When the fire siren is used to ound warning that a tornado is pproaching Abernathy there will two six-second blasts, followed by a 12-second blast. This series of wo short blasts followed by a long plast will continue until ample warning is sounded by the siren.

Night warning on tornadoes apoaching will be handled by the elephone operator and volunteer firemen. When the night telephone operator is advised of a tornado aproaching, she will call a member of the fire department nearest the ire station and he will start the eries of siren blasts.

Officials asked that local residents not call the telephone office to find the location of a fire after he siren sounds for that purpose A policy of the company forbids the perators giving this information o anyone except members of the olunteer fire department.
