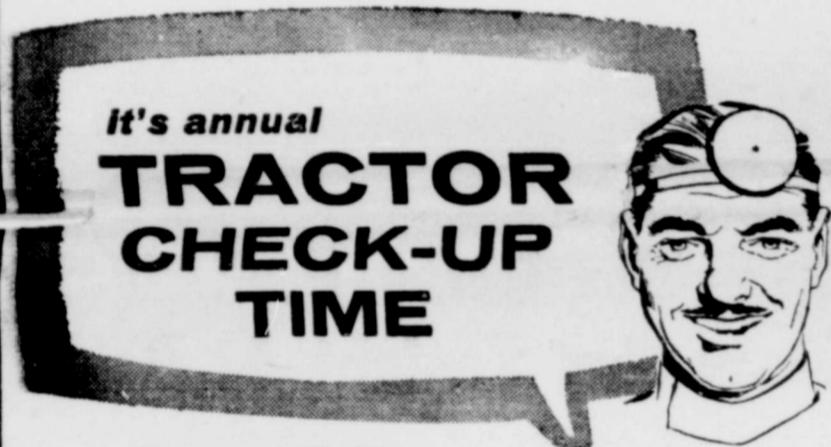

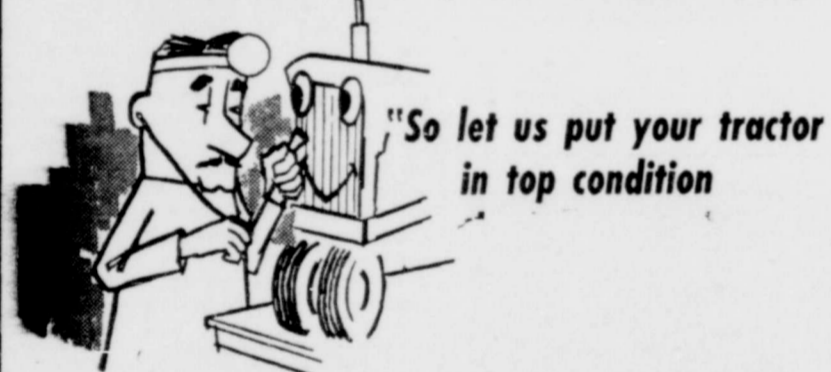

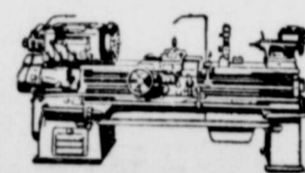

"RELIGIOUS UNITY"

Reading Time: 4 Minutes

In every age God has condemned division among His people and has commended unity. Solomon mentions seven things God hates, and in the list is the "man that soweth discord among brethren." (Prov. 6:19). The Psalmist uttered the words, "Behold how good and pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity." (Psalms 133:1). Paul informs us that "God is not the author of confusion, but of peace." (I Cor. 14:33). In view of these passages, a divided religious world cannot claim God as its Author. Jesus said, "Every kingdom divided against itself is brought to desolation, and every city or house divided against itself shall not stand." (Matt. 12:25). In this verse Christ sets forth a principle which applies to any institution whether it be a home, school, city, nation, or even a church. Division spells its doom. If this divided religious world is a picture of the Lord's Church, His church must fall according to His own teachings. Therefore, every Bible student should know that denominationalism is not the church of the New Testament.

If the Lord had intended to have even two different bodies of people, He would have made such an arrangement in the beginning. The Jews and Gentiles were a separate people. They had different backgrounds, customs and ideals, yet the Lord did not build one church for the Jews and another for the Gentiles. He said "Other sheep I have which are not of this fold. Them also I must bring and they shall hear my voice and there shall be one fold and one shepherd." (John 10:16). Instead of encouraging divisions He "made both ONE and break down the middle wall of partition." (Eph. 2:14).

The seed of division was sown in the church at Corinth, but was rooted up by Paul before separate churches were formed. To this church he said, "One of you saith, I am of Paul; and I of Apollos; and I of Cephas; and I of Christ. Is Christ divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptized in the name of Paul? (I Cor. 1:12, 13). The meaning of this rebuke is clear. Since Christ was not divided, His followers must not be. Since Paul was not crucified for them, and since they had not been baptized in his name it was sinful for them to wear his name. In verse 10 he states, "I beseech you, Brethren, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that ye all speak the same thing, and that there be no divisions among you, but that ye be perfectly joined together in the same mind and in the same judgement." This is the kind of unity which Jesus prayed for as He said, "That they all might be one; as Thou, Father art in me, and I in Thee; that they also may be in us; that the world may believe that Thou has sent me." (John 17:21). Believers must be one as God and Christ are one. They are one in teaching, aim and accomplishment. According to His prayer believers must be one visibly. The unity must be seen so that "the world may believe." With this divine instruction before us, one cannot be friendly toward God, and at the same time favor religious divisions. God is not the author of it, but hates it; and Christ prayed that it would never be found among His disciples.

ROTARY LAWN MOWER CAN BE LETHAL WEAPON

College Station—Did you know a rotary power lawn mower blade travels at speeds up to 150 miles per hour and is capable of throwing sticks, stones, or other objects at comparable speeds? Imagine what would happen if you were hit by one of these fast-flying objects.

Power lawn mowers are now in the majority both in town and among farm people. Along with their increased use has been a closely related increase in accidents involving both operators and bystanders. Most accidents have been due to carelessness or lack of knowledge on the part of the individual.

W. L. Ulich, extension agricultural engineer, offers these suggestions on how to operate your rotary power lawn mower safe and efficiently.

Always disconnect spark plug wire before working on the blade. A clean sharp blade does a better job and requires less power. Never operate mower with safety shields removed.

Make sure all rocks and debris are removed from the area before close mowing.

Do not refill the gasoline tank when engine is hot or running.

Run mower as slow as possible to do good work.

Keep children and pets away from mowers.

Always be certain of sure footing when mowing on steep slopes. Never leave engine running when mower is unattended.

Make sure mower is steady and under control before starting engine.

Always be aware of the hazards involved when you are using a power mower. Don't get caught napping.

NEWS from the High Plains
Research Foundation

Dr. T. C. Longnecker, director of the High Plains Research Foundation announced that the Foundation is increasing its cotton research 34% over previous years.

Dr. Longnecker stated that the Foundation has 20 more acres of plot research with cotton this year than in 1959. This accelerated program in cotton research is a result of a cooperative research agreement that has been worked out between the High Plains Research Foundation and the Texas Agriculture Experiment Station No. 8 at Lubbock and College Station.

This cooperative arrangement in research will enable the Foundation to better serve the High Plains area. Personnel from the Agricultural Research Service of

GUTTER AND BAR DITCH TO BE DRAINED

(By O. F. REA)

For the past several years those who live along Avenue D between 14th Street and 16th Street on the east side of the Street and those who have businesses in this area have been plagued by water standing in the gutter for days after even a small shower. At last now there is a promise of relief.

Those who live and do business in this area are not the only ones to be inconvenienced by the water standing there. Others who have occasion to do business east of the gutter here are compelled to cross in a car or walk a considerable distance, perhaps in mud, to get around the water. Of course there are two other means of crossing: go bare foot and wade or wear boots and wade. For us oldsters going bare foot is out and carrying a pair of knee boots just for this five to twenty or thirty feet is hardly to be expected.

Upon asking one of the city officials about the possibility of relief of this condition when the

the U. S. Department of Agriculture, the Texas Agricultural Experiment Station, and the Foundation are cooperating as research teams in conducting the joint research projects.

On commenting about the scope of the increased program of cotton research, Dr. Longnecker stated that the following cooperative projects are being conducted at the Foundation this year:

(1) Regional cotton variety test; (2) date of planting experiment with cotton; (3) a climatology study involving different varieties, moisture levels, dates of planting, fertilizer levels, and varieties; (4) an in the furrow fungicide experiment; (5) a cotton harvesting study involving different varieties and various methods of harvesting; (6) planting equipment test using different types of planting equipment; and (7) a cotton irrigation experiment consisting of a detailed evaluation of different varieties, fertilizers, and irrigation methods on the yield and quality of cotton.

Dr. Longnecker emphasized that the cooperative research program is just one phase of the Foundation's over-all research program with cotton. In this regard, the Foundation is conducting additional cotton research involving different varieties, fertilizer treatments, irrigation methods, and agricultural practices.

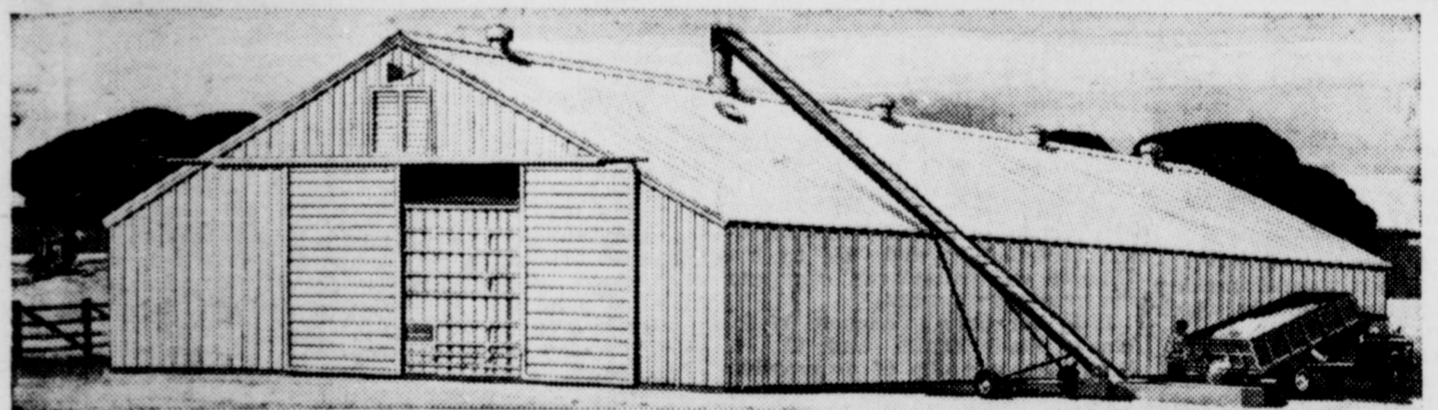
