## Soil Survey Is Under Way In Hale County

Hale County has been selected for a complete soil survey by soil scientists of the Soil Conservation Service, according to Jesse Jackson, who is in charge of the Plainview Soil Conservation Service work unit office. Soil Scientist, William M. Koos, of Lubbock, will begin the survey.

"All the different kinds or types of soils in the county will be identified and plotted on aerial photographs by the soil scientist," said Jackson.

This survey is part of a National Cooperative Soil Survey going on all over the Nation. It is a cooperative project of the Soil Conservation Service and the State Colleges of Agriculture. The purpose is to get a complete inventory of the agricultural land of the nation, and to learn as much about it as possible. How much land do we have that is subject to wind and water erosion? How much damage has already occurred? These and many other questions will be answered by this survey. Each year as our population increases, our land becomes more important to the economy of our nation.

The survey is expected to be completed in a couple of years. Once the survey is complete, a report will be published for this county. This report will contain a brief history of the county, a soils map of each farm, descriptions of all soils, chemical analysis and fertilizer recommendations and yield data for each soil. When the report is published, it will be available to farmers and landowners.

At the present time, the survey is being made in the southwest part of the county. Mr. Koos is looking forward to meeting many of the farmers and ranchers in the county as the survey progresses. It will be impossible to contact all landowners before going on their land, but as many as possible will be contacted during the survey.

**SUSPECT WANTED IN AREA IS HELD IN CALIFORNIA**

A suspect wanted for theft and burglary in Hale, Floyd and Lubbock counties is being held in California. Lubbock Deputy Sheriff Lee Rice Jr. said Wednesday.

Lubbock deputies were awaiting word Wednesday night from California as to whether Firestone would waive extradition proceedings. He reportedly was being held in Shafter, Calif., and will be transferred to the jail at Bakerfield.

### 1963 Wheat Program Is Explained

Hale County Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service office, in a news release, has noted important changes in the program which applies to the 1963 wheat crop.

County Committee Chairman E. J. Pope said that wheat producers, in the referendum held last August, have already approved the use of marketing quotas for the crop. However, the new farm bill, passed by Congress, provides for an additional voluntary wheat-diversion program.

The new program changes include the voluntary reduction of wheat acreage below the 1963 farm allotment or base acreage. Farmers become eligible for diversion payments by shifting the diverted acreage to an approved conservation use. Participating wheat growers who are also in compliance with their acreage allotment also will receive an extra price support payment of 18 cents per bushel, figured on the normal production of their 1963 wheat acreage. This is in addition to the local price-support loan, based on the national average of \$1.82 per bushel, which is available to growers who comply with their wheat acreage allotment.

The county chairman pointed out another important item in the wheat stabilization program . . . those farmers who sign a diversion agreement, but who do not comply fully with that agreement, will lose their eligibility

### 1963 Wheat Program

An amendment to the 1962 Agricultural Act has been signed into law by President Kennedy, which affects the wheat farmers of this country who plant 15 acres or less for 1963 harvest.

This amendment provides that the 1963 wheat quota program, as it relates to wheat acreages of 15 acres or less, is the same as farmers voted on in the August referendum for wheat marketing quotas. It applies only to the 1963 crop. It does not change provisions relating to farms with more than 15 acres of wheat for 1963.

And it does not apply to the new 1963 wheat stabilization program, for which the signup is now under way in ASCS county offices.

### The History Of Thanksgiving

The Pilgrims were joining some strange company when they declared a Thanksgiving celebration in 1621. For the practice of giving thanks for a plentiful harvest goes back almost to the time when man first gave up wandering and hitched himself to a plow.

Along the Mediterranean, ancient peoples held festivals at harvest time in honor of a mother goddess. The Semites called her Astarte, while the Phrygians named her Semele.

The Romans honored Ceres, the goddess of agriculture, in a celebration called the Cerealia, reports World Book Encyclopedia. And the Greeks paid tribute to Demeter in secret rites called the Eleusinian Mysteries.

Christianity put an end to many of these festivals, but pagan-inspired belief in the Corn Mother, or the Mother of Grains, survived among some peasants in the British Isles and Europe. Her spirit was thought to live in the last sheaf of grain left standing in the field.

In northern England, the last handful of corn was the "kirm," and sometimes it was fashioned into a "kirm doll." In Austria it was shaped into a wreath and placed on the head of a girl who became the harvest queen.

During the Middle Ages the most common Thanksgiving and harvest festival was held on the Feast of Saint Martin of Tours, or Martinmas, on November 11. People throughout Europe still celebrate the day with feasts and
