

2. Proclaimed a national wheat acreage allotment of 55 mills acres, the minimum permitted by

3. Announced State shares of the national allotment 4. Set July 21, 1960, as the date for a referendum to determin producer approval or disapproval

of quotas. 5. Announced a 39-State com mercial and 11 State noncomme cial wheat-producing area for 1961.

6. Announced that the minimum national average support price for 1961 production will be de-termined before the wheat referendum on the basis of the latest available supply information.
