Santa Fe Stops Pullman Cars On 93 and 94

Santa Fe Railway has announce ed it expects to discontinue the Pullman car portion of Trains 93-94 operating between Lubbock and Amarillo, Tex., effective Aug. 1.

F. N. Stuppi, vice president and general manager of Amarillo who made the announcement, cautioned against any misunderstanding, stressing that the trains were not being discoutinued, only the Pullman car service. However, he said special groups, requiring the use of a Pullman car would be accommodated whenever such need

Stuppi explained that the Pullman car, placed in service in February, 1955, has proved to be a costly operation as has never carried more than a few passengers per trip. 




