Deadline Is May 31 To Sign On The Feed Grains Program

Hale County farmers should devote immediate attention to either participation or non-participation in the 1961 Feed Grains Program, says County Agricultural Agent Ollie Liner.

The Hale County grain sorghum acreage for 1961 under this program will be approximately 275,000 acres with average county production per acre of 3931 pounds. Therefore if a farm has been given a productivity index of 100, this means that the farmer may sell 3931 pounds of grain sorghum at the support rate of \$1.89 per cwt. if he complies with the program by diverting either 20 or 40 percent of the farm base acreage. Retired acreage payments on a productivity index of 100 would be as follows: 20 percent diversion, \$37.20 per acre and 40 percent diversion, \$44.50 per acre. Diverted acres may be planted to those conserving crops as designated under the ACP program.

The bill as written states that those farmers who have been given a productivity index which they feel is too low have a right to appeal to the county committee for a higher index. However, this clause stipulates that for an appeal the producer must present "provable evidence." This provable evidence should contain certain basic information which is imperative. This information should contain the farm identity, year, pounds delivered to the elevator verified by elevator receipts and/or CCC loan documents, and producer. Any information from elevators should be on letterhead stationary and signed by the manager or others with signature block and title. Appeals will be received in the County A.S.C. office until the May 31 deadline. After that time no appeals will be considered.

The last day for sign up in the 1961 program is May 31.

Ordinance No. 119
AN ORDINANCE DETERMINING THE NECESSITY FOR IMPROVEMENT OF A CERTAIN STREET IN THE CITY OF ABERNATHY, NOTIFYING THE ABUTTING PROPERTY OWNERS AND INTERESTED PERSONS OF THE INTENT TO IMPROVE SAID STREET IN THE CITY OF ABERNATHY; SETTING A TIME AND PLACE WHEREBY THE ABUTTING PROPERTY OWNERS AND INTERESTED PERSONS MAY APPEAR BEFORE THE CITY COUNCIL ON MATTERS RELATING TO SAID STREET IMPROVEMENTS; REQUIRING THE CITY ENGINEER TO PREPARE AND FILE COMPLETE SPECIFICATIONS AND PLANS FOR THE PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS SO AS TO ENABLE BIDS TO BE SECURED AND A CONTRACT FOR IMPROVEMENTS ENTERED INTO; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ABERNATHY, TEXAS:

Section 1. That a necessity exists for the permanent improvement of those certain portions of public streets hereinafter listed, by excavating, grading and paving the same, by the installation of drainage facilities therein, and by the construction of curbs and gutters where adequate curbs and gutters are not now in place, such improvements are hereby ordered, and the portions of public streets to be so improved are designed and defined as follows:

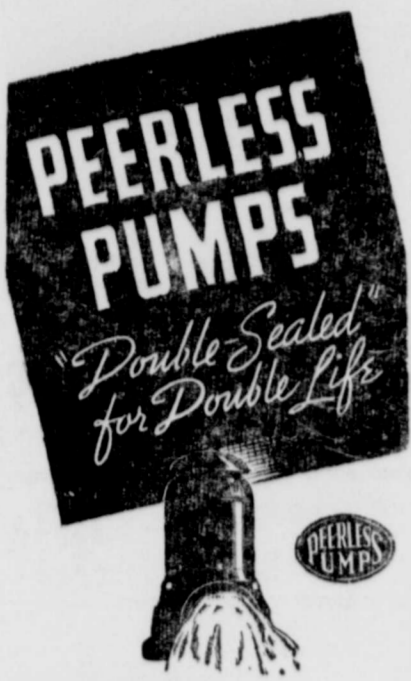

Ordinance No. 118

AN ORDINANCE DETERMINING THE NECESSITY FOR IMPROVEMENT OF CERTAIN STREETS IN THE CITY OF ABERNATHY; NOTIFYING THE ABUTTING PROPERTY OWNERS AND INTERESTED PERSONS OF THE INTENT TO IMPROVE SAID STREETS IN THE CITY OF ABERNATHY; SETTING A TIME AND PLACE WHEREBY THE ABUTTING PROPERTY OWNERS AND INTERESTED PERSONS MAY APPEAR BEFORE THE CITY COUNCIL ON MATTERS RELATING TO SAID STREET IMPROVEMENTS; AUTHORIZING THE STATE OF TEXAS HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT TO ACCEPT BIDS AND PREPARE AND FILE COMPLETE SPECIFICATIONS AND PLANS FOR THE PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS AND TO ESTIMATE THE

COST OF SUCH IMPROVEMENTS and to ENTER INTO CONTRACT FOR SAID IMPROVEMENTS; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ABERNATHY, TEXAS:

Section 1. That a necessity exists for the permanent improvement of those certain portions of public streets hereinafter listed, by excavating, grading and paving the same, by the installation of drainage facilities therein, and by the construction of curbs and gutters where adequate curbs and gutters are now in place, and such improvements are hereby ordered, the portions of public streets to be so improved being designated as follows:

On farm to Market Road 2060 from the East City Limits Line approximately one-fourth mile West to the East Right-of-Way Line of U.S. Highway 87.

Section 2. The property owners of the above named streets are hereby notified of the intent of the City of Abernathy to order the improvement of said streets and are given notice that the City Council of the City of Abernathy shall meet in the City Hall at 10:00 a.m. on Friday, May 26, 1961, to allow any property owners and interested persons to appear before the City Council on Matters pertaining to said street improvements.

Section 3. That the City of Abernathy has signed a Municipal Construction Agreement with the State of Texas Highway Department authorizing the Highway Department to accept bids and prepare and file complete plans and specifications for the proposed improvements and to estimate the cost of said improvements and to enter into contract for construction of said improvements; said Municipal Construction Agreement makes the City of Abernathy responsible for payment of extra base width and curb and gutter on FM 2060, assessments to property owners will be in the name and on behalf of the City of Abernathy.

Section 4. The fact that the above named street is in bad condition and the same should be improved immediately creates a public emergency requiring that this ordinance be passed finally on the date of its introduction, the existence of the emergency requires this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its approval by the Mayor.

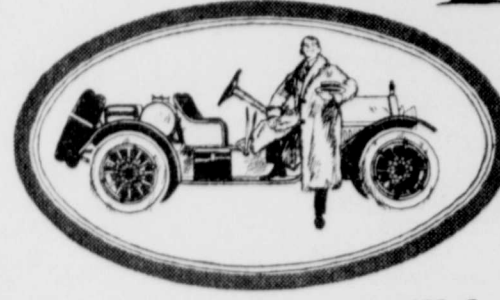

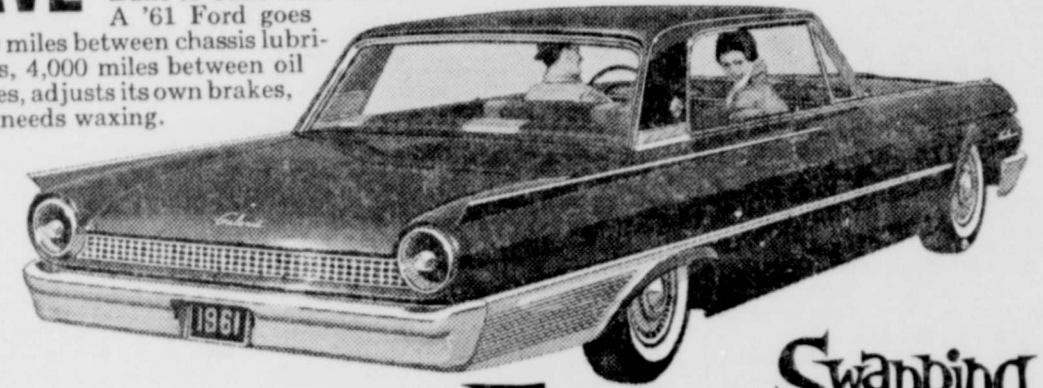
