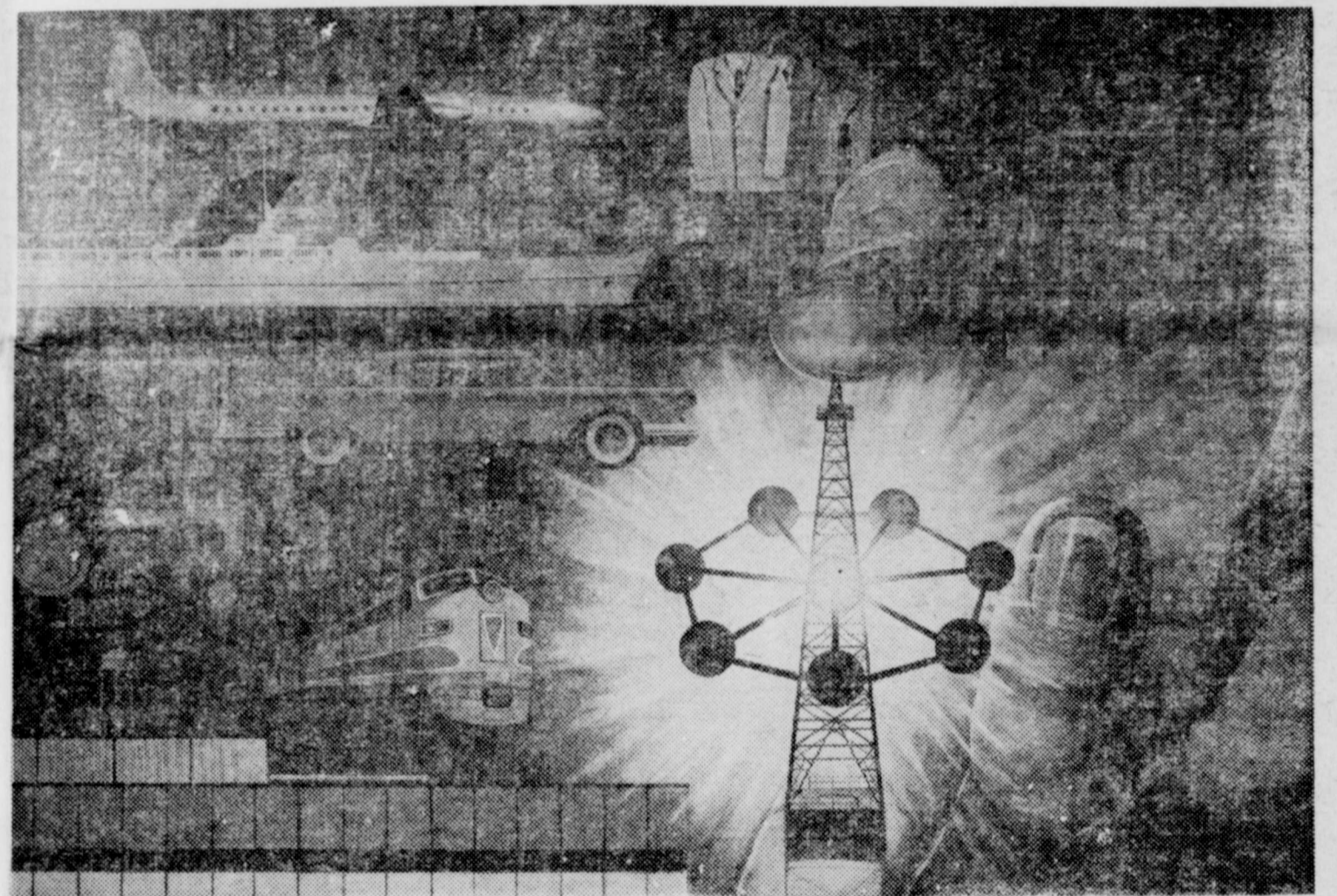
(5) Provides that a Home Rule City may provide by Charter Provision, and a City operating under the general laws may provide by majority vote, for a longer term of office than two (2) years for its officers, either elective or appointive, or both not to exceed four years.

(6) Provides for pension to retired Texas Rangers who are ineligible to participate in the Employees Retirement System of Texas, and their widows.

(7) Authorizes the Legislature to make appropriations and establish procedure for advertising the historical, natural, agricultural, industrial, educational, recreational, and other resources of Texas.

(8) Gives the Legislature the power to authorize vendor payments for medical care in addition to the amount paid in the form of direct public assistance to and on behalf of needy recipients of Old Age Assistance, Aid to the Blind, Aid to Dependent Children or Aid to the Permanently and Totally Disabled; providing for the acceptance of funds from the Federal Government for the purpose of paying such assistance.

(9) Authorizes the Legislature to create a Hospital District coextensive with the incorporated limits to the City of Amarillo, Texas, and a county wide Hospital District in Wichita County, Texas, and Hospital Districts in Jefferson County, Texas.

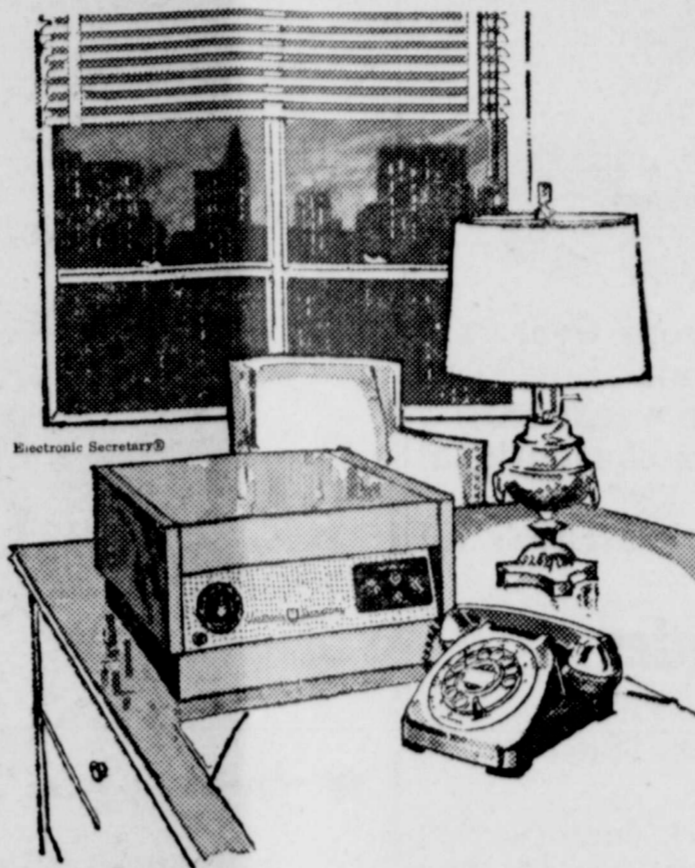

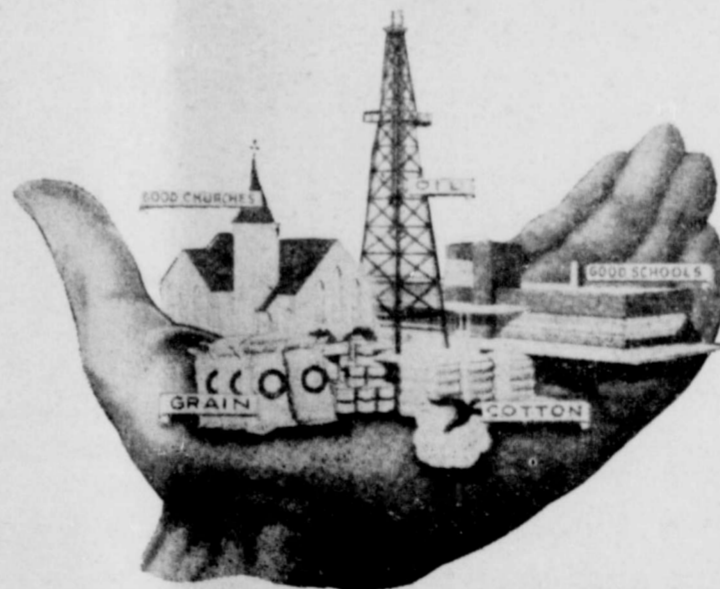

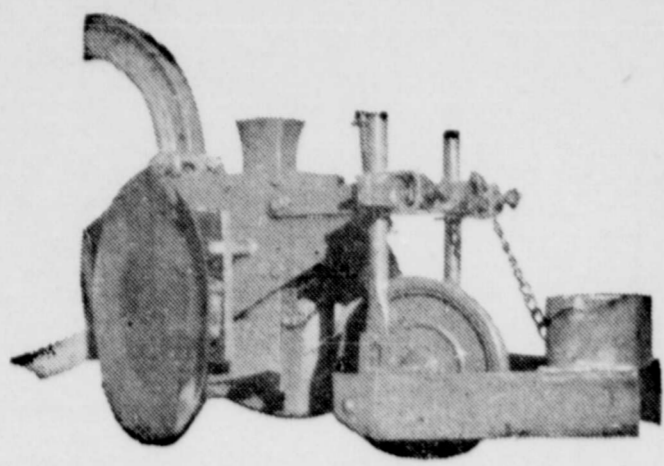
