But without faith it is impossible to please Him: For he that cometh must believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of them that diligently seek Him" (Hebrews 11:6). Since we must have faith in God, the natural question to ask is, "Where do we get our faith, and how?" "Does it come to us as a direct operation of the Holy Spirit, or not?" Paul answers question in Romans 10:17: "Faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God." Only through this means, then, can one obtain complete faith in God.

Since faith is such an essential part of Christianity, it is important that all should know what faith is, and how we demonstrate our faith. Hebrews 11:1 gives the definition of faith as follows: "Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the proving of things not seen" (ASV). The word aith, from the original word tis" can be distinguished in two senses, as the passive and active On the one side "fidelity," "trust worthiness," and "faith," "trust" on the other. There is another sense in which the word "faith means a "doctrine" or "creed as in Jude 3 and in Ephesians 4:4. 
