Installation Work on Dial System Passes Half-way Mark

The installation of Abernathy's new dial telephone equipment, designed to bring unattended dial service to 850 customers in the area, reached its half-way mark last week, according to E. I. Jenkins, District Manager for the General Telephone Company of the Southwest.

"If we continue to make the same progress during the next ten weeks as we have since the installation work began on August 4," the District Manager said, "the completion of the dial equipment installation should be about December 1."

Jenkins also announced that a construction crew arrived in Abernathy last week to begin construction on outside plant facilities. The crew will recenter all outside plant facilities to the new dial building located at 611 10th Street, and will also replace all present telephones with dial instruments.

The company feels, said Jenkins, that the residence and business subscribers of Abernathy will enjoy the faster service offered to them when the dial conversion is completed around the first of December.

Givens Attends Ford Showing of The 1960 Models

DEARBORN, MICH. — Lloyd Givens, manager of Abernathy Motor Company, Abernathy, Texas, visited Ford Motor Company headquarters in Dearborn, Mich., last week (Sept. 21-23) to view the 1960 cars and trucks and discuss with Henry Ford II the outlook for the national economy and the automobile industry during the forthcoming decade.

The special preview marked the first time in a quarter century that all 7,000 Ford dealers have been invited to the company's home offices. During their stay there, they met face-to-face with Ford Division management, including engineers and stylists who designed the new Ford line.

The new Fords were unveiled to a Broadway-type show featuring Ray Bolger, Jane Powell and Blackstone the Magician. The dealers were entertained by Tennessee Ernie Ford and Rosemary Clooney.

While in Dearborn, the dealers occupied eight hotels, ate three tons of chicken, three tons of spare ribs, 11 tons of beef, 10,000 lobster tails, 2,500 pounds of shrimp, 3,000 pounds of butter, 2,000 pies and drank 1,000 gallons of coffee and 2,000 quarts of milk.

Career Day is sponsored by the Abernathy High School Student Council.

According to J. W. Solis, AHS Principal, it was decided that this school year's Career Day will be open to both juniors and seniors of the participating schools, whereas last year only seniors took part.

Career Day will be held March 25, 1960, with about 20 prominent persons, each with a different profession, here to make talks about his or her profession and to go into discussions with the students about the particular profession.

Each student will be permitted to attend two of the talks on the profession he or she is most interested in.

Approximately 400 students are expected to attend the 1960 Career Day activities in the Abernathy school facilities.

The same confusion exists in Abernathy, which lies mostly in Hale County, with the south part of the town in Lubbock County. Some of our people live in the Hale County part of town and work in the Lubbock portion of Abernathy, while others live in the Lubbock County portion and work in the Hale County part. Only situation that could be more confusing would be a state-line town, with portions of the town in two or more states.

Free Polio Shots To Be Offered At School September 29 and 30

Marguerite Greene, registered nurse for the Abernathy Public Schools, announced that free polio shots will be offered at the school on the afternoons of September

29 and 30 (Tuesday and Wednesday).

D. Thomas Williams will administer the inoculations to those who desire to take advantage of this free service. Parents as well as the children are urged to take the shots.

Mrs. Greene stated that all children who are not accompanied by a parent must have written permission from their parents before the polio vaccination will be administered.

Any person who has not had a booster shot within the past 12 months, or who has had no shots, or who needs to complete the series of shots, is also urged to be present either Sept. 29 or 30.

STATE LAW

RECOVERY OF CIVIL DAMAGES DUE TO DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY BY MINORS

Section 1. Any property owner, including any municipal corporation, county, school district or other political subdivision of the State of Texas, or any department or agency of the State of Texas, or any person, partnership, corporation or association, or any religious organization whether incorporated or unincorporated, shall be entitled to recover damages in an amount not to exceed Three Hundred Dollars (\$300) from the parents of any minor under the age of eighteen (18) years and over the age of ten (10), who maliciously and willfully damages or destroys property, real, personal or mixed, belonging to such owner. However, this Act shall not apply to parents whose parental custody and control of such child has been removed by court order, decree, or judgment.

Section 2. The suit may be brought in any court of competent jurisdiction, and venue thereof shall be governed by the statutes regulating venue in actions based upon trespass. The recovery shall be limited to the actual damages in an amount not to exceed Three Hundred Dollars (\$300), in addition to taxable court costs.

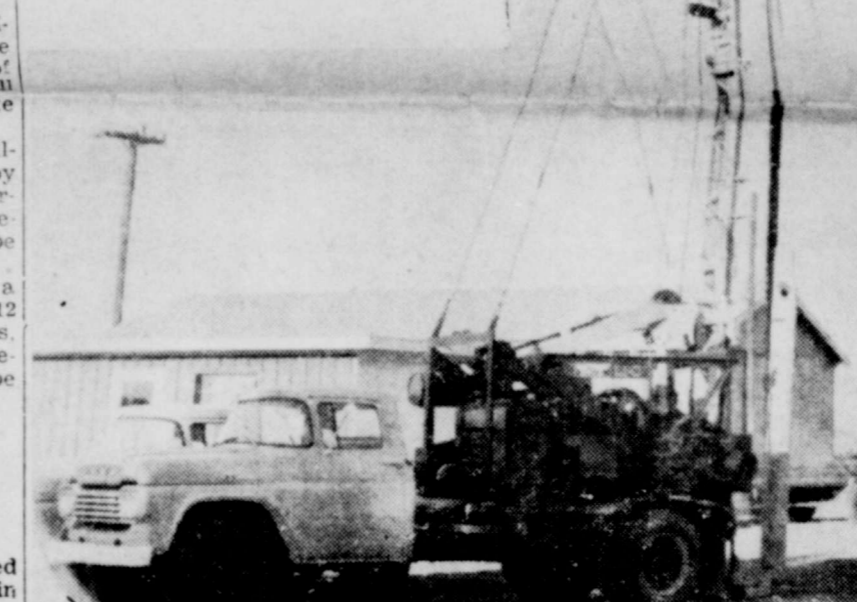
Section 3. The action authorized in this Act shall be in addition to all other actions which the owner is entitled to maintain and nothing in this Act shall preclude recovery in a greater amount from the minor or from any other person, including the parents, for damages to which such minor or other person would otherwise be liable, it being the purpose of this Act to authorize recovery from parents, and to limit the amount of the recovery, in situations where they would not otherwise be liable.

New Drilling Rig Introduced

Warning Issued On Defoliating Cotton Too Soon

A warning note against defoliating cotton too early is sounded. Citing the recommendations of the state experiment station, Jason Gordon, for 15 years on the Extension Service staff, and now farm supply firm member, says that it is recommended that defoliants not be used until cotton is 50 per cent open.

The reason is that if the leaves of the plant are killed the fiber will not mature fully. Fifteen days, in general, are needed in this area, said Gordon, to harden the fiber of the cotton and completely mature it.

Otherwise when the leaves are killed the plant stops lengthening and strengthening the fiber. Defoliation too early will reduce the dollar income from the crop.

20 MPH ZONES

City officials requested these notices to the public:

Your attention is directed to the new speed limits which became effective at the beginning of the current school term. On Avenue D (Highway Street) there is a 20-mile-per-hour speed limit for two blocks, from 10th Street, at Consumers Fuel Association, south to near First Methodist Church, at 7th Street. This speed limit is in effect from 7 a. m. until 5 p. m.

The 20-mile-per-hour speed limit also is in effect around the local schools and on all streets on which "slow" signs have been painted on the pavement.

Officials also issued a reminder that it is against the law to follow a fire truck en route to a fire, and that it is unlawful to park within a block of a fire. Also, it is unlawful to drive across a fire hose. These laws will be strictly enforced, and tickets will be issued to those not observing them, the officials warned.

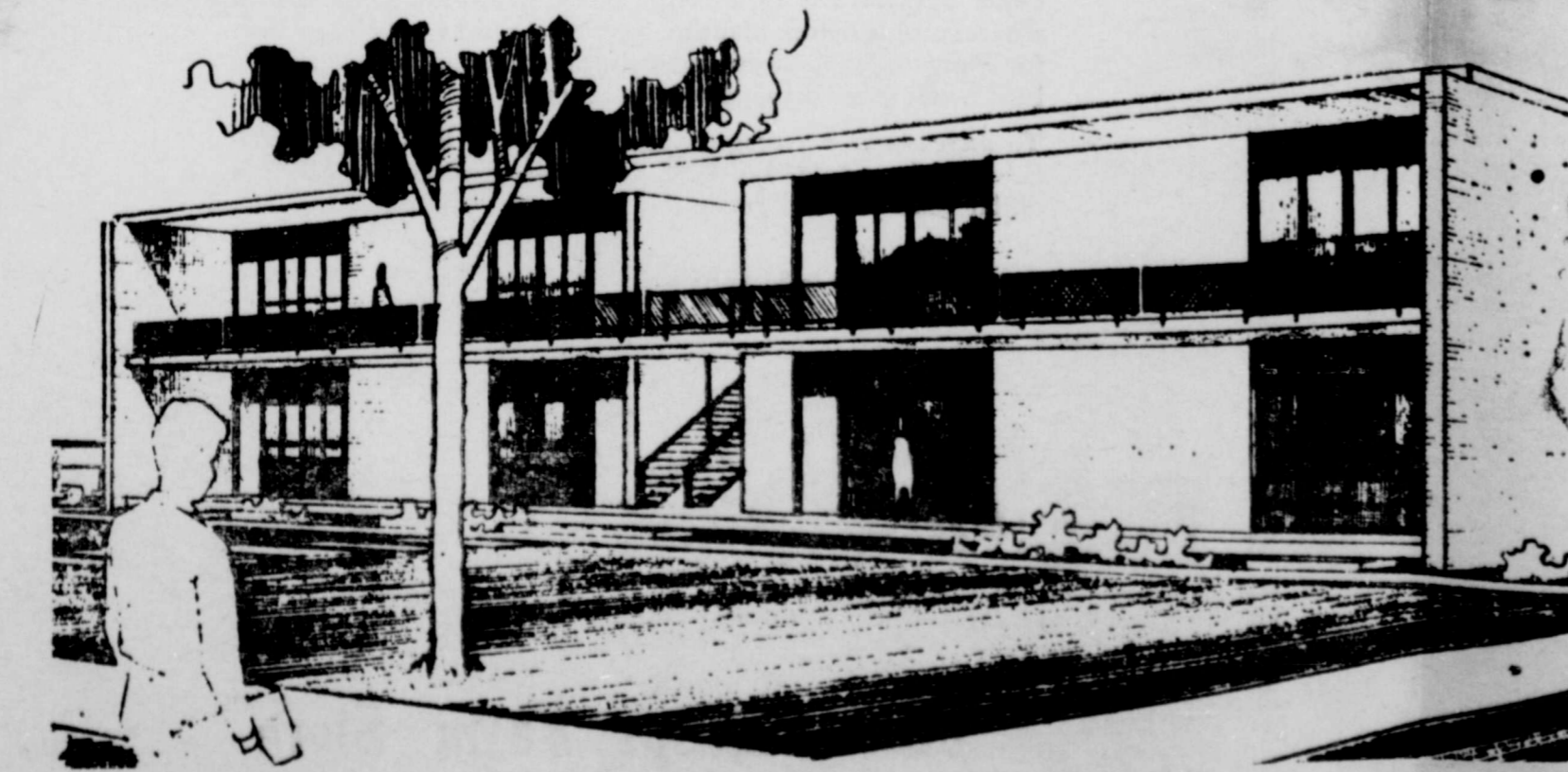

"BAPTISM OF THE HOLY SPIRIT"

Possibly no phase of the Holy Spirit and his work in the redemption of man has been discussed more than the baptism of the Holy Spirit. People who claim to be Christians believe in the Holy Spirit. Some claim to have been baptized with the Holy Spirit, while others deny that they ever have been baptized with the Holy Spirit. Some teach that all must be baptized with the Holy Spirit in order to be saved. They claim that the baptism of the Holy Spirit and conversion are tantamount. Others claim that no one today is baptized with the Holy Spirit. Who is correct in the claim? The only answer that can be accepted without fear of error is the Bible.

There are to be found such expressions as "baptism (of) the Holy Spirit," "baptism (in) the Holy Spirit," and baptism (with) the Holy Spirit." There are no distinctions to be made, however, as translators have made such distinctions without any difference in meaning. It does not matter which preposition is used, the content is the same in thought; hence, no distinction should be made.

A distinction should be made between the "baptism of the Holy Spirit," and "being filled with the Holy Spirit." This is evident when one considers that the parents of John the Baptist were "filled with the Holy Spirit." It was prophesied of John that "he shall be filled with the Holy Spirit, even from his mother's womb." (Luke 1:15). From this example we find individuals being "filled with the Holy Spirit," and yet we know they were not baptized with the Holy Spirit because this took place years before Pentecost, which is the first record of one being baptized in the Holy Spirit. Neither John, Elisabeth, nor Zacharias were baptized with the Holy Spirit, yet they were "filled with the Holy Spirit." Stephen, as he was being stoned to death, looked into heaven and related his vision to his hearers, "being full of the Holy Spirit." Stephen was not baptized in the Holy Spirit on this occasion, and yet he was full of the Holy Spirit.

In the prophecy of Joel as quoted by Peter on the day of Pentecost, we have the expression "pour forth of my Spirit," used twice (Acts 2:17,18), and once in verse 33. Again, Peter used the expression at the household of Cornelius (Acts 10:45). Paul used the expression, "renewing of the Holy Spirit, which he poured out upon us richly" (Tit. 3:5,6). We are not to understand that there was a literal outpouring of the Holy Spirit because it was impossible for a PERSON as the Holy Spirit to be literally poured out. (The Holy Spirit is referred to with a personal pronoun, masculine gender, singular number). There is some analogy or resemblance

blance in the idea to be conveyed, but we must understand this to be a figurative expression. It is a gross misconception of the personality of the Holy Spirit to think of him being "poured out" like some liquid; such an idea is to mistake the figure used, and interpret the literal in the terms of the figurative, instead of interpreting the figurative by the literal. When the apostles were baptized with the Holy Spirit they were overwhelmed by the Holy Spirit, himself.

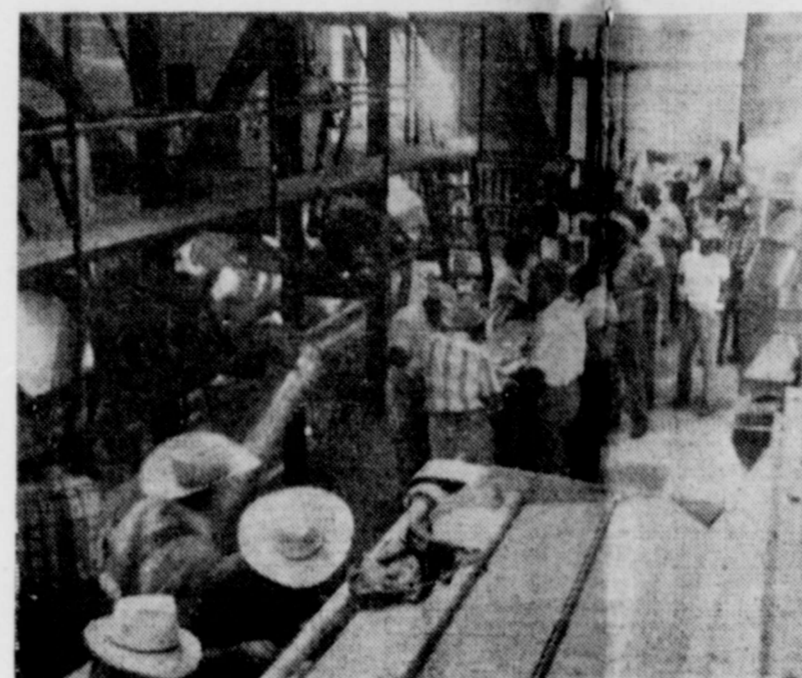
The Holy Spirit baptism, both in the Old Testament and the New, is a promise. Peter quoted Joel 2:28-32 as a promise on the day of Pentecost. It was a gift and Peter refers to it in reporting what occurred at the house of Cornelius as a "gift." Baptism of the Holy Spirit was promised, not only by the prophets and John the Baptist, but also by Christ while he was upon the earth. "For John indeed baptized with water; but ye shall be baptized in the Holy Spirit not many days hence" (Acts 1:5). Baptism in water was a command (Mark 16:15-16), but baptism in the Holy Spirit was a promise. It was a promise to certain individuals. It was a limited promise; it was not for all men, though it should bless "all flesh." It was made to certain individuals to take place within a few days after Christ ascended.

The apostles on the day of Pentecost and the household of Cornelius, after receiving the Holy Spirit, spoke with other tongues (languages) (Acts 2:4; 10:44-46). These tongues (languages) were for a sign. The speaking in other languages by the apostles, became a sign to those who heard that God was with them. The Gentiles at the house of Cornelius by speaking in other languages became a sign to Peter and other Jewish brethren that God had accepted the Gentiles. Hence, the word spoken through the apostles "was confirmed" to those who heard by these manifold powers and gifts of the Holy Spirit. There is no record of anyone after the household of Cornelius as having been baptized with the Holy Spirit. The baptism of the Holy Spirit never made anyone a Christian. It did not make the apostles Christians, nor anyone else.

In every instance of the Holy Spirit baptism recorded in the New Testament a miracle was wrought in speaking with "other tongues" (languages), and other extraordinary things. On Pentecost there were three classes which are not mentioned by Luke. Some were amazed and "marvelled," and looked at the work of the baptism of the Holy Spirit with mere curiosity and surprise; others "were in doubt" and "mocking," and were filled with skepticism and suspension. No evidence would satisfy them and no truth could convince them. Others, were inclined to hear Peter

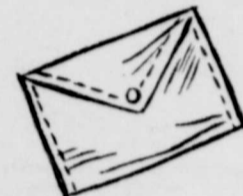

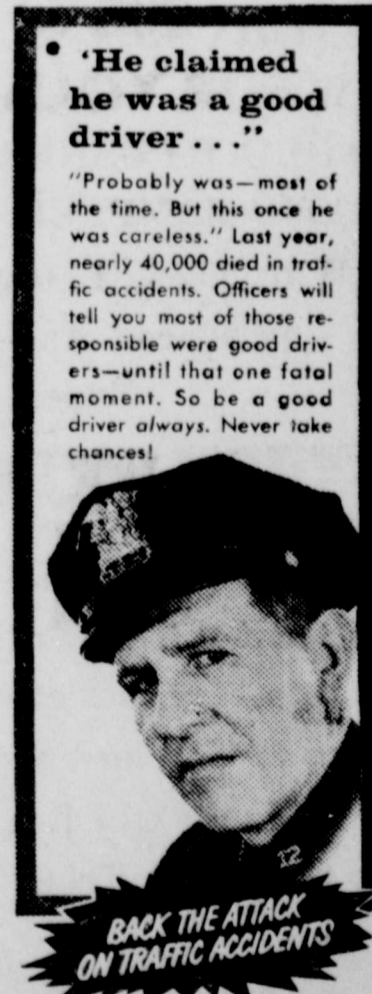

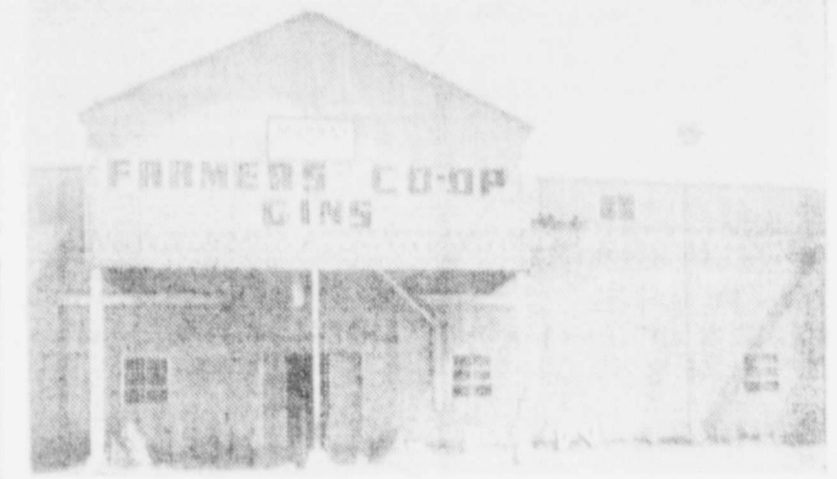
