

New Petition Filed In Suit

The plaintiff in the case of Frank Moore vs. Rayburn Karrh et al Saturday filed his first amended petition in Plainview and requested admission of facts in the suit.

Judge James A. Joy upon agreement of the plaintiff's counsel Nowlin who were among defendants named in the plaintiff's or iginal petition and directed that these defendants be dismissed from the suit. The court ordered that cost of this section of the

suit be taxed to the plaintiff. Moore in his original petition named Karrh, Marvin Churchwell, Homer Roberson and Doc Brown, Hale County commissioners: Nowlin, former county judge, and Odell former commissioner, in a suit to recover county funds he alleged were unlawfully spent.
